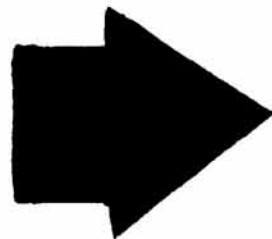

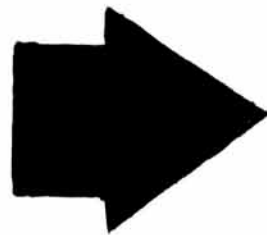

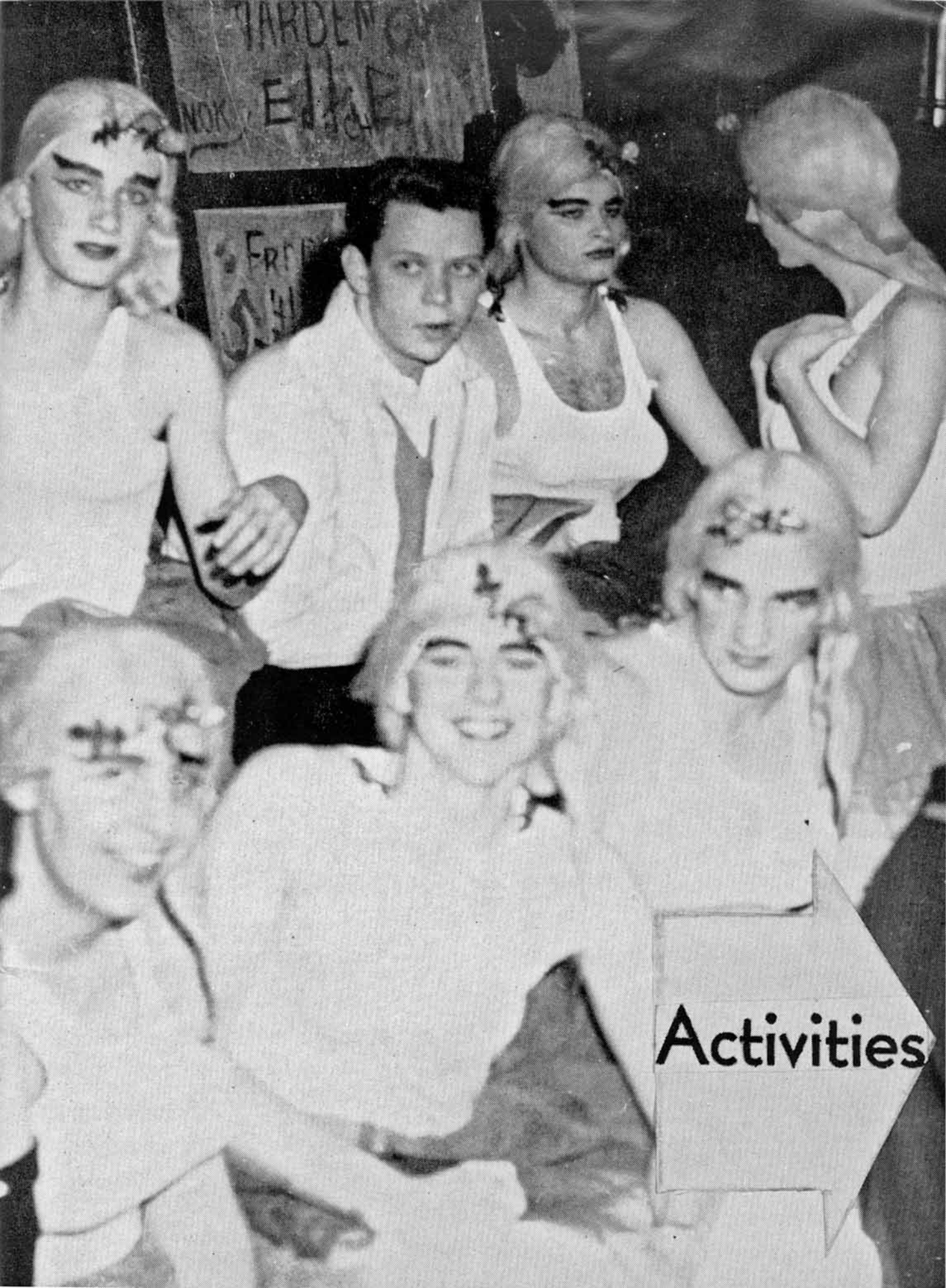

## New Coaches Supervise Pigskin Play

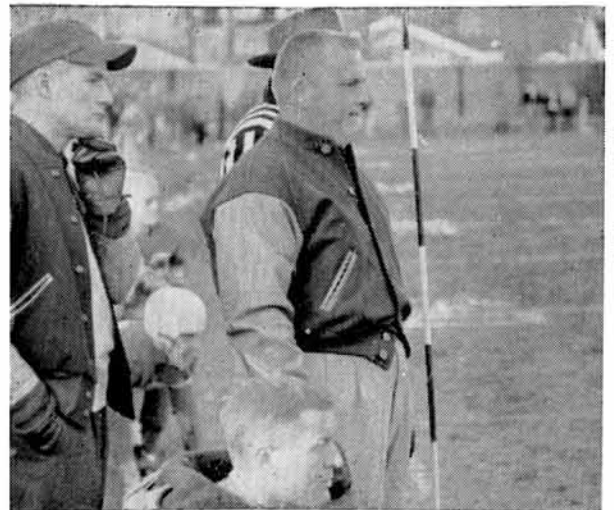
THE 1955 FOOTBALL SQUAD, hampered by graduation losses, injuries, and inexperience, was unable to boast more than a 2 and 7 record this year. The most important thing accomplished by the not too fruitful season, was the nucleus of a very promising grid team for the Bulldogs next year.

This was Coach Bill Russler's first season as head man around Enlow Field. Although his start was slow, it is a sure thing that he'll have his boys at the top of the gridiron ladder before you know it. Big Bill has already promised a defeat for every school that his team bowed to this season.

When August 15 and summer practice rolled around this year the team really looked good. And the Bulldogs looked as though they might be a title threat when they drubbed the Princeton Tigers for their first win 21-7. The backfield, consisting of Jim Bruner, Russ Seiler, Dick Yancey and Chuck Darnell looked fast and shifty. The line with bulls like Hardy Curd, Ray Baker, Mike Talbert and Bill Taylor turned in good jobs, and Coaches Bill Russler and Jim Rausch displayed a great deal of team depth.

THE TEAM AND COACHES think that the season might have been a little different if they hadn't had such tough luck at Boonville. The Pioneers took the 'Dogs 12-0 but the score was certainly no indication of the game.

