What: The Virginia Black History Month Association James Farmer Scholarship.

When: The scholarship application deadline is **Monday, February 13, 2023 at 5:00 p.m.**

Where: The **23rd Annual Virginia Black History Month Gala** on **Saturday, February 25, 2023** (6pm to 9pm) at the **Hilton Alexandria Mark Center**, 5000 Seminary Road, Alexandria VA 22202.

Who: All African-American High School students enrolled in any Spotsylvania County, City of Fredericksburg, Caroline County, or Westmoreland County Virginia High School with plans to pursue a higher education.

Why: To honor the legacy of renowned Civil Rights Leader Dr. James L. Farmer Jr.

The Monetary Awards

First Place Award: \$1,000

Second Place Award: \$500

Third Place Award: \$250

- Monetary gifts from the Virginia Black History Month Association.

The Rules

1. All African-American High School students enrolled in any Spotsylvania County, City of Fredericksburg, Caroline County and Westmoreland County Virginia High School with plans to pursue higher education.
2. The scholarship application deadline ends at 5:00 p.m. on **Monday, February 13, 2023**.
3. Entries should be limited to two typed pages plus the application form and cover sheet.
4. Each entry must be signed by the student with school counselors and civic representative(s) contact info.
5. The entry must be submitted on time. (No late entries will be accepted)
6. Include the title of your entry on both the first page of the essay and on the cover sheet. Also include with your name, home address, phone number, parent name, and cell phone number.

How to Enter: In 500 words or less, write your response to the questions below:

Essay: This year's Black History Month Theme is "**Black Resistance**." From the 1950s and through the 1970s in the United States, [Black Resistance] was defined by actions such as sit-ins, boycotts, walk outs, strikes by Black people and white allies in the fight for justice against discrimination in all sectors of society from **employment** to **education** to **housing**. (ASALH, 2022)

Consider the following scenario: Three high-profile black millionaires have collaborated and decided to leave in their last will and testimony funds for a Private Foundation with a combined total revenue of \$1 Billion dollars. These funds will be used to create better opportunities for African Americans in Virginia. You have been appointed as President of the Foundation. Based on the by-laws of the Foundation there are three areas where you can improve upon the lives of African Americans; (1) create a separate corporation which provides better career opportunities, (2) build a new Historically Black College or University (HBCU) which provides more educational opportunities, (3) build a series of new housing communities to increase homeownership. You can only pursue one effort. **Question(s):** Which effort do you finance? Which effort will have the greatest impact on the African American community? Which effort provides the greatest resistance to unfair disadvantages towards African Americans? **Why?**

7. **Judging Criteria & Rules:** The winners will be selected by a neutral judging panel and will be rated in five areas:

- a. **Criteria**

- (1) Currently enrolled as an African-American Senior in any **Spotsylvania County, City of Fredericksburg, Caroline County or Westmoreland County Virginia High School**.
- (2) Good academic standing.
- (3) Participation in the local community through civic programs and volunteerism.
- (4) Plans to attend college after graduation from high school.
- (5) Quality of essay.

- b. **Rules:** The judging will take place under the supervision of **Dr. Sherry Springs**, Human Systems Engineer for the Department of the Navy. She will be joined by other community leaders to determine the winner of the scholarship.

- (1) Participants agree to be bound by these rules and the decisions of the judges.
- (2) All decisions are final.
- (3) The winner will be notified by phone call no later than Monday, February 20, 2023.
