## FROM **LITTLE** THINGS, **BIG** THINGS HAVE GROWN

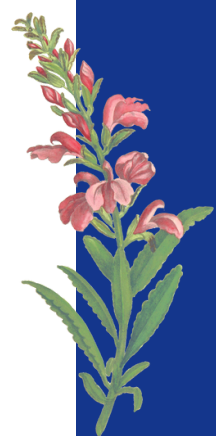
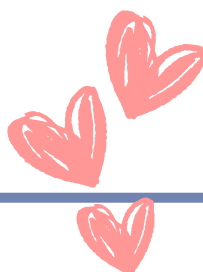

Jess's tenacity and humble approach to play inspires our Women's team each week.

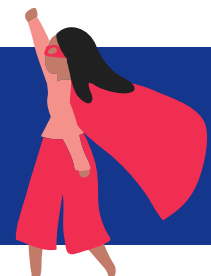


Layni, Zaphiira, Kate, Hannah and Alicia represented the Roos as part of the 16 Years Future teams at the Festival of Footy.

# Women & Girls Charter



Brothers AFC acknowledges the importance of promoting gender equality and fostering an inclusivity through participation in AFL as players and supporters.

## Article I: Vision and Mission

Our vision is to create a vibrant and inclusive AFL community where females of all ages thrive, excel, and contribute to the growth and success of the sport.

Our mission is to promote female participation in AFL for all ages through accessible programs and equitable resourcing to develop skills and foster Sisterhood.

## Article II: Commitment to Equity and Inclusion

We are committed to creating a safe and respectful environment that prioritises holistic well-being of all participants so they can participate fully in AFL.

We will actively challenge stereotypes and discriminatory practices, and champion diversity and inclusion within our Club and broader AFL community.

## Article III: Development and Support Programs

In partnership with relevant stakeholders, we will establish and maintain development pathways tailored to the needs of female participants, for skill acquisition, leadership development, and career progression within AFL.

## Article IV: Review and Amendment

This charter will be reviewed periodically to ensure its continued relevance and effectiveness in achieving our goals and objectives. Feedback will be sought from members and other relevant stakeholders.

Amendments to this charter may be proposed by any member of the organisation and shall be subject to approval by the appropriate committee or organisation.

In adopting this charter, Brothers AFC reaffirms our commitment to promoting female participation in AFL across all age groups and pledge to work towards collectively building a more inclusive and equitable AFL community that celebrates the diversity and talent of all its members.