The most humiliating and surprising defeat handed to the Bulldogs was the Mater Dei contest, a game that figured to be

a battle from the first gun. Led by their fleet backs, the Wildcats obliterated the Bulldog defense, and battered their offense in its tracks to win 42-0. The Bulldog team rebounded the rest of the season with constant determination but never recovered from this game. The student body got to see only one more victory as an inspired bunch of Bulldogs defeated a good Columbus team 21-14. Columbus was added to the Bulldog schedule for the first time, taking the place of Paducah Tilghman.

The next week Bosse traveled to the university town with high hopes, but had them dampened as the Bloomington Panthers downed the Bulldogs 26-7. And in a battle of the Eastside, Bosse gave away numerous scoring opportunities and faded to Memorial's Tigers 6-0. The New Albany game proved to be the best game of the year as a defiant Bosse fought to the final gun but was held to a score of 26-10.

THE CENTRAL AND REITZ GAMES, always the most important contests of the year turned out to be high scoring games with Bosse unfortunately in the 0 margin. A strong Hilltopper eleven displayed fine running and passing attacks to win 42-0. In the Central games, the downtown boys, still hot about their defeat of the previous year, released such personnel as John Goodley, the Pace twins, and Roger Garrett at the Bulldogs who defended their goal well the first half but finally fell apart the last half and lost 39-0.

