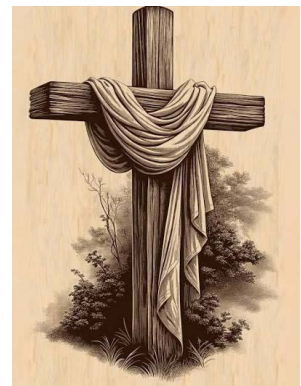
here and they even took his body and who knows what they did. But he is gone- and the tears could not stop.

## ENCHANTED HIGHWAY

World's Largest Metal Sculptures



Geese in Flight is the largest of the sculptures and is registered in the Guinness Book of World Records as the world's largest metal sculpture. The sculpture was started in 1998 and completed in 2002. The cost for labor was \$126,000 and materials \$303,000 for a total cost of \$429,000 to construct and set the Geese in Flight sculpture. The building of this sculpture used a number of individuals; organizations donating their time and services to the project and high school students helped with the welding. One of the biggest challenges was fund raising to pay for the labor and materials. Funds for the project were raised through many avenues, from the National Endowment for the Arts, North Dakota Arts Council, Hettinger County JDA, the city of Dickinson, Stark County Commissioners, Senator Byron Dorgan and several private donations from local community members. With out

this army of supporters this sculpture would not have been completed. THANK YOU to all who were involved in making this project a reality. The sculpture stands 110 feet tall, 154 feet in width and weighs 78.8 ton. The sculpture is painted with car body paint and cost \$7,000 for the paint. There are over 300 lengths of oil well pipe that make the sunburst. The geese and hill landscape took 12 oil well tanks to construct. Two large industrial cranes were used to move set the sculpture in place at a cost of \$40,000. This writer knows and spoke to one of the crane operators and when they did the raising up and setting the Geese in Flight Sculpture there were traumatic moments and it was not a walk in the park. Travelers from all across the country that travel Interstate 94 through Western North Dakota are impressed with the size and construction of the Geese in Flight Sculpture.

My grandpa used to say, "How do you know when a politician is lying? Their lips are moving." Several of you have asked that I take a look at the SAVE America Act (Safeguard American Voter Eligibility Act) and, put in my 2-cents worth. So, what exactly is it? Despite an 83% popularity rating with the American public, in February, the US House of Representatives passed this bill which simply requires national voter ID + proof of US citizenship in order to vote in this country. It is stalled. What is the impetus for this? Gerrymandering! Recall that I wrote about this last August. A 213-year-old "gift" from a Massachusetts governor which is designed to re-draw voting districts based on current "voter" population to give one political party an advantage. Historically, it dilutes the popular vote in favor of one party/another. By failing to provide proof of US citizenship, or an ID that actually identifies a potential voter at the polls, anyone can claim to be eligible to vote and, particularly, in national elections it can have bizarre results since only 24 states (including North Dakota) actually require a valid photo ID at the polls.

favorite, universal mail-in ballot. The talking heads assure us, "there's nothing to see here". Again, I recall Grampa Luther's admonition. So, despite the overwhelming support to have open primaries, take the top 4 vote winners, and even allowing voters to rank candidates in order of preference rather than selecting just one; you know, giving voters more choices instead of party control; the incumbents simply refuse to bring the bill to the floor or, tie up a vote with partisan shenanigans including ballot harvesting and the vote of the dead.

Regardless, the overwhelming majority of Americans support common-sense reform like a current photo ID, proof of citizenship and proof of residence to strengthen election integrity and government accountability. Enough of the party politics and fundraising BS already! Logic dictates that if you have to produce these things to buy booze/tobacco, get a passport, open a bank account, apply for food stamps, Medicaid/Social Security, rent/buy a house/car/hotel room, fly on an airplane, get married, purchase a firearm, get a pet, hunt/fish, pickup your prescription, donate blood, or watch an R-rated movie, voting is more fundamental and, requires proof of citizenship, who you are and where you live. And, when someone tells you that "non-citizen suffrage" (the newly coined double-speak) "improves political function"... they are what? Grandpa? If you ain't a legal citizen, you shouldn't have a say. The ends never justifies the means and, despite this "global community" mantra from progressives, the truth remains—83% of us want voter confirmation not, hot air. Have a great week!

