Father Tim's Meditation

October is Stewardship month, and this often makes people uneasy. Not that it's somehow unreligious to talk about money: Jesus talked about money often. Christ Church requires maintenance, and we have a great staff that do tremendous and very Christian work.

Even still, 'finances' and 'church' can feel odd together. We may feel guilt: am I pledging enough? Am I doing enough? Should I be doing more? Money can also seem like a gateway: if you don't pledge, then are you a part of the church? Can I take Communion without pledging 'enough'? Will Father Tim not visit me in the hospital if I'm late on a pledge?

Of course I will. No matter what you pledge (even if you pledge nothing at all!), you're still welcome at the Altar, and I'll be by your side if you are rushed to the hospital. The finance

committee doesn't sit around and shake their heads when they see you've not pledged some magic number. You are a member of the church regardless of how little or how much you give back.

Stewardship and pledging, however, are disciplines. We practice them to grow closer in likeness to God and to learn more deeply how to serve others. We look at our possessions, our skills, our gifts, and our privileges and we ask: what is truly mine? And what gifts are not for ourselves but for the life and betterment of those around me? How can I be more like God in how I give?

Pray about your pledge this October. Pray about what you give and how you give. And continue to pray for those who we, Christ Church, are helping. There's a lot of people whose lives are better because we are here.

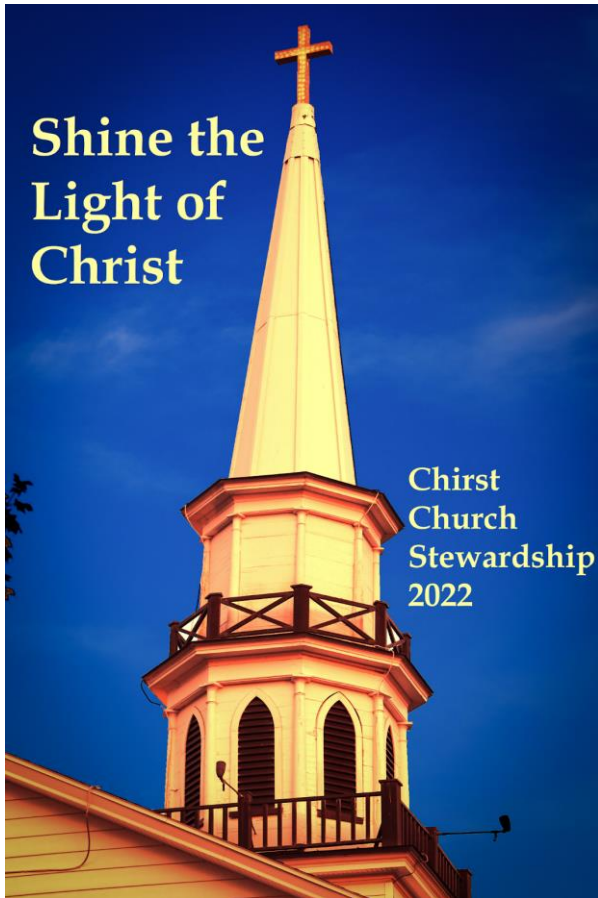

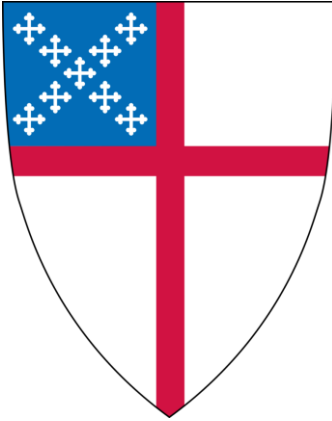

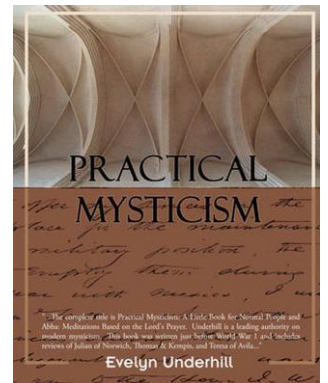


All Saints' Day

Responses and Meditations From the Summer CC Survey

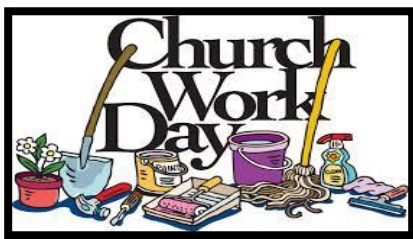
One of the responses from our summer survey asked a great question: “Why doesn’t Father Tim pray before his sermon or say ‘Amen’ at the end?” This is a great question.



There are no rubrics in the Prayer Book for beginning a sermon, but many preachers pray aloud to open their sermon. This often helps ease the preacher’s heart and orient them towards the Holy Spirit. I also pray; I just do it silently. There are a lot of (beautiful) words in our liturgy, but I also want to focus on the silences. Here we can *all* ready our hearts and minds for the movement of the Holy Spirit as we reflect together on what we’ve just heard.

Saying “Amen” at the end of the sermon is different. “Amen” means “let it be so” or even simply “I agree.” It’s used at the end of prayers to add our voice to the petitions. Liturgically, when someone says “amen”, the expected response is to say “amen” back. But you may not agree with my sermon (that’s just fine), nor is a sermon a prayer. I end my sermons with silence to give you time with the Holy Spirit to ask: “what do *I* think about that meditation?” This is a holy moment that I (again) hope to emphasize with silence.

Have you ever wanted to go to a cemetery and get a history lesson while raking?!!!.

