March 17 Vestry Meeting It is my deep pleasure to announce that the vestry enthusiastically agreed to hire **Rebecca Russell** as Christ Church's **Director of Youth and Christian Education**! She begins March 1. Rebecca brings to the position years of experience in church youth activities, in Young Life (as a participant and as a leader locally to this day, including foreign mission trips), and as a professional in music education. She has served Christ Church in the past on the vestry and prior search and evangelism Committees, and is currently in the choir and participating on the pastoral care team and prayer chain.

Rebecca's proposed Mission Statement for Christ Church's Christian Education ministry is: **That**

every child knows and experiences the love of Jesus. Rebecca looks forward to working with the teachers and system already in place and to strengthening youth ministries and activities. She envisions some new activities such as "Children's Chapel" during Sunday school periodically, so that children begin to understand what a worship service is all about and to incorporate worship and love for God in their hearts.

Rebecca wrote, "It is my belief that we are created to love and be loved by God...we must keep that Love alive for our children. John 3:16."

At this time, we also must pause to recognize and thank **Doris Stoddard**, Parish Administrator, for filling in the gaps for many years in Faith Formation activities. She helped hold things together in ways beyond our awareness.

One person cannot do this ministry alone. Please extend your appreciation and personal support to Rebecca. Please help Rebecca get organized and oriented, and pass

along your thoughts and ideas. Please pray for Rebecca and Christ Church's youth and children's ministries. If you are already involved, please stay involved. If you might be new to children's and youth education and activities and want to get involved, you will find a capable and gifted leader to prepare and guide you.

On Sunday, **March 22**, please join me in welcoming a remarkable and humbling individual **Clifford Ryan** to Christ Church. Clifford Ryan is the founder **of "O.G.'s (Our Generation) Against Gun Violence"** a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization in the city of Syracuse. Its mission is "to take back our community to stop the bloodshed and tears of losing our children to violence & prison." Mike Montes from Christ Church is on the Board of Directors.

Clifford Ryan will present short and, I believe, eye-opening temple talks during worship, longer presentations after worship, and conversations with the youth during Sunday School.

Clifford Ryan was personally affected by violence when his 19-year-old son killed by a gun. He made it his personal mission to do all he could to build relationships with youth and to stop gun violence. In the process he has stopped at least 42 shootings and been stabbed once.

Syracuse is the heart of our community, our county, and our region. What happens in and to Syracuse spills over and affects us all. And we must do all we can as Christians to preserve and to protect the lives of all God's precious children.

On **Sunday, March 1**, please welcome the **Rev. Richard "Rick" Laribee** to lead worship and to preach, while I am visiting family in southern California, February 27 – March 5.

March 1, 7 pm, is also **the first Taizé service for Lent.** They are offered every Sunday evening in March. I have heard so many appreciative and good things about them, and I look forward to them upon my return. Many thanks go to Debbie Cunningham and Shawn Hebert for planning and leading them.

The Adult Faith Conversation on the Book of Matthew has two more sessions, Sunday, March 8 and 15, 9 am, in the Parlor. March 8 is Lesson 7: Stories of the End (Matthew 21-25). March 15 is Lesson 8: Death and Resurrection (Matthew 26-28). We will resume with a new series on March 29. Please join us!

Safe Church Training

Safe Church Training will be held here at Christ Church **on Sunday, May 17, 2 to 6 pm.** The Rev. Dr. Gerald Beritela is the presenter. **Pre-registration by May 3** is required. Pre-register with Doris Stoddard in the church office. The training is open to members of other churches also.

Safe Church Training is required by the diocese for all clergy, vestry members, parish employees, worship leaders, lay ministers, Eucharistic visitors, and anyone volunteering or working with children in any capacity. But anyone may attend. It can be especially helpful for parents and grandparents.

Safe Church Training promotes standards and practices designed to prevent and respond to sexual abuse, exploitation, and harassment. Receiving this training together helps provide a common and shared culture in our congregation safe for all. Similar training elsewhere does not release one from the requirement. Your contributions from training elsewhere may, in fact, enhance the experience for others.

The training must be renewed every five years. If one already received the training in person, one can renew by taking the training online.

Doris Stoddard, parish administrator, administers Safe Church for Christ Church, and she can tell you if you need to renew and set you up for the online course. It may not be possible, but I would be very pleased to have everyone complete the training before the new rector comes.

Taízé Worship Service



During Lent we will hold a Taizé worship service on Sunday evenings at 7:00 p.m. Taizé is a style of worship that is quiet, meditative and prayerful. Simple music, scripture readings, prayers, and candlelight set a thoughtful tone. Taizé is an ecumenical community in France which draws people from all over the world for shared worship and work while living in community. Taizé services will begin on Sunday, March 1 and will be offered through Sunday, March 29. They are

wonderful as a Lenten discipline or as a time to invite people who might not be comfortable with more structured, formal church services, or for whom Sunday mornings do not work.

Sunday Book Conversations

"Discover the Gospel of Matthew" continues on Sunday mornings, at 9 am. on March 8 and 15. The Gospel of Matthew is the primary reading in our Sunday worship services in 2020. March 8 is Lesson 7: Stories of the End (Matthew 21-25). March 15 is Lesson 8: Death and Resurrection (Matthew 26-28). Please join us! Before each session watch the 15 minutes video online and read the study guide. The presenters in the video are Dr. Harold W. Attridge, Sterling Professor of Divinity, and Michal Beth Dinkler, Assistant Professor of New Testament, at Yale Divinity School. The course was designed for parish use and is free. You do not need "Enroll" at the website. Just show up here at Christ Church!

We will begin a new series on March 29.

Fayetteville-Manlius A Better Chance FMABC HOUSE


Opening the door to greater educational opportunities since 1974
