# FLASHBACK

## Brethren snare two titles against brawl backdrop

An ugly crowd brawl failed to overshadow an historic day for Brothers Australian rules on Saturday as the club snared both senior titles for the first time.

The Roos followed up a 23-point reserve-grade victory over Yeppoon at the Rockhampton Cricket Ground with a hard-fought 31-point win against defending first-grade premiers Boyne Island-Tannum Sands.

Inspired by Wayne Clifford, who soldiered on despite cracking his ribs in the third quarter, Brothers withstood a fierce BITS fightback to end an eight-year first-grade premiership drought.

Yet while the two teams staged their on-field battle, a fightback of a different kind erupted on the sideline between Brothers and BITS supporters.

Punches and beer cans were thrown in the melee, which spilled on to the field about five minutes before fulltime, before two police officers quelled the crowd.

Minutes later another incident occurred between BITS and Yeppoon fans that was quickly subdued. No charges were laid over either incident.

While the brawl took place, Brothers suppressed a BITS onslaught to kick three quick goals and establish a safe winning margin after more than 100 minutes of tense, exciting football.

Brothers coach Greg Bowler, who lifted the side from equal last in the 1994 Capricornia Australian Football League to the premiership this season, was delighted with victory.

He said Brothers, who kicked 11 behinds in the first half, should have been more than 20 points in front at half-time.

But fitness had been a factor as the Roos outlasted BITS in the final term, despite the Saints narrowing the margin to

three points 10 minutes from fulltime.

"We really needed that game last week against Yeppoon — a couple of our blokes needed another run before the final," said Bowler, referring to Brothers' preliminary final win against the Swans.

"We went into the second

semi-final (against BITS) with a few big heads and that loss really helped bring the players back to earth."

Bowler praised the Brothers committee for revitalising the club.

Disappointed BITS coach Greg Barratt said Brothers' commitment, rather than fit-

ness, had won the match for the Roos.

"I've got to pat Brothers on the back because they put in hard for the whole game."

Yeppoon won the Kerry Bentley Memorial Trophy for the club championship.
