The Rules

- 1. All African-American High School students enrolled in any Spotsylvania County, City of Fredericksburg, Caroline County, and Westmoreland County, Virginia High schools with plans to pursue higher education.
- 2. The scholarship application deadline ends at 5:00 p.m. on Monday, February 16, 2026.
- 3. Entries should be limited to two typed pages plus the application form and cover sheet.
- 4. Each entry must be signed by the student with the school counselors' and civic representative(s) contact info.
- 5. The entry must be submitted on time. (No late entries will be accepted.)
- 6. Include the title of your entry on both the first page of the essay and on the cover sheet. Also include your name, home address, phone number, parents' names, and cell phone number.

How to Enter: In 500 words or less, write your response to the questions below:

<u>Theme</u>: "A Century of Black History" — celebrates the 100th anniversary of Black History observances that began with Negro History Week in 1926, founded by historian Dr. Carter G. Woodson. (ASALH, 2025).

<u>Consider the following scenario</u>: In 1926, Dr. Carter G. Woodson proposed celebrating African American history and culture by launching Negro History Week. It was the **Historical Black Colleges and Universities** (HBCUs) that partnered with Dr. Woodson to offer the first Black History college courses, trained the first generations of Black historians, housed early Black archives and research collections, and supported students who would later lead school-based Negro History Week programs. **Question(s)**: Today, over 100 HBCUs are operating successfully within the United States. Identify **three HBCUs** and explain how each was established. What famous individuals graduated from the school? What academic curriculum is the school best known for, and of the three schools, which one would you attend and why?

Judging Criteria & Rules: The winners will be selected by a neutral judging panel and will be rated in five areas:

a. **Criteria**

- (1) Currently enrolled as an African-American Senior in any **Spotsylvania County, City of Fredericksburg, Caroline County, or Westmoreland County, Virginia High School**.
- (2) Good academic standing with plans to attend college after graduation from high school.
- (3) Participation in the local community through civic programs and volunteerism.
- (4) Quality of essay.
- b. **Rules**: The judging will take place under the supervision of **Dr. Sherry Springs**, Human Systems Engineer for the Department of the Navy. Other community leaders will join her to determine the scholarship winner.
 - (1) Participants agree to be bound by these rules and the decisions of the judges.
 - (2) All decisions are final.
 - (3) The winner(s) will be notified by phone call no later than Monday, February 20, 2026.
