Message from Barb Krug, SAM

My name was in the heading area where it shows who it is from, but the email was not visible. If you clicked on my name, you would have seen, "ministerBarbKrug@gmail.com. That is not my email and some of you did notice that, for which I am very thankful. Unfortunately, a member did not do that and was scammed and purchased \$400.00 worth of gift cards. There is nothing we, innocent people, can do about that. We can report it, but those scammers, those dishonest people, those greedy people, those people that if they used their talents for good could greatly improve our world, or at least protect some innocent people, are very smart about covering their tracks.

Neither I nor any of our other worship leaders would ever ask you, via email, to give money for an anonymous person.

There are numerous phone scams going on now as well. Do not give out any personal information even if they say it's a company you are associated with. If they are calling you, they should tell you what the information is, not the other way around.

Personally, and more bizarre is that someone had a fake/dark web copy of my driver's license and went into a branch bank in a different city. Showed the ID but of course didn't know the account number. With the fake ID that she/they professionally overlaid her picture over mine, was able to withdraw a large sum of money from our savings. This is not what I needed one week before school starts. The bank had video footage, which we went and looked at. The woman was as cool as a cucumber, talking to the teller as if she were an innocent customer. Law enforcement has been notified and discovered this has happened in the city at different banks, with different IDs. A ring of criminals, again dishonest, greedy people. I'm trying to pray for them but haven't gotten there just yet.

Please, contact all your financial institutions and put a security code on your accounts. Do not let this happen to you. Don't think it won't happen to you. The bank followed their procedure with having the woman show an ID before giving the money. The bank assures us we will get our money back, but we are unsure of the process.

September means school is back in session; (stop for those school buses with amber or red lights flashing), bored children will have something to do (and complain about), Children's sermons, Sunday school and Confirmation classes will resume, and summer is over! Because it was Wild Wednesday, our group got to enjoy Daniel Stokes and his animals, reptiles, and knowledge. The meeting was called to order by Brenda Nernberger, Vice President at 5:01 p.m.

Opening prayer was led by Barb Krug.

Motion to accept agenda was made by Mike, seconded by Kathy. Motion carried.

Reports:

Joint Parish Treasurer

- *Workman's comp quotes: waiting on correspondence with Jerry Carstensen's Insurance Company.
- *Payroll items are getting paid as the 2 congregations are contributing designated amounts into the joint account.
- *Dawn has set up a separate treasurer's email account so any future transition will be seamless.

Both congregations are continuing to fill volunteer positions to assist with the week-to-week needs of the church. Overall, things are going well.

There have been no hits on the ministry site profile for the open pastor position.

Barb and Pastor Bob and Pastor Nancy are still receiving calls from members.

The Northwest Synod has been issued a grant for outreach. Pastor Bob and Pastor Randy will be working with SAMs, mentoring more, visiting within the synod. With 30+ SAMS in our synod, we are a test-pilot for this program, thus receiving the grant. More under new business.

New Business:

Northwest Synod of Wisconsin update: Barb

Barb shared a letter from the Bishop regarding the outreach program. St. Paul's would/could be a host location for a gathering including the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin, Chequamegon Conference, which includes congregations from Marshfield, Stratford, Unity, Edgar, Ogema, and Stanley, for example. The estimate would be 100 participants. Barb will check on dates: Sunday, May 3 or 17 or Sunday, March 22 with times being in the 3:00-7:30 range for a 2 ½ hour program. The group discussed travel time after respective church services and back home as factors to consider when setting up the schedule.

Food, an intergenerational activity and a video will be planned at future Joint Council meetings.

Barb led a discussion on the 'new norm' for congregations as we continue to face the shortage of pastors.

Joint Worship Service Schedule:

June joint service was well attended by both congregations at the Holway ballfield with music/service led by Breaking Chains.

August 31, 2025 - Hosted by St. Paul's at 9:00 a.m.

Worship will be held at St. Paul's Church with a time/talent display in the Fellowship Hall, along with light snacks. It is Labor Day weekend. Kathy and Dawn will contact members of groups within each congregation (choir, bell choir, Men's Group, Women ELCA, quilting, etc.)

St. Paul's council will discuss any other activities at their next meeting.

Joint VBS Program:

VBS was held in July with 30 students/6 helpers, including confirmation students and grandparents. The group traveled to the 180 year old Norwegian Church in Curtiss, noting the old pump organ and gorgeous stained glass windows, as well as no bathrooms! They continued to the Marshfield Zoo, seeing the Wild Wednesday session and breaking into small discussion/touring groups, viewing God's creation around them. On the trail back, they stopped at Good Shepherd Church, only 25 years old, to check out the features of a newer church. It was positive to see the children/youth from St. Paul's and Our Saviour's mixing well due to knowing each other through school. Megan Neitzel has volunteered to coordinate next year's VBS program.

Officers:

With the President position open, a motion was made by Mike for Brenda to serve as President, seconded by Mark, motion passed.

We will leave the vice president position open until St. Paul's fills the opening for a council member to join the Joint Council.

The constitution was checked: members of the Joint Council serve 2 year terms, with a maximum of 2 consecutive terms. Kathy and Brenda are at 2 years and are both willing to serve second terms. Barb will take this back to each council for approval.

Next meeting:

The next meeting was set for Monday, November 17, 2025 at Our Saviour's at 5:00 p.m.

Motion to adjourn:

Motion was made to adjoin by Mike, seconded by Brenda. Motion carried.

The meeting closed at 5:59 pm with Barb's blessing.


