Father Tim's Meditation

We often talk about “spring cleaning”, but we rarely talk about “fall cozying up.” We do some nesting in the autumn, don’t we? We turn on the heat and warm up the house for the first time, we clean up the yard of leaves and put away assorted tools. We take out blankets and comfy pillows for the couch. We rediscover our favorite mugs for hot chocolate. We remember why warm coffee is so good, and we sip it slowly. We prepare for winter.

We do this spiritually, too. Many people take out their old favorite books of meditations during this time. We pray a bit more quietly. We consider thanksgivings more than prayers of intercession. We sip God like warm coffee.

We do these things, perhaps, though we might do them only unconsciously. Cozy up to God with intention this month. Talk to God about the close, warm, blanket-like things of faith. Pray that the homeless find safe, warm places to stay, especially at night and in the snow. Greet people more slowly and more deeply. Pray silently or quietly in the dark of the morning or of the evening. Love God in this season as the season loves you.

Treasurer's Corner

Stained Glass maintenance

In 2015, Brennan's Glass Studios dismantled, rebuilt and reinstalled the 12 Christ Church stained-glass windows in our sanctuary. This restoration project was completely done from the generous support of an anonymous donor. Following that restoration, the Stained-Glass Endowment fund was created from the generous donations of parishioners and with matching funds from a donor. The purpose of the fund is the ongoing maintenance of the beautiful stained glass, which includes 2 Tiffany windows (east side).

Recently, Brennan's Glass studios performed a periodic inspection and assessment of our windows. They noted a need for some minor repairs and for the repainting and recaulking of the exterior wooden frames. That work is planned for late spring 2026 when conditions are appropriate for the work. All of the work will be paid from the earnings of the Stained-Glass Endowment, and is apart and separate from the normal income and expense of running the parish.

We are truly blessed and thankful to have these funds available to maintain the stained glass, and to be able to worship in such a beautiful sanctuary.

Altar Guild

A refrigerator, secured by parishioners' donation, is now used for storing altar flowers. The Altar Guild estimates a \$400 savings on flower purchases this year due to having the refrigerator available for flower storage.

Stewardship

The stewardship campaign to support parish operations in 2026 was completed at the end of October, with our ingathering luncheon. Thank you to all who have supported this important effort with your generous responses!

A reminder, if you have not yet submitted a pledge for 2026, please do so as soon as possible. The vestry meets December 2nd to discuss and vote on the 2026 budget, and will decide those things we can continue to support based on pledge levels. Contact the parish office if you need or misplaced the pledge form.

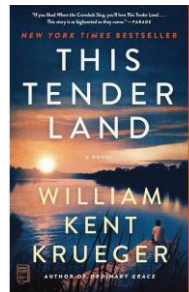
Coffee Hour Hosts Needed

note that these openings are subject to change as people sign up or change the slots they've signed up for, so please be sure to check the link for the latest information!

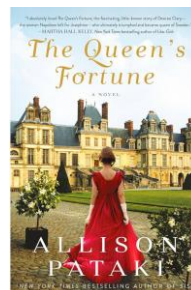
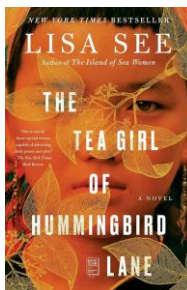
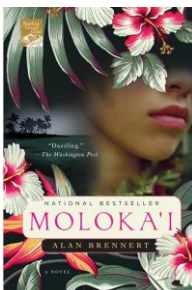
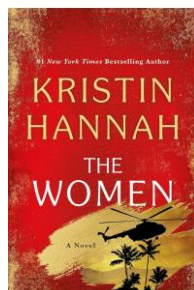
