Samaritan Center Visit Saturday, July 18th

Our next visit to the Samaritan Center will be significantly different than those in the recent past. As with every essential service, the staff of the center had to make considerable changes in a short period of time to keep staff members, volunteers, and guests safe and healthy during the pandemic. Meals are served on a strictly take out basis, guests are required to pick up their meals while maintaining social distancing and are only admitted if wearing a mask (those with no mask are delivered their meal while waiting outside) and they must leave the center after receiving their meal. All volunteers also must wear a mask and head covering and have their temperature taken as part of the sign in process. All meals are served without any physical contact between servers and guests. To summarize, the procedures have been altered to continue the effort to feed those in need while protecting everyone involved.

Our tasks will be to prepare and serve the meal as usual. We will need a group at 11 am to prepare the meal and another group at 12:30 pm to serve and clean up. Although the procedures have changed, this is still an opportunity to serve those whose need is great and meet people whom we might not encounter in our normal everyday life.