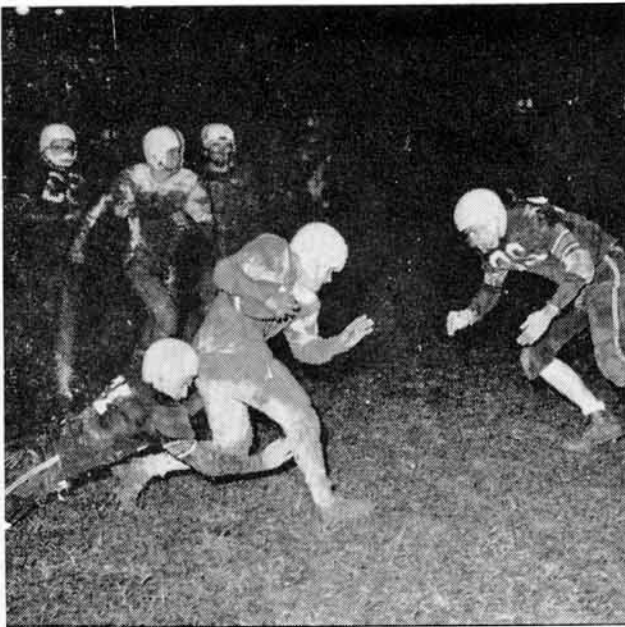
Thus ended a scoreless season for the Bulldogs in city competition, and for the entire season, Bosse could manage to score only 74 points to their opponents' 207.

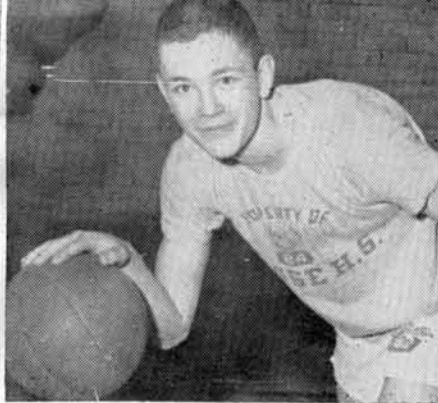

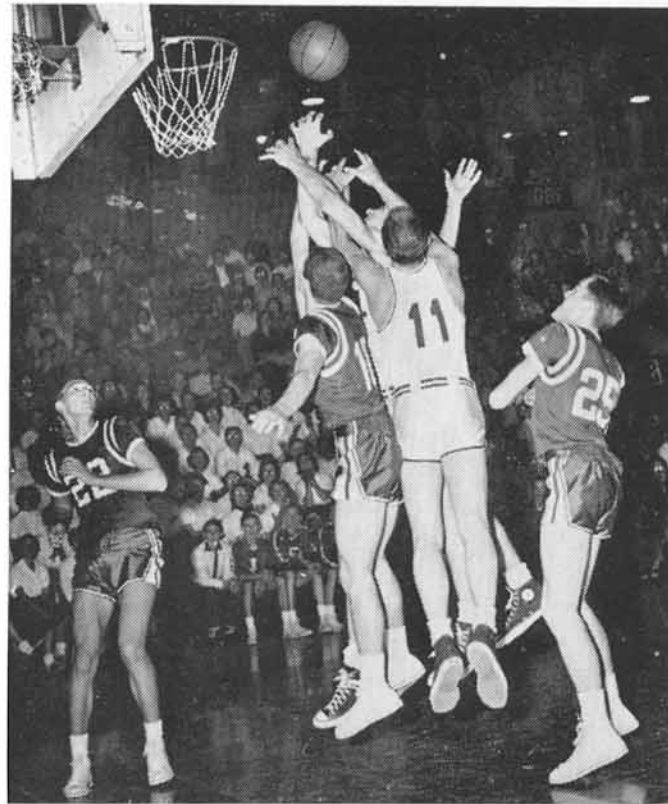
## Netters Have In, Out Season, Win 6 Lose 16

THE BULLDOG basketball crew opened a not too successful season at the court of the Bloomington Panthers, where they dropped a close one 63-61. The next week the 'Dogs were on the road for two days, facing the Happy Hunters of Huntingburg and Columbus. They topped the Hunters 64-53, but lost to Columbus in the last quarter 63-45. The Bulldogs were victorious in their first two home games, dropping the Tell City Marksmen in a close game 51-50 and the Boonville Pioneers 62-51.

The following week the team traveled to Princeton to meet a very fine Tiger crew, which dropped the Bulldogs 67-59. The Central Bears were the first city foe of the Bulldogs. The Bears were victorious 60-45, inflicting the crew's fourth loss of the season against three wins.

