## **Father Tim's Meditation**

What does the word “vacation” mean for you? For school kids, it means those times when they’re not in school. For many working people, it means how many days (“vacation days”) we can take from work. For some retired folks, vacations are trips to take away from the otherwise ho-hum schedule of life. Have you ever heard of a stay-cation? That’s a time when you don’t go to work but also don’t go anywhere. You *stay* home but don’t go to work.

Vacations are great things, but every now and again, and perhaps this summer, try to think of your vacation as a sabbath vacation. Sabbath is different from merely not working; it’s a time when we enter into a different pace of life and ground for living. The rules for life are not simply “not-work” or “not-school” or “not-chores” but God’s rules: to study and love creation. This is your singular work during the sabbath, and it’s why sabbath is so important.

Normally, we fill our weekends with chores, especially if we’re working or have young children. How often do we sit down, close our eyes (or open them fully), and say, “God, I am at your mercy. Do with me as you will”? And then just sit and wait upon the Lord? How often do we do this on vacation? I hope you do it often, and not just in prayer, but in loving adoration of creation, of family, of Scripture, of the Sacraments, and of the presence of Jesus Christ, in the Spirit, in your life.

I welcome you to save a sabbath vacation this summer. Maybe for a few hours, maybe for a day, maybe for a week. Enter into God’s time and live with your brother Jesus Christ.

## From the Rector's Desk



You may have seen in the news that Pop Leo XIV has written an encyclical about AI and human dignity. Our own bishop has been in communication with us clergy and other leaders in the diocese concerning the same. I also just read this morning about AI being boo'ed at commencement ceremonies across the country, even as the stocks for AI companies rise. AI is the topic of the day, and so I wanted to write to you all and let you know my perspective as your pastor.

I myself have many problems with the use of AI, especially generative AI. It uses tremendous amounts of natural resources, and most of the materials used to train AI models comes from artists and writers who have not given their consent - and even from copyrighted material. I'm also concerned with AI hallucinations, which means that AI often gets things wrong and can give, at times, life-threatening suggestions. More basically, I worry about using AI to think for us. Christianity has been at the forefront of developing how people think and consider the world around them for two millennia, and to give certain roles to machines ignores the wisdom of this tradition.

As for me, I will not, nor have I ever, used AI to generate sermons or other written or artistic material, nor do I use AI to toss around ideas, proofread my work, or at any other time in my work as your priest. I have asked the employees and committees here at Christ Church to do the same, though I have left it to their discretion if and when to use it. I have also purposefully avoided AI, trading certain programs or internet browsers for those that do not use AI. I think that this is an important issue, and I may preach about it in sermons in the future (if it pertains to the Scripture passages or church events, of course, which are the centerpoints and foundations of my sermons).

I don't come down hard on things all that often, and even though I am here, please know that I am always open to conversation. I appreciate all your thoughts.

## Coffee Hour for 2026-2027



Coffee Hour is a valuable, ongoing ministry of Christ Church. Each week following both the 8:00 a.m. and 10:15 a.m. worship services we welcome people to gather in Crosby Hall and enjoy food, drink, and fellowship. Coffee Hour creates a time to greet visitors, to get to know new people, and to connect with other members of Christ Church. Far more than simply a snack, Coffee Hour is an extension of the worship practices of breaking bread and building community together.

Many of our guests and newcomers comment on the warm, friendly reception they have received at Christ Church, and a significant part of that experience has come from time spent following the worship service getting to know others at Coffee Hour. It is with these goals in mind that we ask each family who attends Christ Church to take a turn hosting coffee hour once a year if they are able.

We've been experimenting with the use of SignUpGenius for coffee hour hosting for a few years now, and it's been a mixed success. It has been a wonderful tool to allow people to sign up for the dates that work best for them, and at the same time, we end up with dates that are unfilled when no one has signed up.

For this reason, we'll be modifying our plan for 2026-2027. We'll be asking people who have preferred dates for hosting coffee hour to sign up for those dates by August 15. After that, we'll begin assigning people who haven't signed up to fill in the open spots. Your willingness to participate in this ministry is both appreciated and essential.



### Treasurer's Corner

In our recent fundraising efforts, the Rummage sale took in \$7053 over the course of two weekends and post online sales; a tremendous effort by our volunteers and from the donations of parishioners. The Diaper Bank collection was \$585 in cash, which was doubled by matching funds at the Diaper Bank, and also included many diaper purchases donated and brought to church.

