## **Father Tim's Meditation**

Most of my newsletter meditations are about the weather or the changing of the seasons. I do this because many of you tell me how important nature is to you, but also because, in many ways, nature is our spiritual teacher as much as church is.

We may think of church as the place where we learn how to be Christians or how to follow God (and I hope you do!), but we are, in fact, always learning how to be Christians. God is always present to us, whether we're out on a nature trail or doom-scrolling through the news cycle. The problem is that we don't always recognize the "non-spiritual" stuff as affecting our spiritual lives. We are what we eat, however; those things we consume, be they food or news or aggravated conversations or anything else, become the raw matter of who we are and who we become.

My meditation this month, therefore, comes with something of a warning: be careful of what you take into yourself. Your relationship with your own spirit, with God, and with others is affected deeply by what you do during the day and how you spend your time. Fill your life with good things, and you will have a strong spirit and a deep relationship with God and others. Fill your life with bad things, and your spirit will struggle to rise up to the hope and faith we need during these dark times. So fill your life with good things, give up the bad, seek the beautiful and those things that broaden your sense of self and your love of others.



It is a longstanding tradition and one of the major fundraisers for the church. Proceeds help our church financially, contributing to our general operating budget. In keeping with our commitment to community outreach, 10% of our profits will be donated to local community organizations.

We are starting our Mart preparations in earnest this month. Here are some ways you can help bring the Mart to fruition. Please see if any (or all??) of these suggestions sound interesting to you this year:

#### **Treasurer's Corner**

From the 2025 Rummage Sale, Christ Church recently donated \$352 to the Emmaus Ministry of Syracuse, and \$352 to Cristosal. Cristosal is an organization in El Salvador dedicated to rebuilding communities there. The executive director is Noah Bullock, who grew up in our parish.

Christ Church has donated at total of \$3,146 to charities this year, including FM Community Outreach, Clear Path for Veterans, The Emmaus Ministry of Syracuse, and Cristosal. The donations represent 10% of Fundraiser profits.

As of 9/17, pledge payments are \$161,303 year-to-date. \$221,781 is pledged for the year. Our church is purchasing a new alarm system and adding sprinklers to the Sanctuary. The current system is 30 years old and the software that supports the system is outdated and being phased out. Funding for the purchase, \$16,400, is coming from the Heritage Fund. The Heritage Fund was started in the 1980's to provide for emergency repairs and capital improvements to the church property and is available for this type of need. Installation of the new system is expected in October.

Please consider making a lasting gift the Christ Church Manlius through your Will, Trust, Retirement Assets, or Life Insurance.

Endowment fund income helps to support Christian Education, Cemetery Maintenance, Stained Glass Maintenance, and General Operations.

## **Coffee Hour Hosts Needed**




## **Coffee and Theology**

## It Takes a Village to Maintain the Blood Supply

The US is chronically in need of blood donations, and sometimes the need is critical. October is both Sickle Cell Awareness Month and Childhood Cancer Awareness Month, two important causes that highlight the critical need for blood. Sickle Cell Disease is an inherited blood disorder with no universal cure. Many patients rely on regular blood transfusions to help manage pain crises and prevent serious complications. Childhood Cancer Patients often require blood products throughout their treatment journey, including during chemotherapy, surgery, or other intensive care.