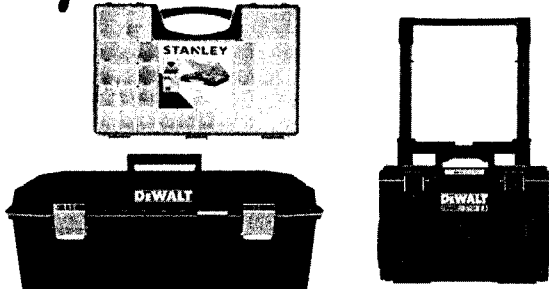

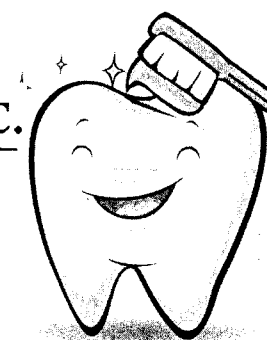

## JMHCC recognized for stroke care

Jacobson Memorial Hospital Care Center (JMHCC) has been awarded for its improvements to rural stroke care.

For efforts to optimize stroke care and eliminate rural health care outcome disparities, JMHCC in Elgin has received the American Heart Association's Get With The Guidelines® - Stroke Rural Recognition Silver Award, improving upon its earlier Bronze Award.

"When it comes to strokes, the importance is first recognizing a stroke, then implementing a plan," says JMHCC PA Morris Duffy. "Making sure we can implement the plan that's recommended for stroke care, we first identify the stroke and treat the patient. If you don't recognize a stroke in a timely fashion, that potentially can lead to permanent deficits, which decreases a person's quality of life. So, ultimately, the sooner we recognize it, the sooner we can treat it and the sooner we can get them back to a better form of them."

"JMHCC has the proper equipment to diagnose a stroke, and the medication on hand to treat a stroke, so we can better care for stroke patients within that timely window of treatment," says JMHCC Administrator Kristin Heid. "This is just one more step we're taking to offer better patient care close to home."

Be aware of stroke symptoms, and call 911 immediately. Stroke symptoms can be reversed in certain instances if treatment is given immediately.

F.A.S.T. is an easy way to remember the sudden signs of a stroke:

- Face drooping
- Arm weakness
- Speech difficulty
- Time to call 911

Beyond F.A.S.T., other symptoms include sudden numbness or weakness of face, arm, leg, especially on one side of the body; sudden confusion or trouble speaking; sudden trouble seeing; sudden dizziness or loss of coordination; and sudden severe headache with no known cause.

The American Heart Association, the world's leading nonprofit organization focused on heart and brain health for all, recognizes the importance

of health care services provided to people living in rural areas by rural hospitals that play a vital role in initiation of timely evidence-based care. For that reason, all rural hospitals participating in Get With The Guidelines - Stroke are eligible to receive award recognition based on a unique methodology focused on early acute stroke performance metrics.

"We are proud that our team at JMHCC is being recognized for the important work we do every day to improve the lives of people in our area who are affected by stroke, giving them the best possible chance of recovery and survival," Heid says. "Rural communities deserve high-quality stroke care. I'm proud of our team for their commitment to stroke care excellence and this achievement."

The award recognizes hospitals for their efforts toward acute stroke care excellence demonstrated by composite score compliance to guideline-directed care for intravenous thrombolytic therapy, timely hospital inter-facility transfer, dysphagia screening, symptom timeline and deficit assessment documentation, emergency medical services communication, brain imaging and stroke expert consultation.

"Patients and health care professionals in JMHCC's service area face unique health care challenges and opportunities," says Karen E. Joynt Maddox, M.D., MPH, co-author on the American Heart Association's presidential advisory on rural health. "JMHCC has furthered this important work to improve care for all Americans, regardless of where they live." JMHCC is a critical access hospital in Elgin, with clinics in Elgin, Glen Ullin and Richardton and a 24/7 emergency department in Elgin.

## North Dakota Facts And Figures



by Rich Wardner

Last week's article focused on the State of North Dakota's contribution to property tax funded services at the local level. A majority of the revenue to fund the local services by the state came from other taxes paid by citizens of North Dakota, such as, income tax, corporate tax, sales tax, motor vehicle excise tax and small portion of oil and gas tax. Three constitutional funds that support local services receive revenue from the **5% Oil and Gas Extraction Tax**. 10% of the Extraction Tax is deposited into the Common Schools Trust Fund, 10% is deposited into the Foundation Aid Stabilization Fund and 20.5% Resources Trust Fund.

