
When your interests coincide with the events on the calendar, take the time to participate and enjoy the entertainment opportunities close to home.

Harriman Hall Renovation Progress on May 28th Workday

I've noticed in preparing the Newsletter that we spend a lot of time on ladders on Workdays! Those of us at this month's workday also paused to reflect how the craftsmen of 1890-1891 would have constructed all of Harriman's original structures. We are in the midst of undertaking a major renovation project, but it's nothing in comparison to how Harriman sprouted "From one farmhouse on January 1, 1890, [and] there dwell January 1, 1892, 3,672 souls in a beautiful and prosperous city." Quote from Introductory of City Directory of Harriman, Tennessee, Volume I, 1892



A dedicated crew of around 10 volunteers came out to continue renovation activities, and quickly organized themselves to add finishing touches around the newly constructed porch cover as well as add additional protection over sanctuary windows yet to be renovated. Progress was also made towards finishing the two front rooms (along Morgan Ave) by focusing on the damaged flooring and preparing to "sister" the floor beams deteriorated from water damage.

While we are targeting an "all of the above" approach towards opening a portion of Harriman Hall during the 2022 Christmas Tour of Homes, our primary focus is completing the exterior renovations as quickly as possible. The CHHCO Board has approved the quote for painting the remaining facades, however it is our focus to have all the necessary exterior preparation done before the painting starts within the next month or two. Several have volunteered to spend individual time to accomplish those goals outside of monthly workdays, and soon we

expect to report on the additional progress from these individuals.
