

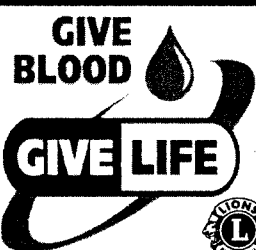

## Reflections on the Words of Life

In 1 Peter 2:1, we went over a list of sins that believers in Christ are told to put away. We can thank God that Peter does not stop at telling us what we must get rid of. He shows us in verse 2 how to get rid of the sins in our lives by revealing what believers are to focus on: "As newborn babes, desire the pure milk of the word, that you may grow thereby." Peter likens the healthy believer to a hungry infant. The way for believers to grow spiritually is analogous to

the way babies grow physically. Just watch a healthy newborn baby, and you might think that all of life consisted in getting his or her next meal. The natural healthy condition of the believer should reflect a similar hunger for spiritual growth. If we saw a newborn baby who was not hungry, we would know that something was wrong. In the same way, if a believer does not find in him or herself a hunger to learn the Word of God and to grow spiritually, it is the sign of an unhealthy soul.

Of course, there are times when the believer becomes dull and cold spiritually, when there is little or no motivation to grow. When that happens, it is time to

realize that we need to expose ourselves to the means of spiritual growth even if we don't feel like it. Our verse tells us that "the pure milk of the word" is what God has given to believers for their spiritual growth. It is no accident that Psalm 119, the longest chapter in the Bible, is primarily about God's Word and its immeasurable benefits. Without the Bible we would not know how the world got here or why we are here. It is God's Word that shows us our sinful state and need for the Savior. It explains how we can have a right relationship with God through faith in Christ alone. It is God's Word that shows us how we are to live as Christians in this world and that our eternal future in heaven will be wonderful beyond imagining. The Bible is the Christian's SOUL FOOD. The Holy Spirit makes the Word understandable to believers and makes it effectual in their hearts and lives.

In a day when Christians seem to be grasping for all

kinds of ways to help them in their lives, it is important that we proclaim the truth that God's Word is sufficient for our spiritual needs. Peter in his second letter tells us, "As His divine power has given to us all things that pertain to life and godliness, through the knowledge of Him who called us by glory and virtue" (2 Peter 1:3). That knowledge of Him is found in the Bible. The idea that the church needs psychology or some type of therapy to supplement the Word of God is a terrible shame. These are ever-changing theories from the minds of man. But the Bible is the unchanging and infallible truth of God who made us and knows what we need. Oh brothers and sisters in Christ, don't let theories of critics and liberal theologians keep you from the infinite wealth of truth and comfort and nourishment for your soul that is there. I encourage you who are believers to constantly expose yourself to the Word of God through reading it on your

own daily and being in a church where you regularly hear it faithfully preached. God's Word will be a lamp to your feet and a light to your path. If you are not a believer in Christ, I encourage you to read God's Word with a desire to learn the way of salva-

tion. The book of John is a great place to start. May we all come to share the view of the words of God found in Psalm 19:10, "More to be desired are they than gold, yea, than much fine gold; sweeter also than honey and the honeycomb."