1) K-12 education receives funding from the earnings of the **Common Schools Trust Fund** (Endowment Fund) and is currently **appropriating \$595.7 million** this biennium to K-12 school funding. The **Foundation Aid Stabilization Fund** is not an endowment fund and is currently **appropriating \$233.0 million** to K-12 school funding. (The state constitution states that the fund must have a balance of 15% of \$1,741.3 million General Fund funding to K-12 schools.) The total contribution from the two funds to K-12 education is \$828.7 million is 23% of

the state and federal total funding of K-12 schools.

2) Resources Trust Fund revenue (98%) funds water projects across the state of North Dakota. The revenue from the Extraction Tax is estimated at \$354.5 million this biennium plus there is repayment of \$13.0 million and \$16.0 million from investments to make up the amount available this biennium of \$383.5 million. Southwest Water is a major beneficiary of Resources Trust Fund. Southwest Water received an appropriation of \$51.0 million plus a line of credit of \$50.0 million in the 2025-27 biennium. There are a total of 1,700 locations waiting for water hook ups in Southwest North Dakota.

These three funds are negatively impacted by low oil price and declining oil production. The state's oil prices and production were on a downward trend until the Iranian Conflict and the Straits of Hormuz closure, which has caused oil prices to increase, however most feel it is going to be short lived. The Foundation Aid Stabilization and Resources Trust Funds will be greatly impacted if price and production decline. If it were not for the oil and gas tax revenue we would all be drinking brown or poor quality water.

*Expressions of HOPE*  
**Reflections on the Words of Life**  
 by Pastor Paul Ferrie,  
 Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Last time we began a new section of 1 Peter 3 dealing with the believer's suffering. We saw that believers should not suffer deservedly for wrongdoing, but that Christians should expect to suffer in this life. We take up today at verse 14: "But even if you should suffer for righteousness' sake, you are blessed. And do not be afraid of their threats, nor be troubled." The first part of the verse echoes what we have previously seen. Living a godly life of kindness and concern for others might lessen suffering, but will not eliminate it. Even the loving-kindness of believers cannot stop the unbelieving world from hating them. The reason for this is that the hearts of the unbelieving are in rebellion against the Lord, and therefore they are against those who represent Him. Based upon Scripture, we must say that if a believer never experiences any persecution of any kind because of his or her faith, something is wrong. For we are told in 2 Timothy 3:12, "Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution."

In America we do not see Christians burned or beheaded, as happens in many countries, but Christians in our nation are more and more being ostracized and ridiculed. Believers, if we stand on God's Word and proclaim that we are all vile sinners in God's eyes and that we all need the salvation which is only by faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, we will more than likely face some sort of persecution. People are offended when they are told that they are without God and without hope of doing anything to earn His favor. But note that Peter says it is a blessing to suffer for righteousness' sake. There is a passage in Acts 5 which tells of the apostles being imprisoned by the religious authorities. Their "crime" was preaching and teaching others about Jesus. When they were released, we are told in verse 41, "So they departed from the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer shame for His name." The apostles knew that the Lord was using them. They knew that what He had promised about their being persecuted for His name's sake was coming to pass. And they knew that the message of salvation through faith in Christ alone was going forth.

Many a martyr in history has gone to his or her death rejoicing because of the opportunity to make an impact for Christ. They knew that they were not throwing their lives away. They knew the truth of that wonderful statement which martyr Jim Elliot made: "He is no fool who gives what he cannot keep to gain what he cannot lose." No one can keep this earthly life forever. We all must die. But oh, what a blessing to be able to give this earthly life for the beloved Savior who gave His life

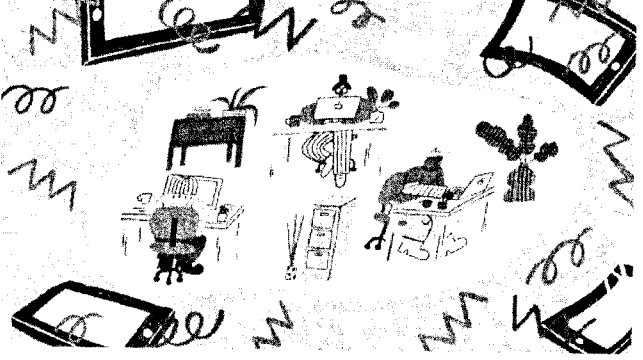

**The Elderly?**

We are often described as "the elderly," yet that gentle phrase conceals a deeper reality: we are among the final living witnesses to a world that has completely disappeared.

