Father Tim's Meditation

In the midst of Lent, we come face-to-face with suffering. Our Sunday readings have been tough ones, and I've been hoping to encourage and ground you in them through my sermons. It's not just in church, however, that we see suffering. In March, we heard of the needs of refugees living in our area, many of whom have waited through many years of vetting before they could even begin life here in the US. We hear of suffering close at home (such as children who are hungry in Syracuse) and far from home (such as Ukrainians struggling against an aggressive neighbor). It is not easy to live in such a fine place as south-east of Syracuse when there is so much suffering.

There is, however, a lot we can do, and in this short meditation I want to more compliment than meditate. Almighty God, creator of Heaven and Earth, savior of humanity and of all Creation, has tasked us Christians with raising up, tending to, and caring for those who suffer. And you are meeting this call. When you hear of a need, you give. When we serve at the Samaritan Center, you join. When you hear of an opportunity in our community to help, be it reading to kids or waking up early to prepare breakfasts, you don't hesitate. And when I try to compliment you on all you do, many of you wave your hand and say, "Oh, it's not that much. I just do what I can."

Let me tell you, Christ Church, what you do is a lot! You are living the Christ Life in the midst of Lent. As we kneel in penitence, we do not forget to stand with those in need. And that is an amazing thing to see. It warms my heart to hear your stories, because I know that you are living as we all hope to live: as servants of the hungry, the lost, the forgotten, the hopeless.

So don't give up, Christ Church! Keep on loving! Keep on giving of yourself in your prayers, your service, and your financial donations. We are doing amazing work here. We are making a difference. We are living Christ's life together!

Vestry Voice

At Tuesday's Vestry meeting we talked about ways to enhance parishioners' knowledge of what kind of activities actually take place in our various committees. So, the decision was made to use Vestry Voices as one of a few different ways to both publicize our activities and perhaps pique your interest in learning more about a particular committee.

In fact, we encourage you to consider "test driving" one or more committees. What do I mean by that? Reach out to a committee member, a warden, Father Tim, or Deirdre and we can easily arrange for you to attend a meeting. See for yourself if it's something you want to join or perhaps even schedule another "Test Drive" to get more clarity. Do this with as many committees as you like. Be a quiet observer or feel free to participate, either way works. There are absolutely no "hard sells", just "thanks for coming!"

In accordance with the above, I am a member of the Stewardship Committee. Father Tim, Jim Hughes, Ed Russell and Pete Geiskopf are the other members. October is the traditional month for Stewardship campaigns. Typically, we have our first meeting in July. At that time, we set up future meeting dates and talk a bit about a possible "theme", etc. In subsequent meetings we decide on a "theme" and allocate different activities for each of the four October Sundays. They typically include a Sermon addressing a biblical aspect of Stewardship, a presentation showing our goals for the coming year and a review of the target amount needed to support our anticipated budget. The two remaining Sundays are for creative presentations including Crosby Hall events. Of course, there is subsequent tracking of pledges cards as they come in culminating with a pretty good idea of pledge income for the new year.

We meet about once a month for about six months. So, if you're looking for a short-term gig, enjoy creativity, like having laughs and fun, and want to feel that what you're doing is truly critical to the health of Christ Church, then come and sit in on one of our meetings!

Upstate on Interfaith Works (IFW) / New Americans Outreach Activities



Christ Church has a long history of outreach with Interfaith Works (IFW)...30+ years!

On Thursday, 3/6, Jennie Prouty, Director of Volunteers at Interfaith Works/Center for New Americans, gave an informative presentation on the history of refugee resettlement and the typical services and resources provided to help resettle New Americans with refugee status (granted after a rigorous 2-5 year vetting process).

The Outreach Committee has developed a plan of action to help bridge the current gaps in services identified during the presentation. During Lent we will be collecting gift cards to help meet basic daily needs and monetary donations to help IFW continue to provide key services (connection to health care, identification of jobs, English learning programs, transportation and navigation around Syracuse, citizenship classes, etc.) to the individuals and families who have been recently resettled in Syracuse.

Please consider the purchase of gift cards (TOPS market, Walmart, general VISA) in any amount (with receipts attached to the cards). Monetary donations can also be made by check to Interfaith Works/Center for New Americans. Larger donations may be used to support staffing and other critical activities. Envelopes for your gift cards will be available in the narthex.

