





Hope

Many of us live our lives in a season of hope. In what, or for what do you hope?

We often express hope as wishful thinking or an expectation that something positive is going to happen: "I hope it won't snow" or "I hope I win the lot-This idea is supported in scripture. However, in the Old Testament, Hebrew words translated as "hope" refer to "waiting with expectation" and also to "trusting and being full of confidence." Often this kind of hope is used in connection with trust in God's saving help.

We recognize trouble and despair and longing in the Psalms - the poetry in the Bible that includes those who are crying out to God in many places and circumstances, and giving God praise.. not only for what God has done, but for what they hope God will do.

Psalm 130 is an example of a Psalm that expresses trust in the Lord, especially in times of trouble. Verse 5 says, "I wait for the LORD, my soul waits, and in God's word I hope;" another translation reads, "With all my heart, I am waiting, Lord, for you! I trust your promises." The Psalmist is waiting with expectation and trust that God will come to the rescue.

On Palm Sunday, Jesus enters Jerusalem with people shouting, "Hosanna! Blessed is

the one who comes in the name of the Lord! Hosanna!" The word Hosanna means "Help" or "Save Us" It is a prayer of hope that Jesus is the one who will save. I don't imagine the events following were exactly what were expected or hoped for. And yet, in waiting, God shows us that Jesus is indeed the one who saves us. Hosanna is a prayer we continue to express today, waiting in expectation and trusting, fully confident that God has saved us and will return to bring us peace. We might not be saved in the ways we might like from the oppression of the world, the bullies, or the trauma. We are saved from our own sinful human nature! We are promised forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation through the life, death, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus our Christ.

In God's Easter promise, we continue to hope. Rather than hoping for things to make our lives better, what if we hope for the things that will help our neighbors to live better lives? And then, we continue in our hope for Jesus to return! We hope for God's saving help to include protection and blessing, and we know God will not always answer our prayers in the ways we might expect. We also know God is faithful. Therefore, we continue to hope, pray, and live Easter lives, knowing Christ is risen! Christ is risen indeed, Alleluia!

Reflections on the Words of Life

Last time we began an introduction to the book of First Peter by considering the first 2 verses: "Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, To the pilgrims of the Dispersion in Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia, elect according to the foreknowledge of God the Father, in sanctification of the Spirit, for obedience and sprinkling of the blood of Jesus Christ: Grace to you and peace be multiplied."

We noted that Peter was writing to believers who were suffering because of their faith in Christ, and what Peter gave in these verses was doctrine. I think that what makes this so striking to us is that much of the church has departed from an emphasis on doctrine. It would probably be rare to enter an average church today and hear the pastor tell the people in this high-tech society which is rampant with unrest and immorality and crime and hatred and war. that what they need most is to know about election and foreknowledge and sanctification of the Spirit and the sprinkling of the blood of Christ. "How irrelevant!" would be a likely response.

So why does Peter start this way? How can he think that writing about these things is going to do the suffering believers any good? Furthermore, how are they going to do twenty-first-century Christians any good? The answer is critical for us to grasp. Peter is showing us that truth is the only anchor for the soul. When the storms of life are blowing and when all the world around us is confused and in turmoil, the believer must know what is true! Paul told the Ephesians that God gave various teachers to the church so that they would not be "tossed to and fro and carried about by every wind of doctrine."

Dear friends, it is truth that we need. It is the truth of God's Word that is going to make sense out of our lives. There is

no way for the believer to understand the suffering that he or she is experiencing without the truth. Peter is going to show Christians that one of the great purposes for their sufferings is their sanctification, mentioned in the opening words of his letter. Sanctification refers to the process of the Holy Spirit making believers more and more like Christ. The Christians to whom Peter wrote may have thought that their suffering was pointless. They may not have been able to see how anything good could have possibly come from it. But Peter comes along and says, "Let me help to put your suffering into perspective. Do you realize that though people around you may hate you and seek to harm you, your heavenly Father is actually making you more like the Lord Jesus through these things?"

Now it is important to remember that as essential as knowledge is, knowledge by itself is not enough. We also need the Holy Spirit of God to use that knowledge to change us and make us more like Jesus. We need to ask God to cause the truth that we learn to transform us. Yet that cannot happen without first getting the knowledge.

