# Rector's Reflection

Dear Christ Church members and friends, I have had the joy and privilege of serving as Rector of Christ Church for more than nine years. During that time I have grown to know and love you, and to appreciate the presence of God made visible in you. Christ Church is a special place in which the Holy Spirit lives and moves, and through whose people the world is made a better place.

I write to share with you the news that I have been called to serve as Canon to the Ordinary in the Diocese of Rhode Island. To translate into everyday terms, I will be Bishop Knisely's Chief of Staff and will assist him with the management, oversight and operations of the diocese, and in the support of clergy and congregations. It is an honor to be called as Canon to the Ordinary, and it will challenge me to use the skills and experience I have developed while working with you, serving in the Diocese of Central New York, and completing the Doctor of Ministry. Doubtless there will be many learning curves as well, so I ask your prayers for the days ahead.

My last day with you will be Sunday, July 21, and the Vestry will have a farewell brunch following the 9:00 a.m. worship service. I hope that you will be able to join us that day.

The Vestry and staff have accepted this news with grace and have begun planning the next steps. Wardens Dwayne Wisbey and Catherine Montes and Vestry members have already met with The Rev. Canon Carrie Schofield-Broadbent, Canon for Transition, to discuss the process for calling an interim and eventually a new rector.

Christ Church is filled with loving, faithful people who do their best to support and encourage one another in following Jesus. You have a beautiful building that is very well maintained, a solid financial foundation, generous stewardship, a responsive outreach ministry, a vibrant music ministry, and a dedicated worship team. Best of all, you shine with the love of God. You have a bright future ahead and I will continue to pray for you as you grow into it.

# Worship Notes

From the last week of June through Labor Day weekend Christ Church has one worship service each Sunday at 9:00 a.m. During the past several years we have used Eucharistic Prayer C, which emphasizes creation, during the summer months. With the Bishop's permission I adapted Prayer C to be consistent with the Expansive Language version of the other Eucharistic prayers.

The Season after Pentecost is the longest liturgical season in the Church year. It begins just after the Epiphany and lasts until Ash Wednesday, then returns the Monday after Pentecost until the first Sunday of Advent. Also called Ordinary Time, this season emphasizes growth, as the Good News of Jesus Christ is spread through the ministry and preaching of Jesus' followers who have received the Holy Spirit. During Ordinary Time the priest wears green vestments and the altar, lectern, and pulpit have green hangings.

As many of you already know, my final Sunday at Christ Church will be July 21. The Wardens and Vestry are in conversation with The Rev. Canon Carrie Schofield-Broadbent and they will keep you informed about calling an interim. You may have supply clergy or offer Morning Prayer until an interim is available.

# **Christ Church Memorial Garden**

Some may not even know the Memorial Garden exists within the Christ Church Cemetery boundaries.

In1995 Barbara Lipe, a long-time church member, and then cemetery registrar, recognized the trend toward cremation. She envisioned a memorial garden for cremation remains within the cemetery boundaries. With initial funding from the Ladies' Benevolent Association (LBA), she had boulders brought in from the Lipe farm to outline a semi-circle for the garden. Since then, several men and women have worked to further develop and maintain the garden, the final resting place for many of our church family. Their names are engraved on the three marble benches therein. It is sacred ground lovingly cared for. If you haven't seen it, please consider a visit. It's a great place for peaceful meditation.

Currently there are three who loyally tend the garden, two of whom wish to retire. There are no requirements to help, no set schedule to keep, only a willingness to spend an hour or two now and then to tidy up, pull weeds, spread some mulch, or plant a flower... alone or with a friend. Be assured, your help would be welcomed.





# **Announcements and Reminders**

**The Rector's Discretionary Fund** is a special account that is financed by the loose cash offering gathered one Sunday each month and by additional donations from parishioners and others. At Christ Church the **loose plate offering from the first Sunday of each month** is designated for the Rector's Discretionary Fund. Many churches also include a line item in the budget. The purpose of the Rector's Discretionary Fund is described in the Episcopal Church Canons as *"to be applied to such pious and charitable uses as the Rector or Priest-in-Charge shall determine."* Money from this fund is used to assist those in financial need, to support ministry, and to contribute to the work of the wider Church.

#### **Delta Sonic Gift Certificates**
