

August Council Minutes 8/10/2023

Pastor Bob opened with prayer and our mission statement was recited. Motion was made (Nancie) and seconded (Brenda) to approve the agenda, with a couple of additions. Motion carried.

Motion was made (Mike) and seconded (Nancie) to approve the July Council minutes. Motion carried. No report from parish secretary. The treasurer's report was reviewed. Motion made (Mike) seconded (Brenda) to approve the July Treasurer's report. Motion carried. Brenda reported she will be working with Gary Jensen from SP to get the new joint treasurer's account set up.

Co-Mission Reports

Education & Youth: Sunday school will begin on Sept. 10th when Bibles will be handed out, at the worship service, to the fifth graders and there will be a Blessing of the Backpacks. The teachers met and will be developing their curriculum on a two-year basis with exciting things happening throughout the year. Heide reported on the upcoming Confirmation class that she and Meagan Neitzel have volunteered to teach again this year. Bobbi Marion has also agreed to volunteer when needed. Classes will begin on September 13th. There will be a few changes and some requirements for confirmands to complete before being confirmed on May 5, 2024. The willing donor was thanked for giving VBS class winnings for the ELCA Good Gifts.

Property: The front pew in the balcony needs to be removed due to a crack in it. The pressure washing of the outside walls will be placed on hold until Gordy gives the okay and the water won't wash away the bug spray he's applied. The outdoor signs are constructed and painted (thanks to Ed Rowe) and will be put up as soon as possible. Nancie is following up on the savings we should be receiving for installing LED lights in the fellowship hall. Mike will take care of getting and submitting the water samples required annually. Zenner Plumbing and Heating will check the air conditioner as soon as possible.

WELCA: Honoring the 50th wedding anniversaries will be held on September 10th. A new clothing collection site was discussed. Heidi Bower-Kesling will get that information to Carol. The planning for the anniversary dinner has started.

Worship: Bob is going to try something with the sound system to see if we can attach mixers, etc. for better sound and more usages. Also, to provide a way for the TV to be hooked up. If he can't make this work,

We need a new laptop to hook up to the TV though. Donations toward or for this will be asked for. Bob gave his administrative report. Bob mentioned that sometimes it's difficult for him to complete or fit in home visits due to scheduling with the member or himself. He may teach a class on visitation for lay people, or it may be possible for members to join a ZOOM, SAM meeting in October. He will have more information on this.
