



A message from Barb

Commit to the LORD whatever you do, and your plans will succeed. In his heart a man plans his course, but the LORD determines his steps. Proverbs 16:3.

We need to keep this verse in our hearts so the Lord will determine our steps. As the council prayerfully works for the congregation, we are excited about the future of Our Saviour's. Gayle Hamann, Mike Kesling (thank you both) and I have been working on Our Saviour's and St. Paul's transition team has been working on their Ministry Site Profile (MSP). This is the document about our congregation and the information that will be published by the Synod as we begin searching for a pastor for our joint parish. The MSP is submitted individually; but both our expectations, preaching desires, lay involvement and commitments are very similar and, I feel, confirms that the Lord's plan is so 3 continued on next page

much bigger than our plan. By His will we are able to work together, have similar goals, and begin a ministry together with a positive attitude and confidence. Mike Kesling joined a meeting at St. Paul's when Pastor Randy Olson from the Synod was reviewing their MSP and contributed to the discussion on part of Our Saviour's. His comment was, "It was a very good meeting and I think we are growing more comfortable together." Thank you, Mike, for representing OS.

Our council has voted on the MSP and it is being sent to the synod for approval and disbursement as they continue the process for us. I ask that you keep the pastor that the Lord is preparing for us in your prayers.

More exciting news is that Pastor Bob Giese has agreed to be our Administrative Interim Pastor. This is not to be the "preaching" pastor in the congregations, but to help all three congregations, Trinity, St. Paul's and Our Saviour's, have Pastors 'in the pulpit', provide pastoral care as needed (or have other Pastors available to help with this), and continue to work with the lay members to keep our congregations strong and active during this time. We are blessed for his commitment to us! Thank you, Bob.

Julie Janke, Heidi Bower, (thank you both) and I along with three members from St. Paul's will make up the Call Committee. This process starts now with prayers and training and continues when there is a candidate or candidates to interview.

Brenda Nernberger, Julie Janke, (thank you both) and I along with three members from St. Paul's will make up the Joint Parish Council. With the Joint agreement to begin in May, we will be meeting to establish worship times, joint services, financial obligations (how we are determining membership), and any other business that arises. Please keep this group in your prayers.

Bishop Laurie's Easter Message

The gospel reading for this Easter is from the book of Matthew. Matthew is the only gospel writer that records an **earth-quake** on Easter morning. The women arrive at the tomb and are greeted by an earthquake, an angel rolling back the stone, and the news that their Lord and Savior wasn't there, JESUS HAD BEEN RAISED FROM THE DEAD. What? The women were filled with shock and fear. The aftershocks of this earthquake are still felt. The $_{\Delta}$

news that death doesn't win and is defeated by the power of God in Christ Jesus continues to shock and amaze us.

What if we imagined Easter not as a lovely spring ritual filled with pastel-colored eggs and candy but as the violent earthquake that it is? Few living in the Midwest have experienced an earthquake. A pastor born in California remembers her mother putting rubber bands on the kitchen cupboard handles so the china dishes wouldn't fall out when there was an earthquake. When has a death of a loved one shaken the foundation of your world? When have you realized how fragile life can be? Christ's resurrection from the dead, his victory over sin, death, and the devil shakes up everything. It is the good news that can even shake us loose from our grief.

What if we experienced Easter as a violent earthquake more like a fresh egg dropped to the floor than one hard-boiled and beautifully decorated? What if the Easter Earthquake shakes us awake, shakes everything out of the cupboards and closets so we are forced to do spring cleaning and decide what to put back and what to throw out? What if we get rid of stuff that doesn't work and give more space to what's important? What is really important? What is God's will for you? What are our Easter priorities?

What if this year the Easter Earthquake cracks open and rolls away the stone from our hearts, shakes loose old ideas, breaks down rock-hard prejudices, and opens us up to new ways to love our neighbor and to share this amazing good news that Jesus lives? What new life might rise up from the rubble? What new relationships might develop? Like a chick struggles to break free of the egg's shell, new beginnings are rarely easy, but they are worth it.

The good news is that Christ's resurrection from the dead and his victory over death is good news even to those who have experienced a literal shifting of tectonic plates beneath the earth. On February 6, 2023, a 7.8 magnitude earthquake hit Turkey and Syria leaving over 50,000 people dead and hundreds of thousands more wounded, displaced, or homeless. More than 10,000 aftershocks have been felt since February 6 leading to more deaths, fear, and trauma. The aftershocks will continue for a long time.

This Easter, in response to the earthquake that opened the tomb and to the good news that Jesus has been raised from the dead, I encourage you to give a gift to the Lutheran Disaster Response to help the victims of the Earthquake in Turkey and Syria. Our Saviour's Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes March 9, 2023

The meeting was called to order by Barb Krug at 6:05 p.m. Present at the meeting were Barb Krug, Mike Kesling, Brenda Nernberger, Nancie Adams, Pastor Bob via Zoom and Gayle Hamann.

Mike Kesling opened the meeting with a prayer. We recited our mission statement together.

