

Why Should We Study the Old Testament?

- God wrote it and is present through it.
- It is a testimony of who He is, and what He has done, and will continue to do.
- It provides a historical account of the world's creation and man.
- It gives us instructions on how to live (Deuteronomy 30) Isaiah Bulla- believed to be a seal that the prophet Isaiah may have used to seal documents. (Armstrong Institute of Biblical Archaeology)





What Makes this the Word of God?

- "Scripture repeatedly and consistently testifies of its nature" Ronald Wright, (*They Spoke from God: A Survey of the Old Testament*)
- 2 Timothy 3:16
- Consistently speaks on behalf of God and not man.

What Does the Bible Say About Itself?


- God talks to His people!

 - Moses (Exodus-Numbers)
- "Forthtell"- to tell forth the Word of God
- Hebrew for Prophet is "Roeh" and "Chozeh",

- Inspiration (transmission of the truth)
- Scripture (the record of the truth)
- Illumination (understanding the truth)

Types of Revelation

• General Revelation- recognizes that God has revealed himself generally in His creation (Ps. 1-4; Rom.1-20)

• Special Revelation- God's disclosure of himself in and through Christ and Scripture. (A person led to Christ)

Inspiration

- 2 Timothy 3:16
- Greek word *theopneustos*, this is a compound word that means "God-breathed"
- 2 Peter 1:20-21 scripture from God
- Not sloppy interpretation of the Bible

Jesus and the Old Testament

- Matthew 5:18- The Word of God will be fulfilled in its entirety
- Jesus's teachings reflect the Old Testament
- Jesus referenced the Old Testament

Characteristics of a Divinely Inspired Scripture

- Truthfulness- Moses & David refer to Him as the God of Truth (Deut. 32:4; Ps.31:5)
- Authority- No one greater than God, He swears by himself (Gen. 22:16; Heb. 6:13-18). Think of the centurion in the NT!
 - Jesus is the Word of God in the flesh (John 1)

- Effectiveness- God's Word will not return to us void!
 - Isaiah 55:11.
 - Living & powerful
 Hebrews 4:12

Old Testament Canon

- Greek word "Kanon" which means "reed"
 - reeds were used to measure things and became a standard measurement unit
- After Jesus's resurrection, He reminded the disciples as he appeared to them, that all the events that had happened fulfilled the OT prophesies about Him. (Luke 24:44)


Why are Some Books Canonical While Others Are Not?

- Canonicity- refers to an inherent (belong to or characteristic of) quality
- Not a result of a formal action.
- divinely inspired




Why are Some Books Canonical While Others Are Not?

- Determined by God and not man
- Septuagint- early translation of the Hebrew Old Testament into Greek (before Christ's time on earth)
- Torah- The law (Genesis-Deuteronomy)



Hermeneutics

- This word comes from the Greek verb *hermeneuo*, meaning to interpret.
- It is the science and art of interpretation of communication, verbal or non-verbal, secular or religious.



Components of Hermeneutics

- Purpose for the scripture
- Prerequisites for the interpreter
- Commitment to going to the scriptures
- Basic principles in interpretation
- Recognition of personal issues that could interfere with understanding
- Big Idea: Holy Spirit guides us into all truth and helps us understand as we read!

Rules of Interpretation That We Can Apply

- Respect the Bible's intention- it is God's Word, His message for us!
- Literally- ask God what message He is giving you.
 - figurative language & nonfigurative language
- Grammatically- Pay attention to words in their context
 - Identify parts of speech

Rules of Interpretation That We Can Apply

- Historically- understand the historical context
- Genre- type or genre of literature
- Personal issues- Beware of human opinion vs. revelation/understanding
