Rector's Reflection

**On February 3 we will have one worship service at 9:00 a.m.** followed by the Annual Meeting and brunch. The Annual Meeting is an occasion to pause and look back over the previous year, as well as to look together at the year that lies ahead. It provides us with an opportunity to celebrate the many ways in which we have seen the Holy Spirit at work in and among us, and to pray for the courage to follow where the Spirit may lead us in the days to come. At Christ Church I experience an added layer of significance in this event, for my very first Sunday with you was the day of the Annual Meeting, so this is also our ninth anniversary of ministry together. The traditional gifts for a ninth anniversary are pottery and willow. Pottery seems appropriate as a reminder of our relationship with God, as the prophet Isaiah said, "...we are the clay, and you are our potter; we are all the work of your hand." Willow is a lovely metaphor as well, for it is intended to indicate nature and flexibility, and I have found the people of Christ Church to have an appreciation for both.

One of the foundations of an Annual Meeting is the booklet filled with committee and ministry reports, along with the budget. At Christ Church we have expanded the number of reports included in the booklet because we have several new areas of ministry. We have also benefitted from a clearer, more transparent budget report thanks to a Finance

committee that has sought to share that information. In addition to the reports, our Annual Meeting intentionally includes the celebration of many ways in which God is at work in this place and through us as God’s people. Our meeting affirms what Albert Einstein once observed: “Not everything that can be counted counts, and not everything that counts can be counted.” From the beauty of the music and the Altar Guild’s careful preparation of our space for worship, to the dedication of our many Christian Formation volunteers, to the courage of those who will play Bible couples in *Excellent Trouble*, to the numerous people who offer themselves and their time to serve God and our neighbors, the Annual Meeting gives us the opportunity to highlight these blessings and offer thanks to God and one another for an abundance of love made visible.


One of the aspects I treasure about the faithfulness of the people of Christ Church is your willingness to respond to the love of God with your own love. Sometimes that love is made visible in easily discernible ways, like liturgical leadership, Christmas Mart, and hospitality. At other times it is more like an iceberg, where a small portion of the love you offer is visible and only a few others—or perhaps God alone—know the extent of your offering. Those whose ministries include the Prayer Chain, pastoral care, tending the gardens, and ongoing outreach to those in need, offer their gifts quietly. The Annual Meeting is but one reminder that Jesus calls us each to offer ourselves in loving service, and that it is through us that God often chooses to show God’s love and presence in the world. It is my honor and privilege to bear witness to the love of God that you share in a myriad of ways, and to thank both God and you for it.

### **Ron Hebert (Vestry)**



## **Cristosal Presentation**

As many of us may realize, Noah Bullock, the son of former Christ Church Rector Michael Bullock, is the CEO of an organization headquartered in our companion diocese of El Salvador. Cristosal represents the people of El Salvador, Honduras, and Guatemala in their struggle for human rights. In recent years, drug cartels and gangs have threatened the safety and wellbeing of many of the citizens and their children by demanding service in those gangs and extorting cash payments. This has resulted in the frequently reported caravans of these people seeking to immigrate to our country in large numbers. Cristosal is trying to alleviate this crisis by finding safe havens for these threatened families within Central America and finding legal representation for them in their own countries.

Doug Mouncey, a member of St. Paul's Church downtown, is a member of the Board of Directors for Cristosal. He will be making a presentation at **both services on Sunday, March 3<sup>rd</sup>, at Christ Church** to describe Cristosal's ministry to our congregation. This may be an opportunity for our parish members to support an organization which is working to help solve a human rights issue in a constructive manner. Mark your calendars and be sure to attend that week!

## **Christian Formation**

Currently there are 6 scholars with a Resident Director and two Resident Advisors. The program is highly structured and each FM-ABC scholar must meet the high academic requirements set by the program.

## Worship and Welcoming

As part of our *Conversations* on Welcoming we have come up with some specific suggestions that **everyone** can implement for our worship services. Thank you for your awareness of others, and for your thoughtfulness in creating a welcoming environment.

- Greeting people in the parking lot- Say hello to anyone you do not know and introduce yourself. Guide guests to Church School classrooms, the nursery, bathrooms, and coat closets as needed.
- Creating a quiet environment- When approaching the entryway to the church, remember that many people prepare for worship through a time of prayer and quiet reflection. Please keep the entryway a quiet space where we welcome others and then move into silence. If you wish to have a conversation Crosby Hall is always available.
- Welcoming guests at the entrance- Invite visitors to sit where they would like. Make sure they receive a bulletin. Offer crayons, coloring books, and books to children.
- Making room- Christ Church members are encouraged to sit in the front half of the church so that those who are guests and might like to observe how our worship flows, as well as those with small children, may sit further back. When you sit in a pew, please move in unless you are saving a seat for someone so that others may sit next to you.
- Being aware- Notice guests and be ready to assist anyone who might have difficulty following the service. Help with finding the right book and page for psalms, service music, and hymns.
- Passing the Peace- In addition to wishing the Peace, also welcome newcomers.
- Helping children- Assist children coming in from Church School who may be looking for their family.
- Invite guests to Coffee Hour- introduce yourself to anyone you do not know, invite guests to Coffee Hour, then go with them and introduce them to others, especially people with whom they may have things in common.

# Announcements and Reminders



**The Rector's Discretionary Fund** is a special account that is financed by the loose cash offering gathered one Sunday each month and by additional donations from parishioners and others. At Christ Church the **loose plate offering from the first Sunday of each month** is designated for the Rector's Discretionary Fund. Many churches also include a line item in the budget. The purpose of the Rector's Discretionary Fund is described in the Episcopal Church Canons as *"to be applied to such pious and charitable uses as the Rector or Priest-in-Charge shall determine."* Money from this fund is used to assist those in financial need, to support ministry, and to contribute to the work of the wider Church.