The Agenda was approved with a motion by Gayle and a Second by Nancie. Motion Carried.

The February Meeting minutes were approved with a motion by Nancie and a second by Mike. Motion carried.

Parish Secretary's Report – We reviewed a written report in Carol's absence.

Treasurer's Report – Nancie is having problems getting a Church Mutual bill and policy. She will continue to make follow-up calls. Everything else is good. A motion to accept the Treasurer's Report was made by Mike and seconded by Brenda. Motion carried.

Joint Treasurer's Report – There's currently not much activity. Before the end of April, Brenda will have to have a deposit from Our Saviour's to even out the funds. She needs to cut a check to Trinity because they made one more deposit to the Joint account than Our Saviour's did.

Education & Youth- Sunday school was supposed to sing last week, but only two kids showed up. Confirmation is going very well.

Property-Mike and Heidi Bower-Kesling moved risers to their barn to be taken apart. Mike is going to put a railing on the back wall in the sewing room. Two roof drain tubes need attention. Mike is going to pull some big bushes out front since they get in the way when they work on the power. Mike built a shelf unit in the former men's room downstairs for record storage. It will be locked. Mike bought and installed new filters for the furnace. Lawn care is being taken care of by the Cemetery Association.

WELCA-The kitchen cupboards in the basement were scrubbed. Paper products from downstairs were all brought upstairs. The items on the basement table are things people can take. They're discussing getting shelf liner paper. Barb suggested that maybe the Ladies could help with that. Chairs need to be assessed. We don't need to keep all the chairs that are down there. At the Ladies meeting they talked about hiring someone to scrub the walls as a summer project. Nancie is going to take 2 fans home for Rod to clean, and then they will be returned. Barb would like to see the Sunday School area cleaned up a bit too.

Worship- Ash Wednesday service was cancelled due to the weather. Last night the fellowship hall was full. Barb commented that Heidi has done an amazing job with the service. It's short and sweet and includes contemporary music with a meaningful message.

Pulpit fill: Nancy Jones takes care of this for St. Paul's. Pastor Bob will work with Carol Lekies, Nancy Jones and Al Raatz from Trinity, and Barb will step back from this task. Pastor Bob will preach one Sunday a month at each church. He thinks Pastor Nancy will take one Sunday a month as well. Barb and Mike are both willing to preach lay services.

Pastor Bob commented on an ELCA controversy on their Facebook page about the problem with service times being too close together for pastors with multiple congregations. It's too stressful on the Pastors when they have to rush off from one service to get to the next service.

OLD BUSINESS

Ministry Site Profile – We need to set up another committee meeting to work on the Our Saviour's profile. On March 19 Pastor Randy Olson is preaching at St. Paul's. They'll be going over their MSP with him after the service.

Administrative Interim Pastor Contract- All three churches have accepted this contract. Pastor Bob asked if anyone told the synod. Barb said no. Pastor Bob said that he mentioned it to Pastor Randy Olson when he was chatting with him. The 3 presidents and Pastor

Bob need to sign contract. Pastor Bob will get it to the synod.

<u>Synod Assembly</u> – Mike and Heidi have agreed to go. Carol is on the Synod Council and will be attending as well.

<u>Letter from St. Paul's-active/inactive members</u> – Barb will be checking with Val Bach to see if they've had good results from the letter they sent out to their congregation.

It was suggested that we create guidelines for Active vs Inactive Members. After some discussion, it was determined that this is something that would best be handled via the Joint Council so both churches use the same criteria.

NEW BUSINESS

Joint Council: Discussion was held on establishing the Joint Council members from Our Saviour's.

<u>Easter Breakfast</u> – Volunteers are needed to help with this annual event.

<u>Call Committee</u> – Mike made a motion to appoint Barb Krug, Julie Janke and Heidi Bower-Kesling to the call committee. Nancie seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Outdoor Service - Outdoor services will be held on the 2nd Sundays in June, July, and August. Pastor Bob will preach at these.

Pastor Bob's concerns: Pastor Bob asked the Council to consider what we'd like his focus to be for his 3-4 hours attributed to us each week. Barb asked Pastor Bob what his thought is for the focus. He thinks it may be different each month. For example, you can't predict funerals. It will vary which congregation he spends more time on each month depending on pastoral emergencies. His goal will be to see that things get done whether he does them or not.

Pastor Bob and Jo will be leaving for an April 13 wedding in Florida right after Easter services. They'll be returning the following Wednesday or Thursday (4/19 or 4/20). He will find a way to put in his hours. He'll also make sure we have pastoral care during that time.

In order for Pastor Bob to reach out to other pastors for assistance, he asked the Council if we'd be willing to pay the synod rate for emergency pastor care. This rate is \$25/hour plus mileage. This would be paid to a pastor for making hospital visits or visiting the ill at home, etc. The Council agreed to this rate. Each congregation would pay for their own members.

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Nancie and seconded by Brenda. Motion carried. We closed with the Lord's Prayer.
