The Gospel Canticle: Benedictus Dominus Deus Israel

through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Night Prayer / Compline



The Lord almighty grant us a quiet night
and a perfect end.

Glory to the Father, and to the Son,
and to the Holy Spirit;
as it was in the beginning, is now,
and shall be for ever. Amen.

Silent prayer/reflection on the past day.

I will bless the Lord who gives me counsel.
My heart teaches me, night after night.
Lord, have mercy.

We have waited in silence on your loving kindness, God,
in the midst of your temple.
Christ, have mercy.

I lie down in peace, at once I fall asleep,
for only you, Lord, make me dwell in safety.
Lord, have mercy.

Psalm 134

Come, bless the LORD, all you servants of the LORD,
who stand by night in the house of the LORD!
Lift up your hands to the holy place,
and bless the LORD.
May the LORD, maker of heaven and earth,
bless you from Zion.

Psalm 104. 1,21-33

Bless the Lord O my soul.

O Lord my God, you are very great.
You are clothed with honour and majesty
The young lions roar for their prey,
seeking their food from God.
When the sun rises, they withdraw
and lie down in their dens.
People go out to their work
and to their labour until the evening.
O Lord, how manifold are your works!

Yonder is the sea, great and wide,

I will sing praise to my God while I have being.

The Reading - Revelation 22.4,5

The servants of the Lamb shall see the face of God, whose name will be on their foreheads. There will be no more night: they will not need the light of a lamp or the light of the sun, for God will be their light, and they will reign for ever and ever.

A time of silent reflection may follow the reading.

The Gospel Canticle: Nunc Dimittis

Lord, now you have set your servant free:
to go in peace as you have promised.
For these eyes of mine have seen your salvation:
which you have prepared for all the world to see;
A light to reveal you to the nations:
and to give glory to your people Israel.

may your holy angels dwell with us and guard us in peace
and may your blessing be always upon us;
