Father Tim's Meditation

Jesus' disciples ask him how to pray, and this gives me some comfort, because some days I want to know just that. Should I clear my head of thoughts, or should I fill my head with the names and faces of those I pray for? Should I try to commune with God in the purity of his holiness, or should I get into politics and world events with God? Should I bring God my worries or try to leave them behind? I feel like I have so much to say to God and, at the same time, so much that I want to go away so I can just pay attention to my Lord and Savior.

I wonder if you feel the same way. 2026 is off to a rough start, and there are a lot of things that weigh heavily on our minds. We bring so much to church on Sunday mornings, both public and private prayers, and we hope that God will hear our cries. We also bring these prayers to church throughout the week at group meetings like our fiction book group, mid-week lunch, and our newly formed writers' group. Thankfully, we also bring our joys and our hopes. There really is just so much to say to God and to one another.

St. Paul asks us to pray unceasingly (1 Thes. 5:17), and we do this not by repeating the Lord's Prayer constantly but in asking God to be present with us at all times, in the good and the bad, in the noisy and the quiet, in the tumult of worldly concerns and the calm of quiet evenings. Invite God into your life, and let God do the work of prayer inside of you. For it is not we who pray, but the Holy Spirit (Rom. 8:26-7) inspires us to thoughtful and active communion with our God.

On Being Anglican

There has been a lot of news about Venezuela lately, but did you know that there is an Episcopal diocese in the country? It's true! The Diocese of Venezuela is a part of the Episcopal Church as much as we are. They are part of a group called Province IX, which includes a number of South and Central American countries, the Dominican Republic, and Puerto Rico. You can see the structure of the Episcopal Church and the various provinces on this webpage:

I'm not entirely sure why the Episcopal Church has dioceses outside of the United States, and why the churches of these dioceses don't form their own provinces in the Anglican Communion. It may be that they are simply too small to organize an Anglican province of their own, and so they've asked to be part of the Episcopal Church. It could also be theological: these churches may be closer to Episcopal theology than to the Anglican theology outside of the Episcopal Church (remember, Anglican theology is a very broad and varied thing!).

Whatever the reason, the Anglican dioceses in places like Venezuela are more like siblings to us than, say, similar diocese in places like the UK or Africa, which we could think of as cousins. Of course, we should pray for folks in the diocese of Malawi as much as we should pray for the folks in Venezuela, but there's something comforting and close in knowing that folks down in South America are using the same prayerbook and following the same liturgy as we are. If you ever traveled to these countries and visited a church on Sunday morning, you'd feel pretty much right at home. Thinking of this makes me feel closer to people around the world, as if (and they are, in a way) they are gathering around the same Altar here at Christ Church with us.

Please join me in praying for the people of the diocese of Venezuela and for the people of that country. May they find and be given peace and stability by the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Treasurer's Corner

Income and Expense review: Jan 1 – Dec 31, 2025

- 2025 pledges totaled \$222,964. Actual pledge payments received were \$222,781. Thanks to all who honored their pledge last year, and those who gave over and above their pledge in 2025.
- 2025 non-pledge gifts received \$11,470.
- 2025 fundraising totaled: \$55,154. Fish Fries, Rummage Sale, Mart, and others
- Total income 2025: \$314,376.
- Total 2025 expenditures: \$321,153.
- 2025 deficit: -\$6,777.

Pledge Report:

- 2025: We received 73 pledges in 2025 for \$222,781.
- 2026: We received 68 pledges received for 2026 for \$229,851.
 - 32 pledges increased as compared to last year, 27 remained flat, and 6 decreased.
 - 3 new pledges.

Endowment Report:

- 2025 endowment growth was +13.35%.
- \$1,000 donation to the Cemetery Fund.
- \$5,550 was withdrawn from the LPL accounts.
- \$1,600 was withdrawn from Stained Glass account.
- Final 2025 endowment totals: started the year with \$262,410 and finished with \$291,350.

Endowment funds are restricted by Donor and Vestry to specific uses, such as Christian Ed, Cemetery Maintenance, Stained Glass Maintenance, and Building capital improvements/repairs. Only within-year earnings may be used, not principal.

A full financial recap will be provided within the reports at the Annual Meeting on February 1.



Taizé Worship Services: February 22-March 22



During Lent we will hold a Taizé worship service on Sunday evenings at 7:00 p.m. Taizé is a style of worship that is quiet, meditative and prayerful. Simple music, scripture readings, prayers, and candlelight set a thoughtful tone. Taizé is an ecumenical community in France which draws people from all over the world for shared worship and work while living in community. Taizé services begin on February 22, and will be offered through Sunday, March 22. They are wonderful as a Lenten discipline or as a time to invite people who might not be comfortable with more structured, formal church services, or for whom Sunday mornings do not work.







Coffee and Theology
