Barb and I would like to have the group take part in the joint Christmas program this year.

Motion carried. Sharon Danielson made a donation of \$2000.00 to the quilting ladies/fund in memory of her mom, Carole Jari. This was very generous and appreciated. A motion was made by Marian and seconded by Juanita to give Karen and Joanne \$200.00 each for the supplies they purchase, that are needed for completing the quilts, mainly flat sheets for the backing on quilts.

Stewardship: Karen reported the ladies have been very busy. There are a lot of quilts packed up. They will go through them soon to sort where they will be donated. Twelve quilts have already been donated to Beds From Christ this year. A discussion followed on the sewing machine the ladies use now and how there is something wrong with it. Karen will look into the purchase of a new or used heavy duty one. Karen and Joanne have made the cloth backpacks needed for the Lutheran World Relief School Kits. The hope is to send at least 60 filled backpacks this year. (Last year we sent about 80 of them. Short from the 100 sent the previous year.) The supply list is in the fellowship hall. Donations welcome!

No old business to discuss.

New business: A motion was made by Heidi and seconded by Echo to donate \$300.00 to Emmanuel Lutheran Church, Longwood in response to the devastating fire that destroyed their church on July 23. Motion carried. Marian will send this.

Heidi has asked if we have any ideas for Service projects that the confirmation students can do to complete their 4 hours (each year of confirmation class) for their Service to God's House requirements. Ideas were discussed. Heidi was happy to let us know that Ava Adams will be assisting with class this year. Heidi also shared that plans are being made to have three elective nights for the students to choose from during the school year. They will need to attend at least two of them and the hope is to have them be at locations other than the church. Ideas are a crafting event, a movie, and a "Stump the Pastor" challenge.

A reminder that there will be an election of officers at our next meeting. Carol, secretary, and Echo, president, have both served two terms and will not be eligible for reelection. Please consider serving this important ministry of Our Saviour's.

We missed the Heart for Luther Park quilt auction/fundraiser which was held on August 4. A motion was made by Barb and seconded by Julie to send \$250.00 as our donation. Motion carried. Marian will

The Anniversary Dinner was discussed at length. This annual event will be held on Sunday, October 13, at the Centennial Community Center in Stetsonville. Amie and Nancie, co-chairs of the event, have things well in hand. The posters will be the same, with only the date needing to be changed. The menu and price will remain the same as last year. It was decided to have only three flavors of pies again for the selection; apple, pumpkin and lemon meringue. Juanita will arrange with the Taylor County Dairy Committee to donate cheese for the dinner. Janet Cypher is working on a quilt for the raffle ticket prize. We will continue with the bucket raffle, country store and bake sale. Gail Hamann and Elaine Hallgren will co-chair the country store and bake sale. Nancie and Amie will organize the bucket raffle but ask Michele Dyer to run it during the dinner.

Other business discussed: We will have a Ladies' Luncheon on Wednesday, November 13, at 11:30 at 64 North. All ladies of Our Saviour's are invited to join us for fellowship and lunch (on your own). The Working Circles of Our Saviour's was discussed. Paula, Echo, Nancie and Barb will get together to restructure these. Perhaps listing all the women of Our Saviour's as well as the younger girls from confirmation up and changing the call process for funeral or other donations needed.

The Community Mission With Jesus sub sandwich sale was discussed. It will be held on Wednesday, August 14. Subs will be assembled at the UCC church beginning at 7:30 a.m. Volunteers are asked to help make this fundraiser a success. Sandwich makers and delivery drivers needed.

No food served after 4:20 p.m. Class will begin promptly at 4:30 p.m. Confirmation students will utilize the upstairs of the church and Sunday School will be in the basement or outside as the Spirit moves them. No students allowed outside during snack or class time without a teacher present. Both groups will join together at 5:20 p.m. for closing scripture reading, prayers and announcements. Parents can pick their children up at 5:30 p.m. and are welcome to join the group at 5:20 p.m. If children need to be picked up earlier, it is asked that the parents communicate that with the teachers. BIBLES will be handed out to the fifth graders on Sunday, September 22, during the 8:00 a.m. worship service. Sunday, December 15, will be the Christmas program for all students.

Lenten services will be held, beginning on Ash Wednesday, March 5, with a light meal (asking the WELCA group to organize) from 5:15 p.m. – 5:40 p.m. Worship service begins at 5:45 p.m. and is usually no longer than a half hour.

May 4 is the Sunday planned for Confirmation at Our Saviour's. Faith Statements completed and interviews will be conducted in April.

Heidi and Meagan plan to meet on August 21 at 4:00 p.m. at the church. Sunday School teachers are welcome to attend.

Sunday School and Confirmation Teacher's Meeting

August 11, 2024

Present: Jason Borman, Heidi Bower-Kesling, Meagan Neitzel, Brenda Nernberger, Barb Krug

Heidi and Meagan have the Confirmation schedule mostly planned out with the exception of the months of March and April (which are Lenten services and will be planned by the students. Heidi and Meagan will deliver the message each week, but the students will conduct the rest of the service.). A student/parent meeting is planned for Wednesday, September 4, at 5:00 p.m. at the church. At least one parent is required to attend with their child. The Confirmation students will ride the bus to church to begin their orientation. Parents arrive at 5:00 p.m. The meeting should take about one-half hour. A letter and meeting agenda will be sent this week. In their planning, they have a couple of "elective" nights for the Confirmation students. The Sunday School kids (regardless of which day they attend class) are invited to join these "elective" nights. Meagan has created a private Facebook page for OS Confirmation families. This will be open to Sunday School families, as well. Parents would need to request to join. That information will be sent in the letter to the families.

Barb provided the Sunday School class lists and the results of the question that was sent out previously to the parents. "If we were to switch Sunday School classes to be on Wednesday night, would you prefer that or would Sunday still be your choice?" Ten families replied that Wednesday night could/would work better for them. Four families replied that Sunday would be their preferred choice. Of the four, one family is out of our school district and would not be able to make it to class on Wednesdays.

Jason and Brenda have graciously offered to teach class on both Wednesdays and Sundays, on the dates class is scheduled, knowing some dates might not work and volunteers would be needed to fill in. They felt there are enough parents that could help out, so the plan is to set up the calendar for classes on Wednesdays and Sundays. The same lesson will be used for the week and for those that can attend both dates, the children would be asked to "help" the others that can only make one class. We truly want the families and children at the Sunday worship service and Sunday School but understand that isn't always possible. We want to offer the additional day of the week to be able to put the Word of God into the children's hands as soon and as
