A Message from Pastor Bob



Dear members and friends of Our Saviour's/St. Paul's:

Here it is mid-autumn when our thoughts turn to our Thanksgiving celebrations. With that in mind, here is one of my favorite passages about giving thanks.

I Thessalonians 5:18 - "give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in

Christ Jesus for you."

Notice it does not say "give thanks for all circumstances." No, we don't have to be thankful we have cancer or a hip replacement or other traumatic events, though we certainly can be thankful for the miracles of modern medicine which help us to live more productive lives in spite of these problems. But in every situation, we find ourselves we can certainly examine our lives to find the blessings we do have from God even in the midst of our struggles and give thanks for those blessings. In fact, studies have shown those who have positive outlooks and can be thankful for what they do have even in the midst of great struggles fare better in the long term than those who only dwell on their problems without seeing the good things in their lives. So, whatever your circumstances you find yourselves in during this season of thanksgiving, I hope you are able to turn your problems over to God, see the blessings you do have, and give God thanks for those blessings.

With that in mind, I want to turn your attention to my favorite passage from the Old Testament and ordination passage: Micah 6:6-8 "6" With what shall I come before the Lord, and bow myself before God on high? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousands of rivers of oil? Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?" He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?" In my thinking this passage tells us how to best give thanksgiving to God for our blessings. While our words of thanksgiving are important, what their real purpose is is to direct our thoughts outward to the needs around us - in our families, in our church family, in our communities, and in the world.

When we direct our energies (financial, physical, emotional, spiritual) to the people and situations around us where there is need, we are

showing we are truly thankful for what God has given us.

So, as you raise your voices in thanks-giving this Thanksgiving, I urge you to think about how you can demonstrate your thanks-giving tangibly. We often call this "stewardship." How can you be a good steward of the blessings God has given you through your good stewardship of and generosity with your time, talents, and treasures? How will you "do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with your God"?

At the end of my letter, I'll include some of the possible ways you can show your thanksgiving by participation in the life of the congregation. But there are many ways to serve in the community at large, as well. And, every day we are presented with opportunities to "give to show our thanksgiving." Let the Holy Spirit guide you to know how to turn your words of thanks into actions of thanksgiving.

Council Elections 2023-2024

The church council plays a vital role in the vitality of the church. At a recent Synod Council meeting I attended, Bishop Laurie stressed the importance of the council to the congregation. In some cases, churches close not because they lack finances, but because no one wants to take on the responsibility of serving on their councils. Is that going to be the future of Our Saviour's?

The council oversees the life and activities of the congregation, most notably its worship life, to the end that everything is done in accordance with the Word of God and the faith and practice of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America.

The council is made up of the pastor, president, vice president, secretary and treasurer and members of the congregation. At Our Saviour's council terms are I year except for the Treasurer who serves a 3-year term. According to Our Saviour's constitution, members are limited to no more than 4 consecutive terms. Terms begin at the end of the annual meeting. President, vice president, secretary positions are open and will need to be filled at the upcoming annual meeting in December. In addition to the officers, members of the congregation are needed to represent the congregation. Any voting member may be elected, this includes youth that have been confirmed. Can you fill a position?

Barb Krug will not be eligible to hold the president's position as it conflicts with her responsibilities as a SAM. Gayle Hamann, secretary, stepped down due to health reasons. I have been filling her position until a replacement comes forward. Presently there are no members of the congregation serving on the council that are not officers. Prayerfully consider filling a council position. Don't wait for someone to nominate you at the meeting, volunteer now so your name is on the ballot for the annual meeting on December 10.

As the church secretary, I have been attending council meetings for the past 12 years. Meetings are interesting. You learn a lot about the "whole" church from Sunday school to finance to new worship ideas. If you have any questions, Barb Krug, or Pastor Bob, or me, Carol Lekies, secretary.
