Brethren snare two titles against brawl backdrop

An ugly crowd brawl failed to overshadow as historic day for Brothers Australian rules on Sat-urday as the club snared both senior titles for the

The Roos followed up a 23-point reserve-grade victory over Yeppoon at the Rockhumpoon Crick-ut Ground with a hard-fought 31-point win against defending first-grade premiers Boyne loland Tannam Sands. Inspired by Wayne Cafford, who soldiered on despite cracking his ribs in the third quarter. Brothers withshood a fierce BITS fightback to cad an eight-war first-grade premiership drought.

grade premierants drought. Yet while the two learns staged their on-field battle, a fightback of a different kind erupt-ed on the sideline be-

ed on the sideline be-tween Brothers and BITS supporters.

Punches and beer cans were thrown in the me-ine, which spilled on to the field about five mis-utes before fulltime, before two police officers quelled the crowd.

Minutes later another incident occurred be-tween BITS and Yep-poon fans that was quickly subdued. No charges were laid over either incident.

While the brawl took place, Brothers sup-pressed a BITS on-slaught to kick three quick goals and establish a safe winning margin af-ter more than 100 minutes of tense, exciting football.

Brothers coach Greg Bowler, who lifted the side from equal last in the 1994 Capricornia Australian Football League to the premiership this season, was de-lighted with victory.

He said Brothers, who kicked 11 behinds in the first half, should have been more than 20 points in front at half-