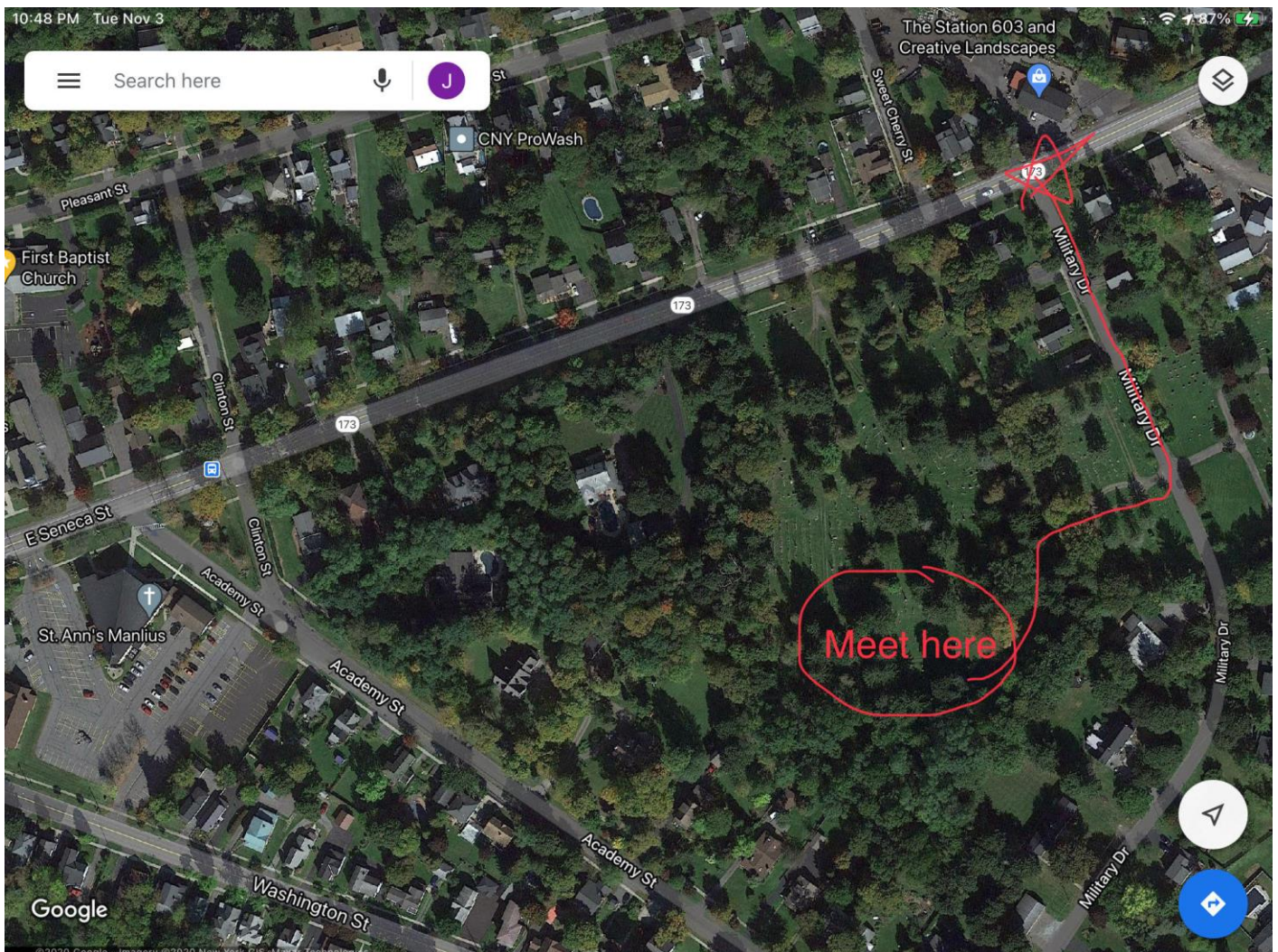

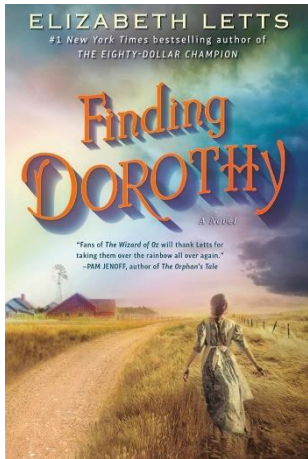

We will meet the second Wednesdays of the month and discuss a book! I have chosen our first two books to get us up and running.

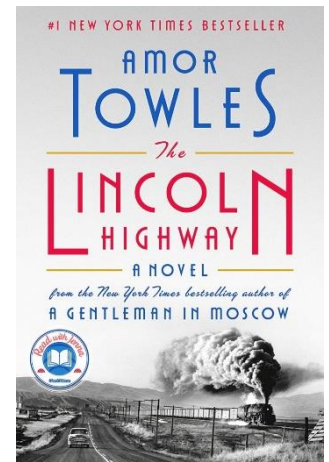


Wednesday October 12, at 3:30, we will meet in the community room to discuss, Finding Dorothy, by Elizabeth Letts.

The Rector’s Discretionary Fund is a special account that is financed by the loose cash offering gathered one Sunday each month and by additional donations from parishioners and others. At Christ Church the **loose plate offering from the first Sunday of each month** is designated for the Rector’s Discretionary Fund. Many churches also include a line item in the budget. The purpose of the Rector’s Discretionary Fund is described in the Episcopal Church Canons as “*to be applied to such pious and charitable uses as the Rector or Priest-in-Charge shall determine.*” Money from this fund is used to assist those in financial need, to support ministry, and to contribute to the work of the wider Church.
