### Nancy Winiecki, candidate for Warden

Hello Christ Church Family! My name is Nancy (Murdock) Winiecki and I have been a member of Christ Church for most of my life. Sharon Wisbey

I was born in Whitesboro, New York and grew up attending Grace Church in Utica. My parents were very involved in the church - my dad was on the Vestry and my mom was a member of the Altar Society so I grew up hoping that I would someday be a part of church life. I was baptized, confirmed and got married to Dwayne at Grace Church.

I graduated from SUNY Geneseo where I met Dwayne and later attended University of Buffalo for my Master's degree. Dwayne and I lived on Long Island in the early years of our marriage where I taught in Queens then Syosset on Long Island. We later moved to Liverpool when Dwayne was accepted to the Onondaga County Sheriff's Department. I began teaching science at Fayetteville Manlius High School at that time where I continue to work. We started attending Christ Church in 2001 after moving to Manlius.

I have also served on the Vestry and am excited to join once again.



## Prayer Collection

Christ Church will be putting together a Prayer Collection, and we invite you to join us! What is a prayer collection? It's a gathering of prayers that you pray on your own or with your family. Do you have a night-time prayer that you've always prayed with your kids? Do you sing a prayer before dinner? Do you say a few words in your heart when you pass an ambulance on the road? These prayers would be accompanied by a short description of how they came about, when we pray them, or who taught them to us. We'd then take all these prayers, bind them into a little book, and print them out for everyone to keep and maybe even use.

Here's an example: *before dinner, my family always says the same prayer (unless we have pizza, then you grab a piece and start eating before the pizza gets cold!). It's a simple prayer and one that many people know: first we cross ourselves, then we say "Bless us, O Lord, and these thy gifts, which we're about to receive, by thy blessing, through Christ our Lord, Amen." Then we cross ourselves again, then dig in. This simple prayer came from an important experience. It was the prayer we prayed when I was in my hospital chaplaincy, when all of us seminarians got together to eat with one another. We were Roman Catholics, Episcopalians, Lutherans, and Presbyterians, so we all prayed a little differently, but we all knew this prayer. Gwen was one at the time, so many of the seminarians helped her learn how to cross herself, how to put her hands together to pray, and taught her the words. To me, it is a symbol of ecumenism and community and also a sign of people coming together beyond differences.*

If you're interested in joining this project, print out the following sheet or pick one up in the narthex on Sunday morning. Put your prayers in the collection plate or give them to Father Tim or John Davies (whose idea this is!). We'll collect the prayers all throughout the Epiphany season and have them in a booklet for you during Lent.