Labyrinth Walk on April 2nd



As part of our lenten journey, Christ Church will be hosting a labyrinth meditation on April 2nd, starting at 6:00 and lasting about two hours. This event is free and open to anyone who wishes to join.

For those unfamiliar with this form of meditation, a labyrinth is an ancient spiritual tool designed to foster contemplation and spiritual transformation. The most basic metaphor for a labyrinth is that of life and the journey of faith. Walking the labyrinth opens us to transformation, healing, and a deepening of God's presence. Arrival at the center is not the goal—rather it is experiencing the path as it leads deeper to the center where we connect to Christ's sustaining love.

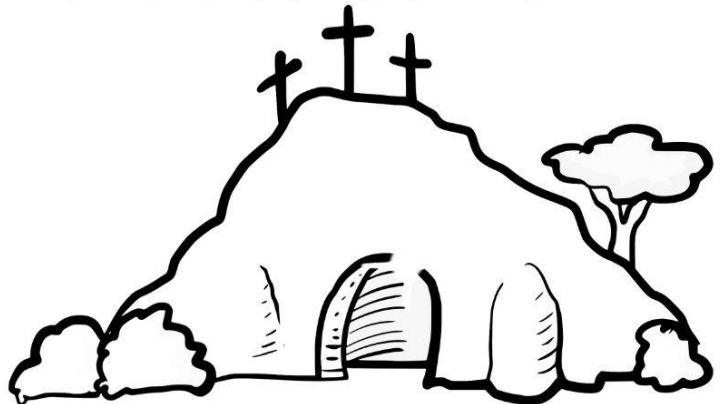

Children's Education: Lent and Palm Sunday

This month, we continue our Lenten journey as we prepare for the biggest feast day of the year! Our Sunday School classes have been learning about loving our neighbors, offering hospitality, and working as a community to help those in need. We've heard about Jesus helping strangers and teaching eager crowds. As we approach Easter, we will continue learning about Jesus' teachings and miracles.

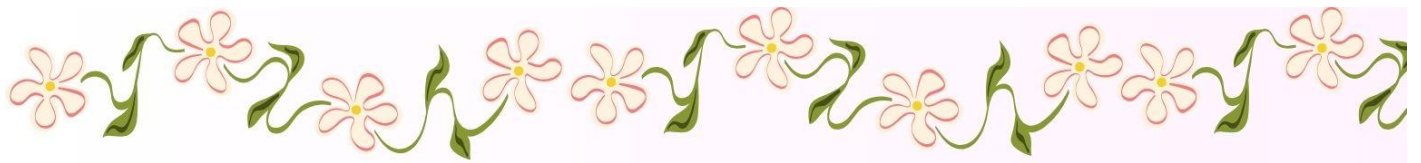
This year, we have some special activities planned for Palm Sunday. We will all process around the church with the palms, but then the children and some teachers will return to Crosby Hall. Together, we will explore a walk with Jesus through Holy Week. We will have an area where we learn about the foot washing from Maundy Thursday, we will share a snack and hear about the Last Supper, and we will pray together around a cross.

Here are some details about each event. The foot washing will use fresh water from pitchers to trickle down the children's toes, then be patted dry with a cloth. The snack we share for the Last Supper will be a simple snack. I have a list of allergies, but if you have any food concerns or need to update me, please let me know. The veneration of the cross will include battery-operated candles and a form of the prayers of the people. This is a sort of simplified Veneration of the Cross, and helps us all focus our hearts as we talk to God.

