Rector's Reflection

I am convinced that one of the reasons we persist in making New Year's resolutions is that we want to believe that there is such a thing as a fresh start, a clean slate, a new beginning. So we come to the first day of the first month of a new year and ponder how it, and we, could be different. Emily Dickinson captures this sense of what might be in the opening of one of my favorite poems:

I dwell in Possibility—
A fairer House than Prose—
More numerous of Windows—
Superior— for Doors—

While these lovely words convey the sense of openness that comes with all we can imagine a new year might be, most of us know that it is good to have more than possibility as our foundation. As Christians what we have is hope, and our hope has been embodied in the person of Jesus. Jesus came to us as God Incarnate, the child born of God and Mary so that we might experience God's love. In Jesus God's life and love became known so

that our lives can have a fresh start, a clean slate, a new beginning. More powerful than any resolution, what God promises us in Jesus is new life. This transformation is not of our making, though it will require change on our part, for as we learn in the Gospel of John,

"But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become

children of God, who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God."

This New Year, as we move from Christmas to Epiphany to celebrating two baptisms on the feast of The Baptism of Our Lord, the opportunities to be reminded of our hope are numerous. On January 13th you will be asked to renew your own baptismal vows as Annie and Henry are baptized. Ask yourself, in preparation for recommitting yourself to following Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior, what that might look like in this New Year. Then I invite you to offer yourself to God anew, and to see what possibilities God has in mind for you.



Worship and Welcoming

As part of our *Conversations* on Welcoming we have come up with some specific suggestions that <u>everyone</u> can implement for our worship services. Thank you for your awareness of others, and for your thoughtfulness in creating a welcoming environment.

- <u>Greeting people in the parking lot</u>- Say hello to anyone you do not know and introduce yourself. Guide guests to Church School classrooms, the nursery, bathrooms, and coat closets as needed.
- <u>Creating a quiet environment</u>- When approaching the entryway to the church, remember that many people prepare for worship through a time of prayer and quiet reflection. Please keep the entryway a quiet space where we welcome others and then move into silence. If you wish to have a conversation Crosby Hall is always available.
- <u>Welcoming guests at the entrance-</u> Invite visitors to sit where they would like. Make sure they receive a bulletin. Offer crayons, coloring books, and books to children.
- Making room- Christ Church members are encouraged to sit in the front half of the church so that those who are guests and might like to observe how our worship flows, as well as those with small children, may sit further back. When you sit in a pew, please move in unless you are saving a seat for someone so that others may sit next to you.
- Being aware- Notice guests and be ready to assist anyone who might have difficulty following the service. Help with finding the right book and page for psalms, service music, and hymns.
- Passing the Peace- In addition to wishing the Peace, also welcome newcomers.
- <u>Helping children</u>- Assist children coming in from Church School who may be looking for their family.
- <u>Invite guests to Coffee Hour</u>- introduce yourself to anyone you do not know, invite guests to Coffee Hour, then go with them and introduce them to others, especially people with whom they may have things in common.