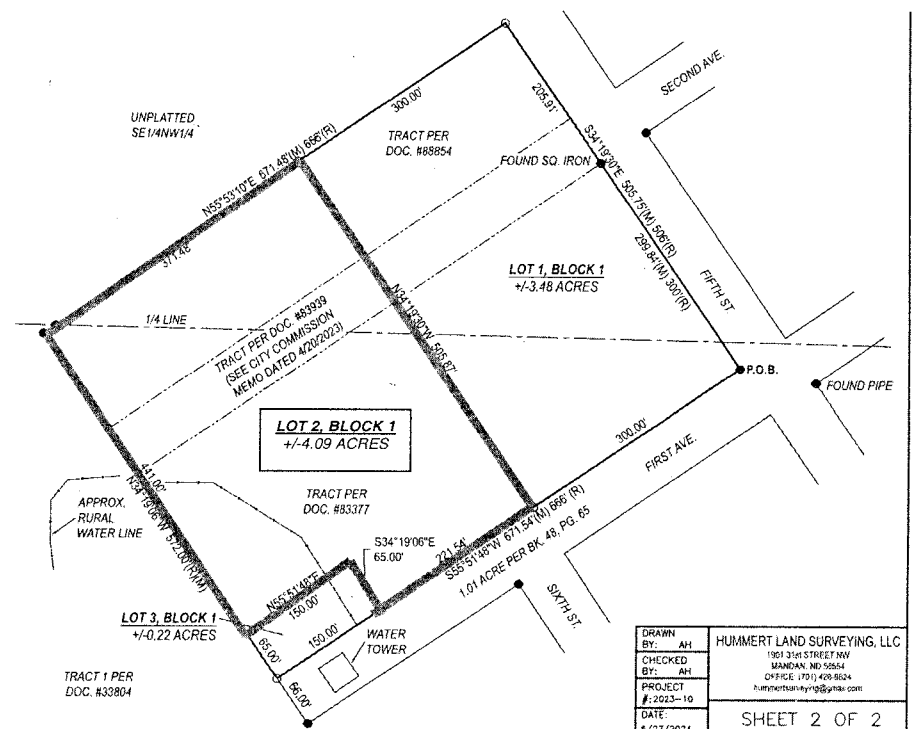

## A Little Birdie Told Me

A Little Birdie Told Me: "Kindness Is The Language Which The Deaf Can Hear & The Blind Can See." Mark Twain)

I keep a lookout for stories that might be of interest to the readers in Eido Country: One source is the North Dakota Living Magazine. On the back cover this month is a full-color ad for the GOD'S CHILD Project.

This caught my eye because in 2012 I traveled to Guatemala with students from Trinity High School in Dickinson and St. Mary's High School in Bismarck. The group included about 30 seniors, 4 priests and 3 female chaperones, just weeks before my 50th birthday I was 20 years older than anyone else in the group.

Our flight took us to Guatemala City; from there we traveled by bus to the "Dreamer Center" which is the operational base for the GOD'S CHILD project in Central America.

We were split up into groups of 4/5 and stayed with host families. My group stayed with a single mother and her daughter. Our sleeping area consisted of two small rooms with two single beds in each room; it was hot and humid with no air conditioning or even a fan. The bathroom was very small and the shower was electric, so if you touched the showerhead you got a shock! I was given in-

stant coffee for breakfast in one of the coffee growing capitals of the world! The priests went so far as to buy a coffee maker and coffee for themselves.

Each morning we met the others at bus stop or walked to the Dream Center for Mass and the plan the day. The bus took us to the base of the mountain where we would be loaded into 6X6 army trucks for our trek up, up some 12,000 feet up. To say these were minimally maintained roads would be generous. Our building materials of cinder blocks, bags of cement, paint and wood had arrived ahead of us, but we had to haul our tools up the last several hundred feet to the village. We had no power tools only hand-saws and hammers.

Our first task was to pour the foundation; we mixed the cement on the ground and carried it in 5 gallon buckets and wheelbarrows to be spread. Next would be the first layer of cinder blocks, each group had a local foreman assisting. He instructed us how to start and left us to our own devices, I had no talent for this and was sure our foundation would fail. Brick by brick we built the walls, left holes for windows and a door. The tin roof followed and finally the famous blue paint.

The final day we brought 8 sets of bunk beds and mattresses, which carried last several hundred feet, this took several trips back and forth. Our last gift to the people was Mass being said outside with villagers and



their dogs. The women of the village kept asking for Rosaries, and by the grace of God I had brought several with me.

The people in the village were so grateful and gracious helping us as much as they could. When they were able to leave their tin huts and move into a 14X14 home with a concrete floor, windows and a door the joy was both theirs and ours. If you've ever considered going on a mission trip, I recommend the GCP, started in 1991 by a native of North Dakota, Patrick Atkinson.

Prevent local measles outbreak with vaccination

As measles cases multiply in the United States, Jacobson Memorial Hospital Care Center (JMHCC) reminds North Dakotans to make sure their family members are vaccinated and to follow precautions.

As Benjamin Franklin said, "An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure."

"Protect yourself and your community from measles by getting vaccinated. Vaccination is the most effective method of preventing measles and is essential for maintaining public health," says Rusette Tesani, assistant director of nursing at JMHCC.

Measles is a highly contagious viral disease that may cause serious complications. Symptoms almost always first include a high fever, runny nose, red watery eyes and cough, followed by a characteristic flat, blotchy rash that starts on the face and neck and progresses down the body. People with measles may also develop tiny white spots inside their mouth.

Because it is highly contagious, patients experiencing measles-like symptoms, especially those who are unvaccinated and have recently traveled, should call the clinic or hospital beforehand, because isolation precautions will be necessary.

As of March 27, 483 confirmed measles cases were reported in 20 different states. Of those, 75% were 19 years old and younger, and 97% were unvaccinated or it was unknown if they were vaccinated.


North Dakota does not have any active cases of measles, but about 91% of school-aged children in North Dakota are fully vaccinated.


