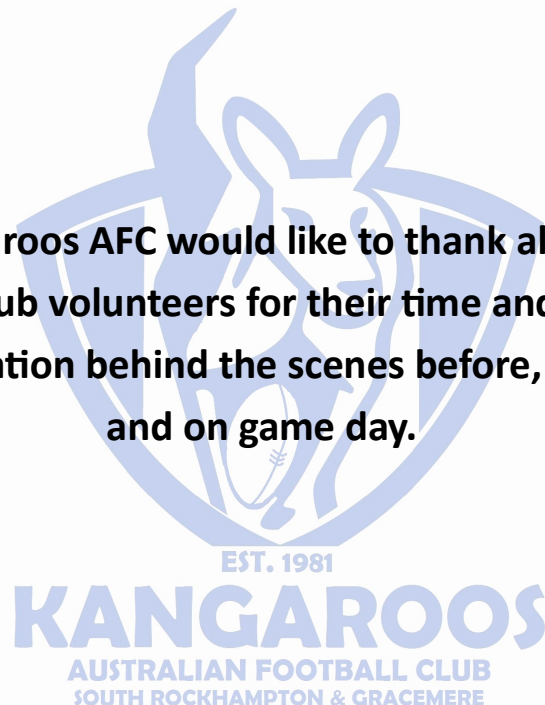

Q2: 4.12-36

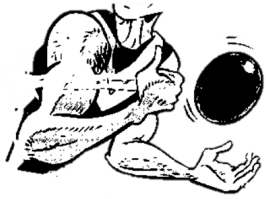
Q4: 6.23-59

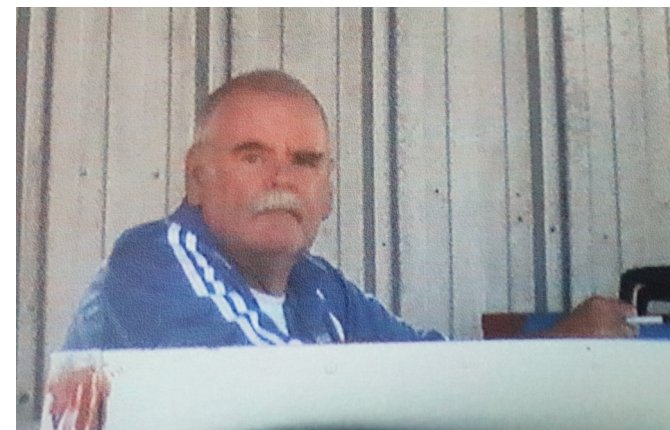

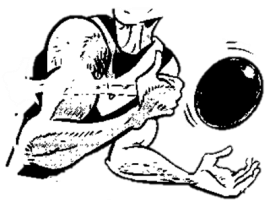
Current job/occupation: My current job is cab driver, in my 14 year, however semi retired.

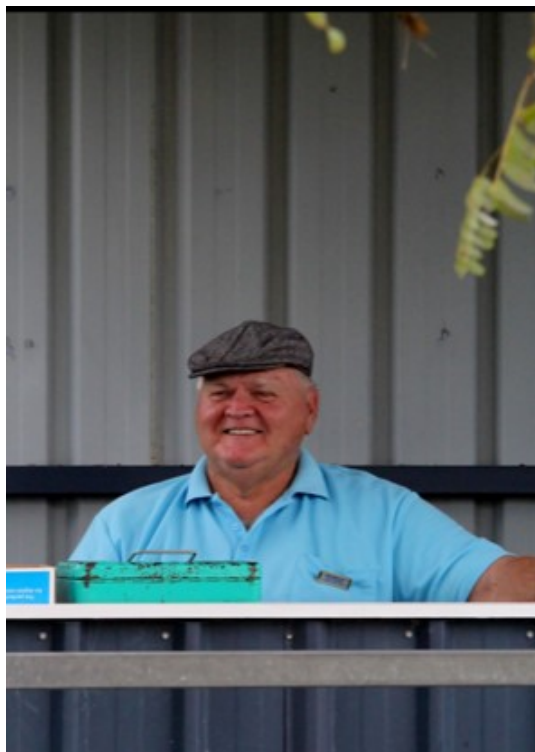
