Father Tim's Meditation

As many of you know, we have a new Archbishop of Canterbury: the Right Reverend and Right Honorable Dame Sarah Mullally (that's a mouthful!). Bishop Mullally is currently the bishop of London and will be confirmed (I think this is the right term) in the new year. Please keep bishop Mullally in your prayers.

There's quite a bit less fanfare about the Archbishop of Canterbury than there was about Pope Leo's selection in the Roman Catholic Church. This is because the Archbishop has considerably less power and influence than the bishop of Rome. This doesn't mean that the Archbishop isn't important, just that they are important in different ways.

Anglicans often begin with a question instead of a statement. We don't begin with "Follow the Pope" or "Follow the Belhar or the Hapsburg Confession." Instead, we ask, "How will you follow?" The Archbishop of Canterbury is an open invitation to engage with a seat that was created in 597 AD (yes, that long ago!). We have the Nicene Creed and the Apostles' Creed, and we ask, "How will you follow it?" We even ask this question about the *Book of Common Prayer*, though our bishop DeDe asks that we follow the liturgies therein a bit more closely than other bishops do. In all, we discern our path in the Holy Spirit, together, as a community.

We have all chosen Christ Church. Not because we have to attend here, not because we're bound to it, but because we choose to. What does that choice mean for you? What does it mean that you've chosen one of the more loosely organized, though still traditional, parts of the Christian Church? What does it mean that we have an Archbishop that has no real power over us, but who invites us into communion with her? There is freedom and there is responsibility in all this. Receive both with grace.





Treasurer's Corner

Pledge payments year-to-date as of Sunday October 26 are \$197,481.

Total income including pledges, non-pledge contributions, Fundraising and all sources is \$275,131, which also includes a one-time Covid Payroll Protection payment of \$17,787 received in June.

Expenses this far are \$248,138.

In October an undated Fire Alarm System was installed. This included a new panel box and new sensors. The former system was 35 years+ old and the monitoring software being phased out. The cost of the new system was \$16,800, paid for by the Heritage Endowment Fund, a fund set up several decades ago for emergency repairs and improvements. With the new system in place, our fire monitoring services are now being handled by REM Alarm Systems, the system installer.



Upcoming Change about Pledge Communications

In an effort to save paper, envelopes, and stamps, we intend to move our remaining pledge communications to email instead of printing them out. We have already been sending most quarterly pledge statements via email, and beginning in January, we intend to start sending the end-of-year statements via email as well.

The Nicene Creed in Greek

On the next page you will find the Nicene Creed in the original language, 4th century Greek, transliterated to the Latin alphabet. Why? To make it more accessible for those who might be interested. You may already know the Creed by heart, at least subconsciously after reciting it so many times. Remember the words and ideas of the Creed that you know as you walk through this latinized Greek original.

A couple of technical points – most of the original Creed is one long sentence beginning with “we believe in...”, which changes the endings for “God” and “Lord” to “Theon” and “Kyrion”. The word “kai” equals “and”. The spelling and accents are based on Greek rules. No words have been changed, and no A.I. was used.