Here are key points to consider for measles prevention:

1. Vaccination is the only prevention: The measles, mumps and rubella (MMR) vaccine is safe and effective. Individuals are considered 97% protected by having two doses of the MMR or who are immune due to previous infection. Measles is easily prevented through a two-dose MMR vaccine series, routinely given to children at 12 months of age and a second dose at 4-6 years of age.

JMHCC reminds parents to make sure their children are up-to-date on all immunizations, from babies through teenagers.

2. Herd immunity matters: High vaccination rates protect those who cannot be vaccinated, including infants and individuals with certain medical conditions.



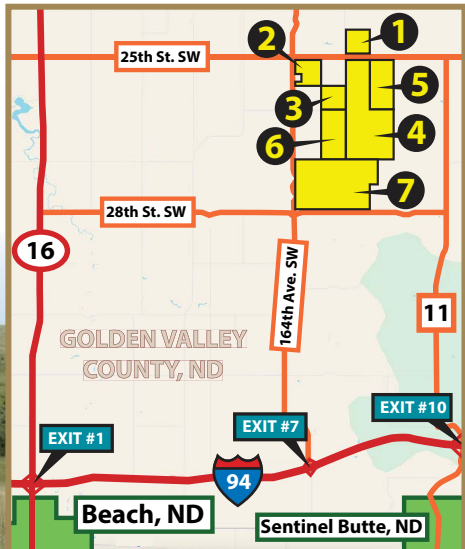

### Floyd Frank Frieze Rites Held

Floyd Frank Frieze, 85, of Mott, North Dakota, passed away peacefully surrounded



by his loving family on April 4, 2025, at Edgewood Memory Care in Mandan, North Dakota.

Funeral Mass for Floyd Frieze was held at 10:00 a.m. Thursday, April 10, 2025 at St. Vincent's Catholic Church, Mott, with Father Chris Kadrmaz celebrating. Burial followed at the North Dakota Veteran's Cemetery in Mandan.

Visitation for Floyd took place from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. Wednesday, April 9, 2025 at St. Vincent's Catholic Church, Mott, with Rosary and Vigil Service taking place at 6:00 p.m.

Floyd F. Frieze was born September 30, 1939 in a farmhouse south of Bentley, ND in Hettinger County to Michael and Elizabeth (Jacob) Frieze. Floyd completed 8 years of school in Walker Township and later received his GED. Floyd's first job was a service attendant at Harry's Friendly Mobile Service station in Mott, ND.

Floyd later joined the National Guard as a LT 1st Class

where he completed basic training at Fort Leonard Wood, MO and later was activated by Kennedy in 1961 for the Berlin Crisis. Floyd's unit was stationed stateside in Fort Riley, KS as part of the 769th Transportation unit hauling troops with M211 and M135 jeeps.

After returning home from service Floyd "Walked the Line" and was united in marriage to the love of his life, his forever sweetheart Arlene Ann Welsch on November 19, 1962, in Lefor, North Dakota at St. Elizabeth Catholic Church. To this holy union the couple fell into a "Burning Ring of Fire" and were blessed with 8 wonderful children: Lyle, Sherry, Mark, Susanne, Marcy, Loren, April and Holly.

In 1962 Floyd managed the West Side Elevator in Mott and went on as an entrepreneur to own several businesses including: Frieze Enco Fuel and Gas, Frieze Exxon Bulk and Propane, and Floyd's Wrecker Service. Floyd was a pioneer establishing the 1st C-Store (building now used at the Mott swimming pool) and 1st liquor store in Mott known as "Floyd's Bottle Shop" in 1981.

In 1977 Floyd pursued the opportunity to farm his father-in-law's land in Stark and Hettinger County. For 15 years he enjoyed the pure and simple joy of working the land with his family through the change of seasons as he grew small grain crops along with the adventure of raising pigs.

In 1985 Floyd founded Frieze Auto Parts, "NAPA" where he worked alongside his son Lyle as manager and Arlene always "Keeping America

Running" by being a dedicated, reliable, hard worker. Always on time to the button and attentive to his customers on his daily "route" putting on 330,000+ miles on his Ford Ranger pickup building long lasting relationships that extended well beyond business hours. Floyd's coin phrase of just "Do the Work" was led by example in all parts of his life. The family business celebrated 40 years just 3 days before his passing.

In addition, Floyd was a member of The Knights of Columbus, and St. Vincent's Church where he served on the Parish Council committee that spearheaded the building of the St Vincent's Parish Rectory. Floyd was also a volunteer member of the Mott Fire Brigade for 30+ years and helped promote the Playhouse Theatre by putting up upcoming movie posters in surrounding communities. He also drove a school bus "route", tended bar or as Floyd would say "Anything to make a buck". It is no wonder Floyd is described by the Community as a Mott icon.