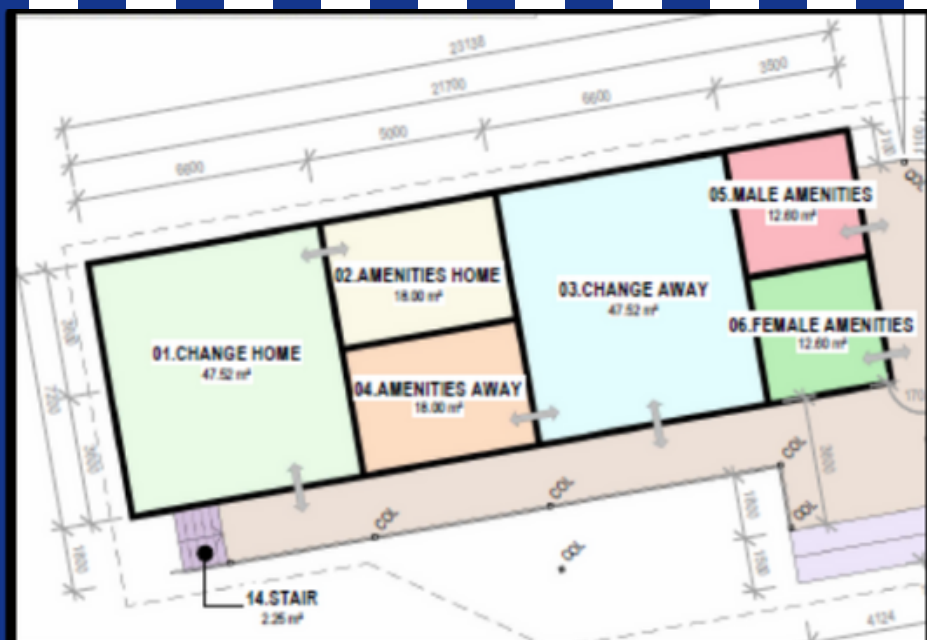
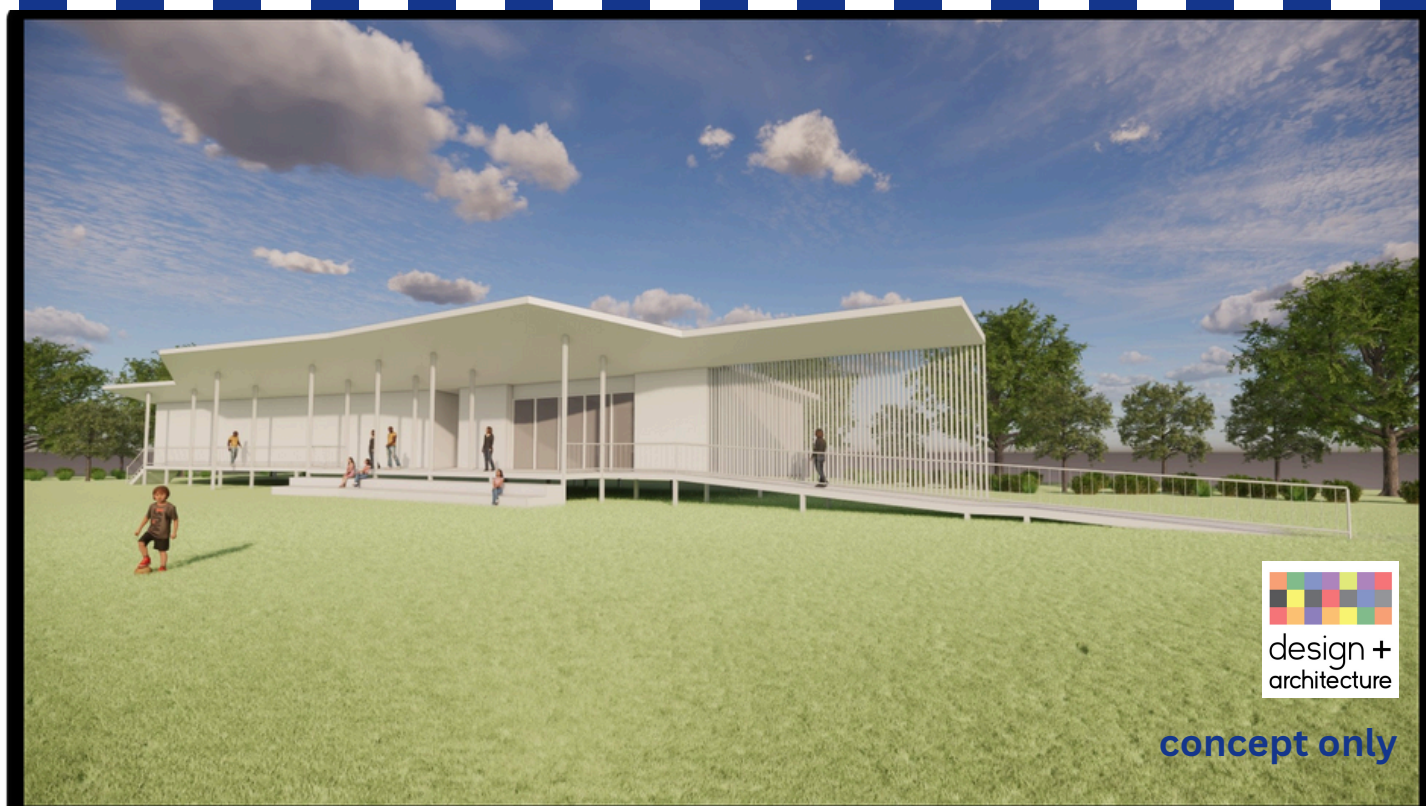
