Father Tim's Meditation

Happy Easter! And not just Easter *day* but Easter *season*. One of the beautiful parts about celebrating Easter in liturgical churches is that we don't have to keep Easter to just one day, but we get *fifty* days of joy. Alleluia, Christ is Risen!

But hold on a second: fifty days of joy? Think about that for a moment. We're living in some tough times. It's hard to talk to our neighbors, let alone find space in our hearts to love them. Our time is a time of anxiety, not of joy - and here your priest is telling you that you have not just a day of joy, not just a week, not even just a month, but *fifty days of joy*! I'm asking for a lot here. The *Church* is asking for a lot. Or, to put it another way, the Church is *challenging* you to a lot.

In times of anxiety, it is hard to live a life of joy; but that is, nevertheless, our challenge as Christians. This doesn't mean that we ignore the things that are wrong, that we don't strive to find our neighbors' hearts in the turmoil of our community lives, but that we also remember that God created for joy. After God finished Creation, he looked out over it and said, yes, all this is *very good*. Our call is to enjoy such a Creation.

And fifty days of joy? Fifty days, one after another? It may seem like a pipe dream, but take it as a challenge instead; because challenges can be met and overcome. You, too, can enjoy the next fifty days, can find joy in the quiet or boisterous life that you live, and raise thanksgivings, each and every day, to God.

Vestry Voice

I wanted to take a moment to tell you my favorite physical attribute of Christ Church.

No, it's not the stained-glass windows (though they are SPECTACULAR) or the architecture (again, spectacular). My favorite physical attribute in Christ Church is a small, framed piece of paper that hangs by the side door that leads to the church offices. Written on that paper are the financial pledges of some of the first parishioners of Christ Church from the 1800's. Those are the people we can thank for the beautiful building we worship in every Sunday.

The pledges seem modest by today's standards. \$5, \$20, \$35. However, \$35 in 1804 is nearly \$3,000 in today's currency. Everyone gave as they could of their talents and treasures. Now, 221 years later, their investment blesses us weekly.

They did their part, now, it's our turn.

In our March Vestry meeting, Peter Geiskopf shared that we have a 2025 budget shortfall of nearly \$30,000. Our expenses (and they are modest) are \$30,000 more than we currently project we will bring in.

Yeah, not good.

Talking about money in church is uncomfortable for everyone (although Jesus mentioned money in 16 of 38 parables and 288 times in the Gospels). It's just a reality of life.

Here's a quick reminder of what Jesus had to say about money from Mark 12 41-44 *"Jesus sat down opposite the place where the offerings were put and watched the crowd putting their money into the temple treasury. Many rich people threw in large amounts. But a poor widow came and put in two very small copper coins, worth only a few cents. Calling his disciples to him, Jesus said, 'Truly I tell you; this poor widow has put more into the treasury than all the others. They all gave out of their wealth; but she, out of her poverty, put in everything—all she had to live on.'"*

It's our turn.

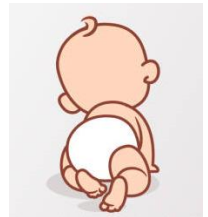

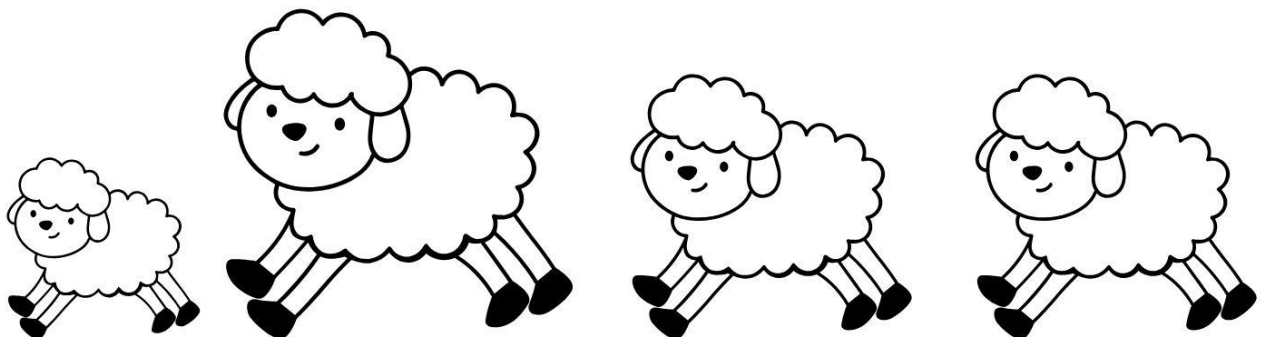

Coffee Hour for 2024-2025

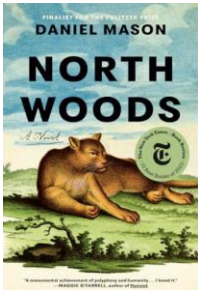