Floyd was extremely welcoming. Always with a pleasant greeting, looking in the eyes and offering a beverage, meal, stick of gum or a tootsie pop. Floyd's incredible gift of empathy could feel anyone's hurt or stress. He would offer a warm smile and crack a one liner especially to those that needed it most. Floyd was social and took time with all people. He always looked at name tags or asked people their names and where they were from. Always offering a soft gentle handshake and a smile, wink or giggle.

Floyd and Arlene together built the Frieze House of Total Chaos. Holidays especially "Good Old Country Christmas" were always celebrated with the entire family gathering with great food, Tom and Jerrys, cards, games, laughter and a visit from Santa.

A lot of time was spent at the lake camping as a family with countless memories of boating, skiing, grilling and campfire stories. In addition, Floyd loved to cook, especially a good pot of "zoup", tinker with tools in his garage, mow lawn, help garden, build bird houses and always have the latest and greatest gadgets as showcased on tv. After a hard day's work Floyd enjoyed relaxing and cracking a cold one on the deck or "the slab" listening to his favorites: Johnny Cash, Loretta Lynn or

Polka Party.

Floyd took great pride in his family. Always there for their holy sacraments, birthdays, graduations, weddings, activities and sporting events with a popcorn in hand cheering on his legacy: "Here we go Cardinals, here we go".

After battling and beating cancer at the age of 83 Floyd's last year plus spent at Edgewood Memory Care proved to be a "Mission" God led him to by his circumstances. Always making the best of any given situation or challenge he became very well liked and known as the "Hall Monitor". ## Thoughts for the Week

A controversial change that has been proposed to go into effect by our new Secretary of Health and Human Services, Robert F Kennedy is to remove all suspect dyes. Not sure why this would be so controversial as these dyes have already been banned or restricted in some countries due to concerns about their potential effects, particularly in children, however they were still allowed in the United States.  
Red 40 is banned in several countries including Norway, German, Denmark, Switzerland, Sweden, France, Austria

and Belgium. The EU requires products containing this dye to include a warning that it may affect attention in children. Yellow 5 is banned in Norway and Finland and being phased out by the EU. Yellow 6 is banned in Norway and being phased out by the EU. Blue 1 is banned in Germany, France and Switzerland. Other dyes like Red 3, Blue 2 and Green 3 are also banned by the EU but have been allowed in the US. So why the controversy? US food manufacturers used natural food dyes until the mid 19th century when they turned to cheaper chemicals that turned food into even brighter colors. So in the interest of making more money, companies changed to synthetic dyes. Not sure about you, but is it really that important if the food loops that you feed to your children are brightly colored rather than a bit duller? Don't think most children will really care as it is not the colors that attract them but the sugar. Maybe it's time to go back to the natural food dyes the way other countries have to save our children!

The food pyramid was introduced by the United States Department of Agriculture in 1992. It was based on a similar pyramid developed in Sweden in the 1970's and was designed to provide a visual representation of the recommended daily servings of different food groups. The USDA replaced the Food Pyramid with MyPlate in 2011 to simplify dietary recommendations and provide a more visual and intuitive guide for healthy eating, emphasizing portion sizes and a variety of foods. The new recommendations make a distinction between whole grain carbohydrates, which are good for you, and the refined white sugar and white flour that are considered bad. Dairy products were also de-emphasised in the old pyramid, but got a prominent place along with grains.

Many people don't realize that the food pyramid was actually retired when federal nutrition messaging was changed to a plate visualization.  
Robert F Kennedy Jr has set his sights on changing how Americans eat and drink. From the dyes in Fruit Loops cereal to seed oils in chicken nuggets, Kennedy has long spoken out against ingredients that he says hurt Americans' health. He is taking on the food industry in an attempt to 'Make America Healthy Again. When listening to him speak, he is passionate about trying to change the way we see food and make healthier choices for ourselves. We have become highly dependent on fast food and quick choices for eating, so maybe it's time to re-think those choices for a better future for us.

As the years have gone by, we have seen some foods regularly eaten declared bad and then later it is conceded that they are not so bad, as it was with the simple egg. Then we were told that fats were bad and that we should seek low fat foods, which resulted in higher calorie counts. Sugar was bad, so they said we needed sugar substitutes, which are now considered harmful and possibly cancer causing. It is a tough world out there to find something that everybody agrees is good for us. Obesity in the country is increasing and is most generally thought to be associated with highly processed foods and a lack of exercise. Who has the answer to this? I guess the bottom line is that you need to be aware of what you eat and how much you eat of it. Not everything is bad, not everything is good, but everything in moderation is probably more the answer, at least that's what I tell myself as I enjoy my ice cream. God Bless you All.