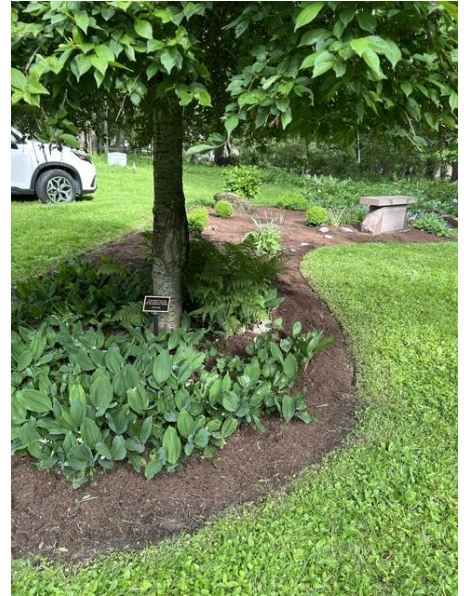

In May a parishioner donated \$1000 to reduce the principal on our mortgage for Crosby Hall and classrooms. Our outstanding principal is now \$101,203.

I am in need of some summer time help with the gardening around the church perimeter again this year. The help I received last year was invaluable and so appreciated!!!

As per last year, this can be done based on your own schedule. I am happy to speak to you about any questions you might have.

Here is what is needed:

- you will need to bring your own tools along with a watering can.
- light weeding around the church perimeter once per week
- weeding the stone area under the Community Room windows at the front of the church if possible. As with all weeding, this is best done after a good rain.
- watering all the potted plants by the doorways and annual plantings under the Christ Church sign along with dead heading them as needed.
- During the heat of the summer watering may be required more than once per week. There is a hose located at the front of the church under the kitchen windows for your use.

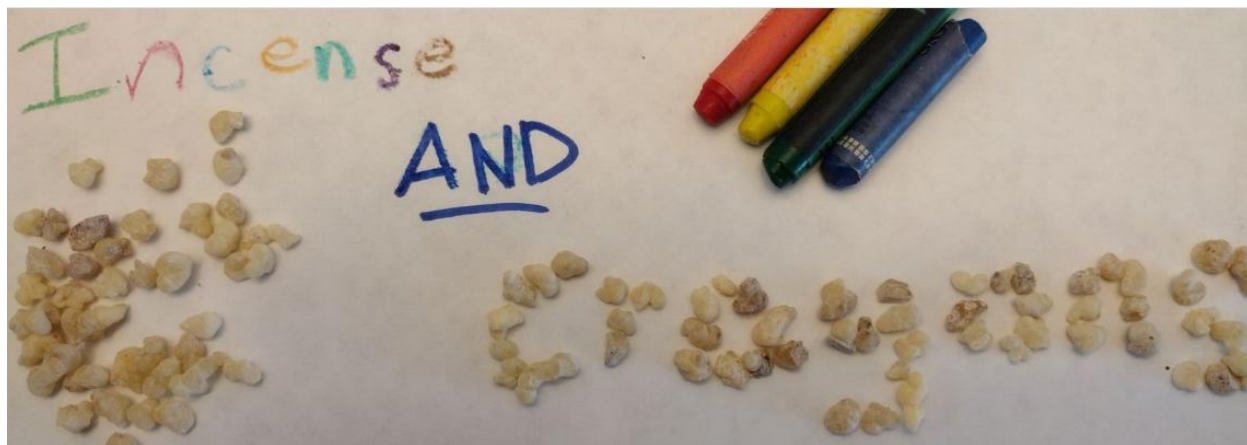


## Coffee and Theology

## St. Margaret's Craft Guild

The St. Margaret's Craft Guild meets on the first, third, and occasionally the fifth Tuesday of the month from 1:30-4:00 in the community room. Attendees bring a handheld craft of some sort, and work and chat during that afternoon. (Not sure what to bring? Previous crafts have included knitting, crochet, hand sewing, diamond painting, journaling, and cross stitch.) Anyone is welcome to attend, but we recommend you check in with the office to make sure it's happening—it's a small group of regulars, so if only one person can attend it may be cancelled. We'd love to have you join us!



Do you collect your bottles and cans for recycling? Why not "donate" them to Christ Church! Bring them down to Manlius Bottle & Cans, located at 202 W Seneca Street (up the street from the Manlius Tops).

To drop off bottle redemptions through the Christ Church fundraising account you simply bring your cans in. They must be in a disposable plastic bag that is closed - such as a trash bag that is tied securely. At the counter there is a table with blank labels and a marker - write "Christ Church Manlius" on the label (one label per bag) and leave the bag in the charity area on the opposite wall.



There has been a sharp decline in scheduled blood donations, which typically account for nearly 90 percent of all donations. This drop is especially concerning as we enter the summer months. Between Memorial Day and Labor Day, trauma cases often increase due to car accidents, outdoor activities, and seasonal travel, creating a greater need for blood, at a time when blood collection becomes more challenging due to busy schedules, vacations, school breaks, and severe weather. This makes it even more important to secure appointments in the coming weeks to maintain a stable blood supply for patients who rely on transfusions every day.