Ronnie Englebrecht won the Kiwanis award to close the season.

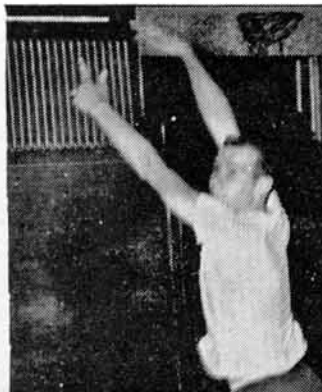

Jasper, the first game on the agenda for the home team, was a place of wet grounds and so this game was cancelled but im-

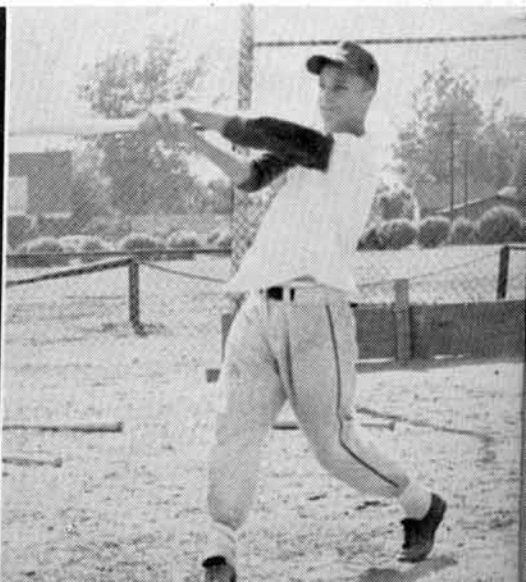

Then, avenging an earlier defeat by the Lincoln squad, Coach Acker's crew roared to their fifth city win against three losses.

