Our children's program is robust and full of energy! As director of Children's Education, I get the privilege of seeing this growth from a number of different angles. Here is a brief story. We held children's chapel for the first three Sundays in Advent. During this time, students from Pre-K to Middle School sat together and worshiped in a simplified liturgy. Each week, we adults saw older kids help younger ones find page the right page in our worship book. The youngest were confident enough to ask questions of their elders when readings were confusing. Kids mingled and interacted with others outside their family and friendships were strengthened. And that's what the kids did on their own, while we adults led the liturgy. We are growing and it is beautiful to see.
