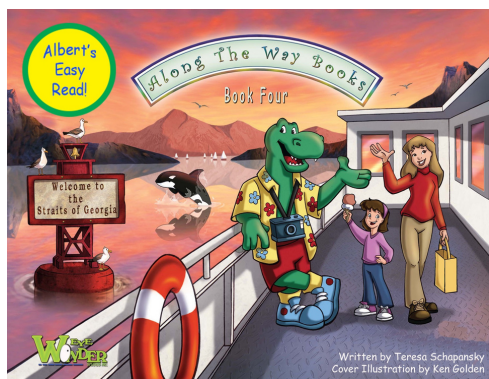
Join Albert as he takes us from Edmonton, Alberta all the way to the Saskatchewan border, and learn about some more cool places along the way!
