Pastor Bob Giese Receives Award



On April 29 at the 2023 Synod Assembly, Pastor Bob Giese and Northwood STaR Ministries (NSM) will receive the LEADERSHIP Worry to Wonder Bright Spot award. Making up the Northwood STaR Ministry are First Lutheran of Westboro, First Lutheran of Ogema, First Lutheran of Prentice and Zion Lutheran of Brentwood. They are receiving the award for their support of retired pastors and their movement from worry-"There is a clergy shortage, will we ever find another pastor?"

to" I wonder if God is inviting us to find a new model of leadership for our congregations?" This multi-point parish is recognized for their openness to the creative movement of the Holy Spirit to find new paths for congregations to work together and mentor SAMs and lay leaders

In 2017 Pastor Bob was serving First Lutheran of Ogema and Westboro when the NSM ministry was formed. Pastor Bob was one of the NSM pastors until 2019 when he retired from full-time pastoral work.

In 2021, Bishop Laurie asked Pastor Bob to supervise and mentor Northwoods STaR Ministries, an "experimental ministry team" including two SAMs (Synodical Authorized Ministers) and several lay people who alternate worship leadership. "Technically, I am still in that roll, though they require little help from me at the moment," says Pastor Bob.

In April 2023, Pastor Bob took on the responsibility of being the Administrative Interim Pastor for Our Saviour's, St. Paul's of Medford and Trinity of Unity. He will assist in finding pastors for Sunday worship, serve communion, provide pastoral care as needed and work with lay members to keep our congregations strong and active until the call of a new pastor.

Pastor Bob and his wife, Jo, are members of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church of Holway and live in Ogema, WI.

Our Saviour's Lutheran Church Council Meeting Minutes April 13, 2023

The meeting was called to order by President Barb Krug. Present at the meeting were Brenda Nernberger, Barb Krug, Carol Lekies, Nancie Adams, Mike Kesling and Gayle Hamann.

Barb led us in an opening prayer. We recited our Mission Statement together. The agenda was approved with a motion by Nancie and a Second by Gayle. Motion Carried. The March Meeting minutes were approved with a motion by Brenda and a second by Nancie. Motion carried.

Parish Secretary's Report – We reviewed a written report provided by Carol.

Treasurer's Report – Nancie commented that the insurance increased approximately \$60/month. A motion to accept the Treasurer's Report was made by Gayle and seconded by Mike. Motion carried.

Joint Treasurer's Report-Brenda reported that there were no changes.

Co-Mission Reports

- Education & Youth Brenda informed us there was nothing significant to report. The Sunday school teachers will work on basement clean up after Sunday school and before VBS. Barb remarked that confirmation is going well.
- Property -

Mike has 3 sets of shelves done. Two sets will go in the former basement men's room for storage. (This will now be called the Record's Room). It was recommended that any documents on these shelves be stored in plastic totes. One set of shelves will be used in a basement storage room for holiday decoration storage.

The cement out front was raised. It left a 4-inch ridge, which poses a danger risk. Mike is going to fix that very soon.

Mike will be roping off the front steps for a couple weeks while he works on them.

The first pew in the balcony is broken. Nancie put a warning sign on it. Mike will work on repairing it or replacing it with a pew from the Sunday School area in the basement.

Rod Adams and Carl Cynor fixed the mailbox bracket.

Carol was able to get the dumpster replaced.

Bruce Krug removed the dead tree and stump on the east side of the church.

Ed Rowe will be replacing the signs on E as soon as the weather allows.

Old Business:

Ministry Site Profile-This is done and has been sent in. Pastor Randy is aware that it's been submitted.

<u>Letter from St. Paul's – active/inactive members</u> – We discussed the fact that we need to do a similar letter which asks members to reply whether they consider themselves to be Active members. Follow-up calls will need to be made to those who fail to reply.

<u>Call committee</u> – They will not be meeting until Pastor Randy sets something up. Tony Schumacher from St. Paul's has agreed to be the Chair of the Call Committee.

<u>Gruhlke funeral – June 3rd</u> -Cory Gruhlke passed away. His family asked to have the service here followed by a meal. Pastor Bob Giese will be doing the service.

Janet Williams (family conversation) – Janet Williams recently passed. The Williams family was disappointed because no one from Our Saviour's had visited with Janet for the past couple of years. Barb made an apology to Donna. They have asked for our Pastor to conduct a small memorial service this Spring or Summer.

Theresa and Gary Gretzinger are doing communion for shut ins and are doing a great job. Going forward, we need to be more aware and reach out as a church, but families need to let us know when there is need. We as a congregation can do better. Everyone needs

to be listening and let us know if someone needs attention from the pastor or another church member.

New Business:

Joint Council meeting - Brenda, Julie Janke and Barb are the OS Joint Council members. Gary Jensen, Val Bach, Pastor Bob Giese, and Tony Schumacher were there from St. Paul's. Gary Jensen will be the joint treasurer. St Paul's will need another member for the Joint Council as the Joint Treasurer can't vote.

Worship times were discussed. Beginning on the first Sunday of June worship will be at 8:00 a.m. at Our Saviour's and 9:15 a.m. at St. Paul's. This is because the May pastors were already booked at the old times. These new times may get changed as we go along. The times between services needed to be increased for the benefit of the pastors trying to service both churches. It's also important for Nancy Jones, the pianist, to be able to get from one service to the next on time.

It's hoped that the new pastor will be agreeable to a 45-minute service. Additionally, it was suggested that perhaps the pastor could greet members before the service instead of after.

The Joint Council voted to use the common lectionary because it's the most familiar. That will start on the first Sunday of June as well.

Fifth Sundays were discussed. All joint services will be at 9:00 a.m. The host congregation will oversee the service and activity. The July 30, fifth Sunday service will be held at Our Saviour's and will be outdoors with activities and a potluck meal.

On October 29 the Fifth Sunday service will be held at St. Paul's. That's the same day as the Harvest Day Parade. There will be a joint activity and a potluck meal.

The December 31 service will be an offsite service. There are several venues under consideration. (The Second Sunday services over the summer at Our Saviour's will still be outside.)

St. Paul's is hoping for communion 3 times per month, but they are willing to be flexible.

The Joint Council will meet again in May, but subsequent meetings will likely be every other month.

It was discussed that if St. Paul's and Our Saviour's members begin attending services at each other's churches, using headcount as a means to determine the expense splits will no longer be a good method. It will be important to create an accurate list of active and inactive members.