At first glance, you may see silver hair, measured steps, or a calm patience shaped by time. But if you truly listen to what we carry within us, you will uncover something far more profound. 

pace. Relationships formed while vinyl records spun and cassette tapes clicked softly. Music framed first dances, late-night conversations, and dreams of the future. 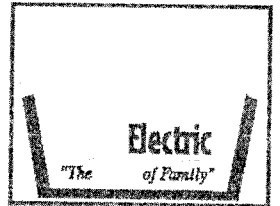

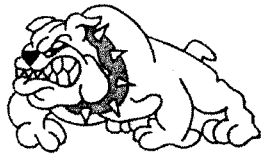

### Three awarded JMHF scholarships

Three students who plan to pursue medical-related careers are the recipients of a Jacobson Memorial Hospital Foundation \$500 scholarship.

Caitlin Martinez, Bree Rivinius and Mykenzie Winkler, all seniors at Grant County High School in Elgin, were each awarded a \$500 scholarship.

"The Foundation was pleased to see these three applicants planning to pursue health care careers," said Foundation President Dennis Rivinius. "We congratulate these scholarship recipients and hope they consider returning to this community someday."

Martinez, the daughter of Sarah and Marvin Martinez, and Rivinius, the daughter of Carey Rivinius and Ryan Rivinius, both plan to pursue nursing careers. Winkler, the daughter of Bridget and Steve Winkler, plans to pursue a career in physical therapy. Applicants were asked to write an essay describing the greatest benefit of having lived in their local community.

Mykenzie shared her experiences in being supported by the community, particularly when the girls basketball team played in the state tournament.

"The biggest benefit of living in a small town is the sense of community," she wrote. "The sense of pride and togetherness from the community we live in is truly a blessing. ... The community we live in makes accom-

plishments possible. ... The biggest benefit of living in a small town is there is always someone in your corner."

Bree pointed to neighbors helping each other during difficult times, community members attending school events and her experiences as a certified nursing assistant at Jacobson Memorial Hospital Care Center.

"What most people don't realize is how big of a blessing it is to grow up surrounded by familiar faces and people who truly care about one another," she wrote.

"Being able to care for people I have known my whole life has shown me just how special rural health care truly is," she wrote. When I walk into a patient's room, I am not just caring for a sick or unable patient, I am caring for someone's parent, grandparent or loved one. ...

Working in a small hospital has also shown me the importance of teamwork and dedication. ... We all share the same goal of providing the best possible care for our community."

Although Caitlin has only lived in Elgin since 2023, she has found a sense of belonging.

"The kindness, support and genuine connection I found here have shaped my experience and helped me grow both personally and academically," she wrote. "Instead of feeling like an outsider, I felt invited into a community where everyone contributes to making the town feel strong and connected."

She pointed to the connec-

tions she found at Grant County High School and the experiences that helped build her confidence.

"The greatest benefit of living in Elgin has been the opportunity to grow within a community that values connection, support and kindness," she wrote.

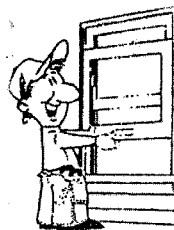

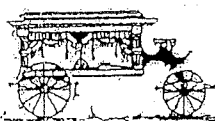

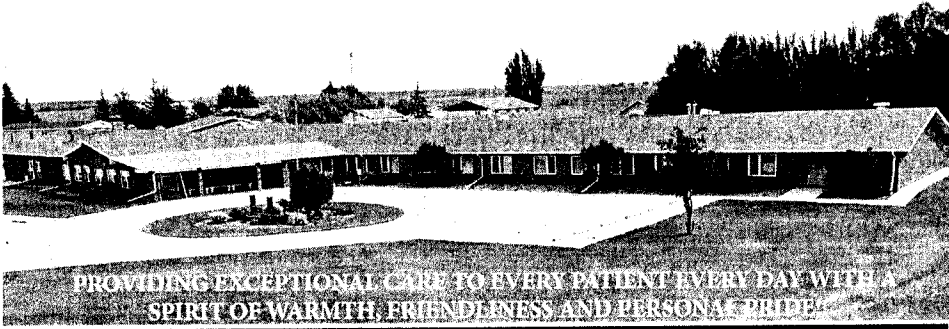