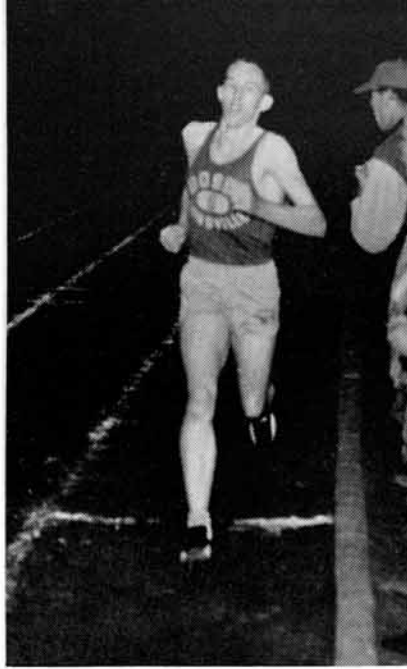

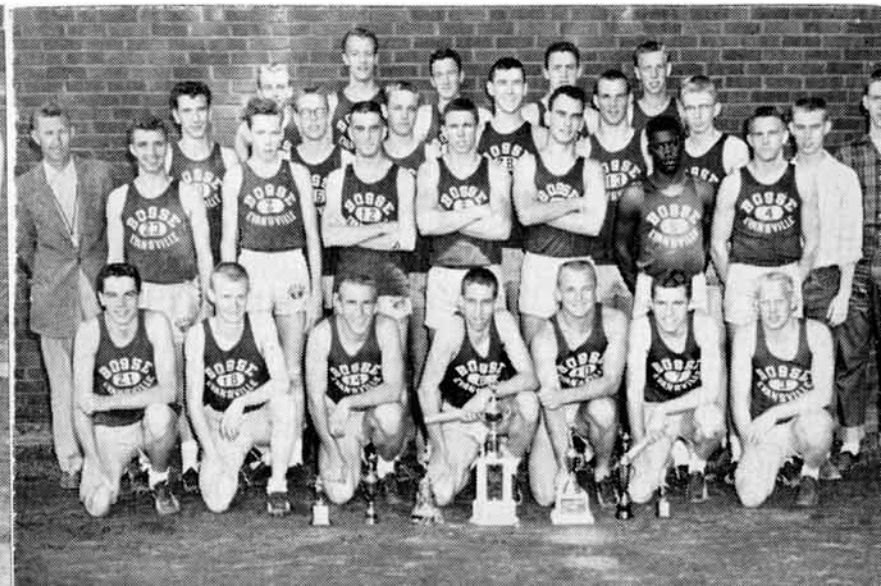

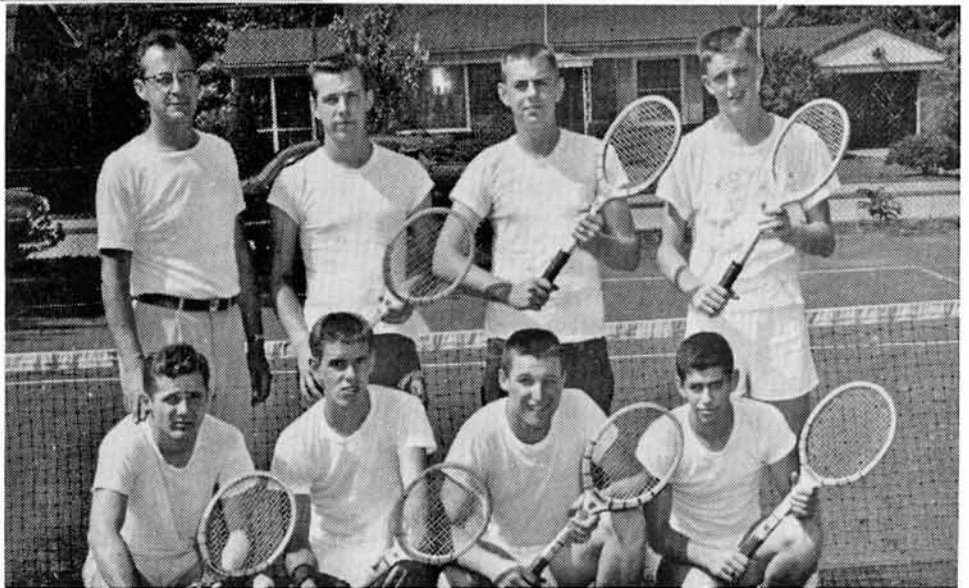

## Golfers Chalk Up SIAC Championship

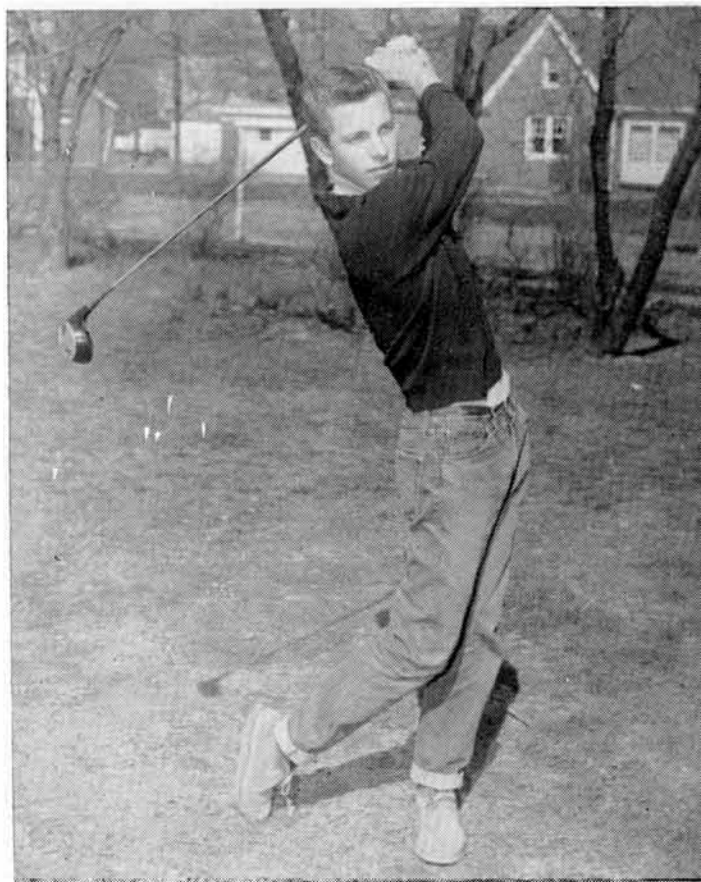

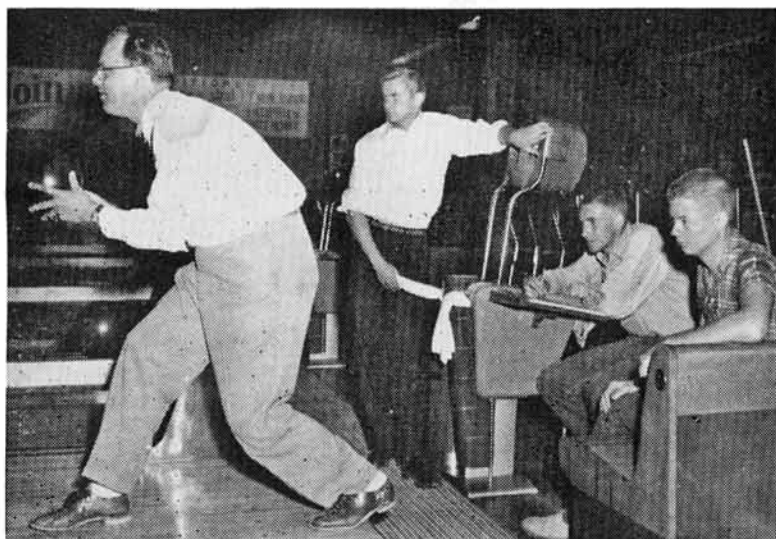

