Father Tim's Meditation

Summer is kind of like a pilgrimage. We break from our usual routine and, often, travel to different places. We leave our normal life behind and enter into a temporary way of living. If we have kids, we find out how they'll spend their days and often simply spend more time with them. If we're retired, then we spend more time off on the road somewhere. Even at Christ Church, we ease back into a single service at 9:00. We go on hikes together. Even my schedule changes (I work on Saturdays during the summer and am off Thursdays and Fridays instead). Everything changes, even if just a little bit.

Pilgrimages are about leaving things behind so that we may reevaluate who we are. Often they come with spiritual experiences and a sense of new depth. Then (and this is just as important) we take what we have learned about ourselves and about the world back into our normal lives to rejuvenate them. We bring wisdom and life back into our norms to make them thrive.

What will you see on your summer pilgrimage? How will you be challenged? How will you be comforted? What new wisdom will God show you? And how will you take that wisdom and integrate it back into how you're living now (which is probably how you'll live in September when your pilgrimage is over). Keep an eye open for God during these months and especially when you're off and away somewhere. And keep your eye on how God is leading you back home when all is said and done.



Expense items out of the ordinary:


- Rotor-routed the backed-up drain in the Old Parish Hall \$695

Tithes: \$320 was donated to FM Outreach and \$320 to Clear Path for Veterans, earlier this year, based on the Christmas Mart profit.






Afternoon Book Group