There is more to consider about the first two verses of 1 Peter, which, Lord willing, we shall do next time. But I close by reminding us that the most important knowledge we can acquire is how to be made right with God. That knowledge is essential to our eternal well-being. We must know first that we are born in sin and rebellion against our Creator. And our greatest need is to be restored to a right relationship with Him. That can happen only when we place our trust in the complete and perfect payment of Christ on the cross—and that alone—to make us right with God. By faith in Christ, we receive forgiveness of our sins, are made children of God, and are given the gift of eternal life. Friends, have you placed your trust in Christ?



Harry was most gracious and seemed to fit right in here.


As we stood visiting out in front of the station a local farmer on a combine came driving down the street.





Mott CannonBallers Champions at 2nd Annual Spring Jamboree







SOLDIER FOR THE AGES







Eclipse, through the eyes of Lilly Schneider, granddaughter of Ervin and Donnavee Schneider

tronomical event ended a sixyear war between the Medes and the Lydians. According to this Greek history, while battle was raging on their borders, the moon passed directly in front of the sun, causing day to become night. The warring sides paused battle during these moments of darkness and deemed it as a sign from the Heavens that they should resolve their issues and sign a treaty to instill peace. And so, their war ended with this battle now known as the Battle of the Eclipse.

This same astronomical event, an Eclipse, happened over parts of the US again a few days ago. My dad has always said witnessing a Total Eclipse was on his "bucket list," so we chose to make the effort to see it while we have the chance. Coincidentally, my boyfriend is currently working at an Air Force Base along the direct path of totality, so we knew we had to go see it. So Friday at noon, we packed our bags and a sleeping bag into my mom's explorer, and said we aren't stopping until we reach San Antonio, Texas, all the way from Williston, North Dakota.

In 28 hours of being on the road and only stopping for necessities, we made it to San Antonio by 3 pm the following day. This bucket list of my dad's had better be really important to make us sit in a car for more than a day! When the day of the Eclipse rolled around, we didn't

have high hopes of seeing it. all hoped and prayed that we Where would we go? Park on the side of the interstate? We were all cool with that, as long as we got to see it. But despite that, it was also cloudy, and visibility of the sun was only every so often. By some amazing chance, we have cousins near Austin who invited us to join them at a friend's house to witness the Eclipse- now we have a few more friends in our lives.

Joining them at their house just outside Austin, TX was meant to be. We all came prepared with 'Eclipse glasses' which allowed us to stare directly at the sun without going blind. A pretty fancy advancement since poking holes in paper plates. Every so often the sun would peek out from the clouds, and we could lay in the grass and look up at it, slowly watching the moon creep in front of it. We considered ourselves lucky that we even got to see it at all, due to the complete cloud coverage of the skies the whole day prior. So, while listening to songs such as "Moon River" and "Total Eclipse of the Heart," our little group watched as the Eclipse got closer and closer to totality, and the temperature slowly dropped, and the skies slowly became darker. I'm not sure if my goosebumps were from anticipation or the sudden cold.

It was an eerie feeling. I felt as if I was in another world. The clouds kept covering the sun again and again, and we

would be able to witness the Total Eclipse. Minutes later, the clouds seemed to dissipate almost at the exact moment that the moon completely covered the sun, and we were all under an almost complete darkness, save for the hues of pink and purple that were on the horizon all around us. Wow. Dad said, 'if Moses could part the red sea, then he must've parted the clouds so we could see.' It was emotional- I had never seen or experienced anything like it. For three minutes, at 1:30 in the afternoon, it was night. The world became quietno sounds of birds, no sounds from people in the neighborhood, no sounds of traffic. Just us and a great big black hole in the sky surrounded by a glowing, white ring. I wish I could describe what I felt in those three minutes, other than I was in complete awe of what I was witnessing for the first time. We even used binoculars and saw the sun flares, not needing our Eclipse glasses while in totality. Once the moon drifted from its path in front of the sun, light rained down on us again in the snap of a finger, though it gradually returned to afternoon daylight again.

Almost as soon as the clouds left, they returned and covered the sun once again. But- they stayed away for the three most precious minutes of the whole event. All these signs make me believe we were meant to see the Eclipse for a reason. We aren't sure of the reason vet- maybe it'll just justify the 56 hours we spent in a car to go see it.


