The Rules

- You must be single, never married, and have not given birth.
- You must be a natural-born female.
- You must be a United States citizen and live in the United States.
- You must be in excellent physical and mental health.
- This scholarship pageant is open to Any African-American female ages 20 yrs old to 25 yrs old, enrolled in any Virginia College or University.
- Pay the non-refundable entry fee of \$250.00, which includes one regular ticket to the gala.
- Participate in the VaBHMA Fundraising Ad Campaign for the Annual Souvenir Bulletin.
- Attend the two-day seminar on personal growth and career choices for professionals. (Optional)
- A maximum of 30 applicants will be accepted and only 20 finalists will advance to the gala.
- The Pageant will be limited to 20 finalists with the 1st eliminations scheduled February 1, 2020.
- The elimination is based on the "application score" and the final decision of the judges.
- Written entries should be limited to two pages, plus the registration form and cover sheet.
- Each entry must be signed by the student, school counselor, and all civic representative(s).
- The entry must be submitted on time. (No late entries will be accepted)
- Include the title of your entry on both the cover sheet and first page of the essay.
- The scholarship application deadline is **Friday, January 17, 2020** at 5:00 p.m.
- **How to Enter**: In 500 words or less, write your response to the following statement:
- **Essay**: Name one African-American woman (past or present) who has made the most significant impact in your life and describe why she was/is important to you.
- **Judging Criteria & Rules**: The winners will be selected by a neutral judging panel and will be rated in <u>five main areas</u>: Essay/Application, Presentation, Talent, Fundraising, & Questions and Answers.

a. Criteria

- (1) From ages 20 yrs old to 25 yrs old
- (2) Good Academic Standing
- (3) Participation in local community activities through civic programs and volunteerism
- (4) Plans to attend college after graduation from High School or already in college
- (5) Quality of application and essay submission
- (6) Fundraising efforts for the souvenir bulletin
- (7) Professional Presentation
- (8) Talent Performance
- (9) Evening Gown
- (10) Questions and Answers on current events
- b. <u>Rules</u>: The management of the Scholarship Pageant will take place under the supervision of Ms. Betty Banks, VaBHMA Scholarship Pageant Coordinator. The Lead Judge of the Scholarship Pageant will be performed by former Miss America 2010, Ms. Caressa Cameron-Jackson. Ms. Michelle Whitted Emerson of Harmony Business Solutions Accounting Firm will tally the scores from each participating judge.
 - (1) Participants agree to be bound by these rules and the decisions of the judges.
 - (2) All decisions are final.
 - (3) Participants are required to complete the entire process to be considered a finalist.
- Send a cover sheet with your entry and include the following information: Title of the entry, name, permanent home address and school address (if applicable), and telephone number(s).
 Note: Mail all entries to: The Virginia Black History Month Association Scholarship Pageant, P.O. Box 41924, Fredericksburg, Virginia 22404. All entries must be received by 5:00 p.m. on Friday, January 17, 2020 to be eligible.
- The winners will be awarded during our Annual Black History Month Gala on Saturday, February 29, 2020. Each contestant will receive one complimentary ticket to attend the Gala. The cost of tickets for additional attendees is: Adults: \$90.00, Students: \$60, and Children: (under 12 yrs. old) \$25.00 (Note: Children under 5 yrs. old are free)

Pageant Advertisement and Fundraising

The Fundraising Advertisement Rules:

- 1. All funding raised on behalf of the Virginia Black History Month Association (VaBHMA) must be submitted to the organization for deposit and credit towards the contestant's fundraising goal.
- 2. Contestants will be judged based on the amount of funding raised and the number of advertisements and/or business sponsor packages received.
- 3. Contestants will sell advertisement and/or business sponsor packages for the VaBHMA souvenir bulletin which will determine their overall score for the fundraising portion of the contest.
- 4. All paid advertisements and/or business sponsor packages are non-refundable.
- 5. Funds raised for the pageant help support the mission of the organization and their scholarships.
