

Academic Policy for Baseball Student-Athletes

At Sports Academy of Wellington (SAW), academic performance is a core pillar of our student-athlete program. As an ILEA-aligned institution, we expect all baseball players to demonstrate responsibility, time management, and academic integrity in every aspect of their learning.

This policy outlines the academic standards for eligibility, including academic progress, minimum performance, accountability for make-up work, and reinstatement procedures. It emphasizes our commitment to academic excellence as a core pillar of our student-athlete program.

Academic Standards for Eligibility

To maintain eligibility for baseball participation, student-athletes must meet the following criteria:

1. Academic Progress:

Students must remain “on target” in their ILEA courses and no more than three (3) days behind in any class.

2. Minimum Performance:

Students must maintain a minimum overall average of 75% or higher in all active courses.

3. Accountability and Catch-Up Expectations:

Any student who falls more than three (3) days behind or has an average below 75% will be required to substitute training time for academic make-up work until they meet eligibility standards.

Students will remain in academic recovery status until all coursework is current and grades are restored to the minimum 75% threshold.

4. Reinstatement:

Once a student has caught up on all required coursework and returned to “on target” status with satisfactory grades, they may rejoin their team for full baseball participation.

At SAW, we believe that excellence on the field begins with excellence in the classroom. Our academic policy is designed to ensure that every student-athlete develops the discipline, focus, and resilience required for long-term success—in academics, athletics, and life.
