#### **Father Tim's Meditation**

I hope you'll enjoy these changes and feel moved by the Spirit to join in!

## **Vestry Voices**

This column, to be written by Vestry members, will take a different form this year. Father Tim has asked that each of us share our personal stories on how we found God and how it relates to our leadership at Christ Church. Here is my story:

Many long years ago, I *learned* about God in Sunday School. My parents were faithful Episcopalians. In fact, my father served as the Senior Warden of a large church and my mother was a soloist in the choir. They were loving parents who had serious problems. Mother was mentally ill and my father developed a serious drinking problem in order to cope. This type of trauma can have a profound effect on a youngster's sense of worth.

As a teenager, I found the situation intolerable and I confided in a couple of adults who violated my trust, by telling my parents. I didn't talk to my priest because my parents were "pillars" of the church.

At the age of 14, I *found* God; a friend who could help me. I vividly remember sitting on the edge of my bed and asking him for strength and direction. Somehow, he answered.

He (and my dad) gave me a sense of humor and I learned to become a leader. I promised God that when I grew up, I would find work where I would maintain confidences; help and lead others and live by the Golden Rule.

Throughout my personal and professional life, I have worked to keep that promise. And now, serving as a Warden of Christ Church and leading the Personnel Committee, I will try to do the same.

## From the Rector's Desk



This past month, Bishop DeDe gave authority to local vestries to decide their masking protocols. Our vestry voted unanimously to make masking optional for all worship services. Christ Church staff requested that we continue to mask during those hours when the office is open, and you all have been respectful of this request. Thank you for that, and thank you for all the feedback. If you have any questions or thoughts, please feel free to get in touch with any vestry member or with me. We'd be happy

to sit down with you and any questions you might have.

But wait, aren't there other regulations? What about them? Well, here's an update on the status of other regulations surrounding COVID. Please note that all of the following are pending the CDC's recommendations. At the time of writing this article, our county is still "medium" transmission. If we ever move to "high", we'll be required to change all regulations.

- Coffee hour will resume starting Palm Sunday, April 10th.
  - This means that we will have our Maundy Thursday agape meal on the 14th and the breakfast on Easter morning for the choir, altar guild, and liturgical assistants.
- The choir will **process** beginning Palm Sunday, April 10th.
- We will continue to receive the Most Blessed Sacrament in one kind: the Bread.
- The acolytes and crucifers will return to almost all pre-pandemic restrictions. The only thing that won't return is that I will continue to proclaim the Gospel with the acolyte behind me (instead of holding the book, thus getting a face full of wind.

If you have any questions, please let the vestry or me know. Thank you!



## Little Free Library Coming Soon

We are excited to announce a NEW addition to the Christ Church Outreach ministry. Last fall, Doug and Carla Allen stepped up to propose the addition of a Little Free Library on Christ Church property and it was approved by the vestry shortly thereafter. For those



unfamiliar, a LFL is a self-service wooden box where community members can share or donate their favorite books for others to have or use. "Take a book. Share a book." is the mantra of the LFL Organization. While the ground is still frozen, the Allens are doing prep work including sourcing the box and building materials, working with the Grounds Committee on placement and installation, and curating the initial offerings for the box. If you want to participate in the launching of this exciting new ministry, we are looking for a few donations including bookmarks, a True Value gift card for lumber needed, and possibly some books from Forward

Movement or small bibles. Once the library is open, help can take the form of offering to participate in the maintenance of the library, making a financial contribution toward the project, or simply using the LFL as a source for new reading material for yourself. We expect to be ready to install the box itself once we have a thaw in the Spring. Stay tuned for updates on this exciting ministry!

### **Taizé Worship Service**



During Lent we will hold a Taizé worship service on Sunday evenings at 7:00 p.m. Taizé is a style of worship that is quiet, meditative and prayerful. Simple music, scripture readings, prayers, and candlelight set a thoughtful tone. Taizé is an ecumenical community in France which draws people from all over the world for shared worship and work while living in community. Taizé services will begin on Sunday, March 6 and will be offered through Sunday, April 3. They are wonderful as a

Lenten discipline or as a time to invite people who might not be comfortable with more structured, formal church services, or for whom Sunday mornings do not work.