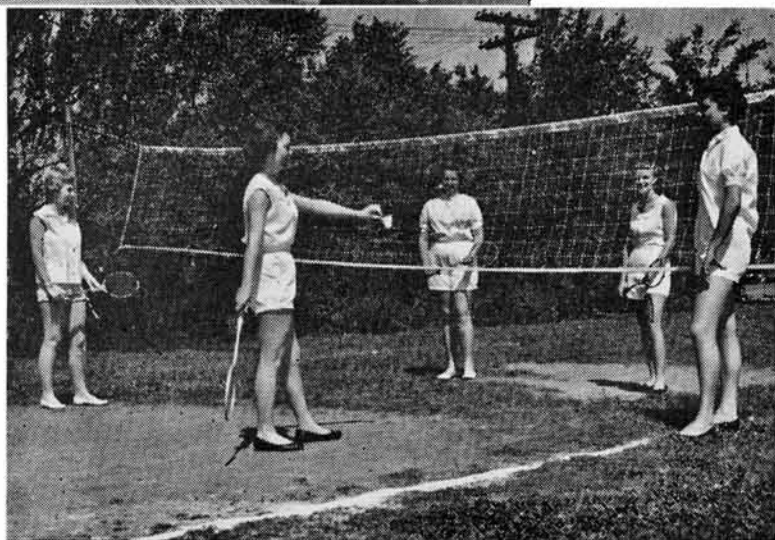


Medalist John Hamilton sends another of his long drives down the fairway.

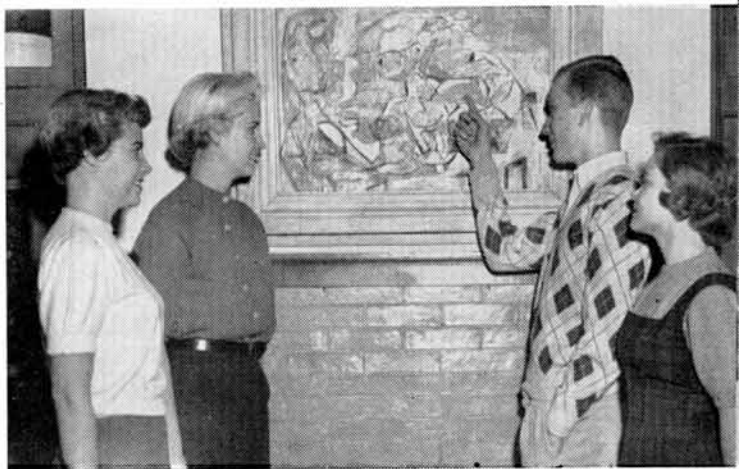

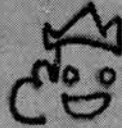

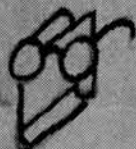
