Father Tim's Meditation

Light is Returning to the World

Each morning, I walk Gwendolyn down to her bus stop. It's not too far down the street, but she likes the company. We get to chat about school and other things going on in our lives, and I really treasure the time. The walk was pretty tough in December and the early weeks of January, though, because it was so dark and cloudy. Sometimes we could see the first signs of light poking their way up between the trees and houses, but for the most part it was pretty dark. The streetlamps were all that really gave us light to see. This was a good time to remember the warmth of family, but boy was it cold!

Each day, though, things got a little brighter. The clouds weren't black but were grey. Then we went out one morning and the streetlamp wasn't on anymore. It was still cold, and there were still snowy days, but the light of day appeared earlier and earlier, and our spirits rose with the march of time continuing forward.

The seasons work this way, but so do our lives. Dark times come, and we huddle close to one another to keep each other warm. The sky of our hearts only hints at the presence of the sun. But things get brighter. The presence of family and friends warm us, the clouds about our hearts fade away. The cold ground of our inner garden thaws, and plants that we never remember having sown begin to pop up. We see that God has been in our hearts all along and has been hard at work.

Winter is almost over. The winter in our hearts may last a little longer, and the winter of our world - of our culture and of our ways of life - may take time to thaw. But remember that God is always hard at work, always tilling and sowing, always caring for and nurturing. Spring will come again, our Easter will appear as the sun rising over the horizon, and we will know peace.





Treasurer's Corner

Post the annual meeting in February, the church received the year end results of our four Endowment Investments. 2025 was a great year. With those updated investment earnings available, the funds were applied to the 2026 budget and as a result we are able to now balance the budget with anticipated incomes and expenses! The Cemetery Endowment will fully pay for anticipated expenses in 2026. In prior years, it had contributed to a part of the expense. The earnings from General Endowment Fund and from the Emmaus Fund for Christian Education will be applied as designated to those associated expenses and ministries. The Stained-Glass fund income will pay for the cleaning and repairs which are expected be completed in late spring. We have a great gift from those who have contributed to the principal of those investments over the years, making it possible to support our church operations and ministries.

In 2026, we received 68 pledges of \$229,851. Year-to-date as of February 21, pledge income is \$39,965, ahead of the same period in 2025. Non-pledge income is \$1,220 as of the same date.

Thank you to all who contribute and honor their pledge commitments.

Simple music, scripture readings, prayers, and candlelight set a thoughtful tone. Taizé is an ecumenical community in France which draws people from all over the world for shared worship and work while living in community. Taizé services begin on February 22, and will be offered through Sunday, March 22. They are wonderful as a Lenten discipline or as a time to invite people who might not be comfortable with more structured, formal church services, or for whom Sunday mornings do not work.




Writers' Companionship Group