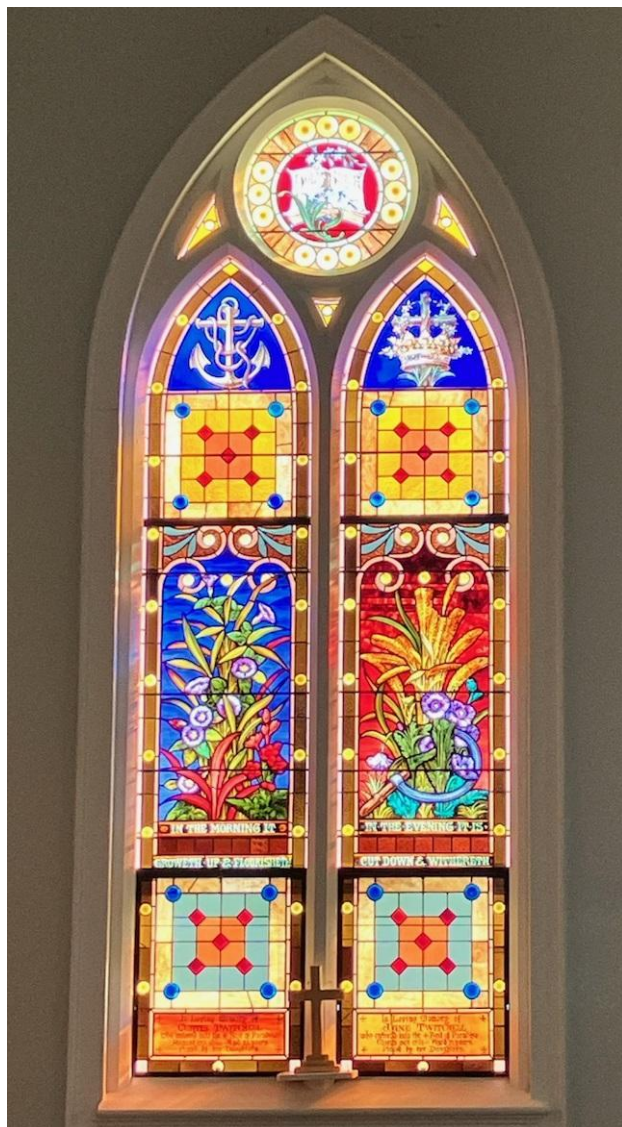
I Will Not Know if I Doughnut Ask

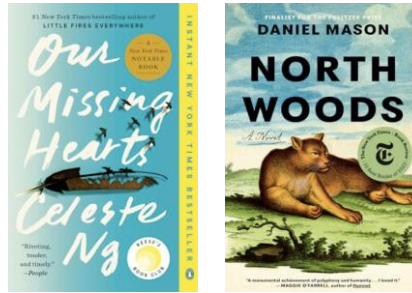

Anyone is welcome to join our group. Please pass this information along if you know of someone who might be interested. Happy Reading!

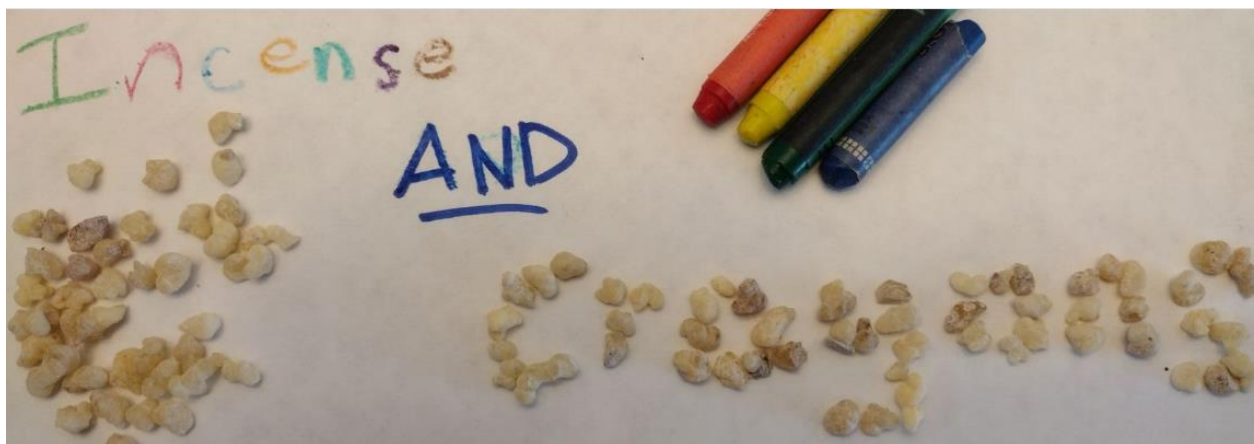
