Some may not be aware but at the start of the season we had only 13 U13's players. We relied on our Under 11's just to field a team to ensure we did not forfeit. For some of our more skilled players and their parents this was no doubt a frustrating time, but as a coach you just can't teach the sort of competitiveness I saw in these kids, the skills can be taught!

We have kept it simple, "win the competition", "share with your mates" and "kick goals". This may sound like a gross oversimplification, and it is meant to be, but if we do these three things better than the competition we win. It has not taken long for their skills to improve and the sense of enjoyment of the game for all increases.

After some experimenting with player positions, we are starting to settle on field positions for many players. This has taken some time due to the changes in the team, you have to react to the team that is available on the day. As the kids become familiar with the differ-

ences in play associated with the positions, this offers further opportunity for improvement as the player becomes better at their position.

The next two games at home will be a real test to see how far we have come.

Finally, a big thank you to all the Parents and siblings that have helped out so far. We have a few home games to finish the year, so a little extra support will be needed to get all the jobs done.

A big thank you this week to my fill in staff once again, for this week I'm at an engagement in Cairns that was previously booked prior to my appointment as the Reserve Grade Coach. This will be the last anticipated absence I will be taking during the season so hopefully as I get myself organised in the tropical far north, the lads will take care of some business on the paddock.
