The Holy Spirit willing the profile will be ready for release about the time of Easter, the day of resurrection. Please pray for the Search Committee in this new phase of its work. In addition the Annual Meeting after worship on Sunday, February 2, will lift up and celebrate the ministry and work of Christ Church in the growing season of 2019. The conversation will elect new leaders and generate direction and goals for 2020. Please read the Annual Report booklet. Please be present for the Annual Meeting and participate in the discussion. Please pray for the Vestry and all the congregation leaders who give their time and efforts to build up this congregation and its good work.

Finally, February 26, Ash Wednesday, begins the season of Lent. Two worship services will be offered. This also is part of the spiritual discipline of preparing for a new growing season, of entering and walking more deeply the way of love of Jesus. In Lent we are challenged to give up what is hurtful and take on what is helpful, to give up harmful habits of thinking and acting and to learn new habits of giving and caring. Please join us for worship and prayer on Ash Wednesday.

Vestry Voices: Biographies of Vestry Candidates

Doug Allen - Vestry

Doug is a 1985 graduate of Syracuse University. Upon graduation, he returned home to Rhode Island and purchased Clark Mini Fastener, a manufacturer of miniature components for optical, jewelry, and electronic industries. He sold it in 2010 to a competitor and now works as an independent sales rep for his old company, going to Rhode Island for a week each month to see customers.

Doug's community activities all took place in Rhode Island. As a member of Christ Episcopal Church in Lincoln, he served as a Senior Warden, Junior Warden, Vestry member as well as serving on Stewardship, Being the Head Usher. Lecturing, and working on two Search Committees.

Doug spent 4 years as an elected official on the Lincoln Town Council. He was a member of the Rotary Club of Pawtucket, serving as a President, and Board Member. Weather Cancellations


