This went on for nights - - Mom watching, Dad watching - - taking turns, until - - exhaustion taking over and Molly screaming - -.



Dresses, gloves and bonnets

As I write, it is Holy Week.

Thinking back to childhood I recall holidays and family time.

My sister Ann and I always had a new Easter dress, likely sewn by our mother and by our granny. We always had little white gloves, and Easter bonnets and our annual new pair of patent leather dress shoes.

Fast forward to being a young mother. I sewed matching dresses for my own little girl and myself. Sadly, she didn't want any part of wearing the little bonnet I made to match her dress. Looking back at the photos make me laugh a little now but on the day I didn't see the humor. She screamed every time I tried to put the hat on her for pictures.

When I was a kid we often had picnics and softball games after Easter church service. The gatherings usually included family and our church family. Those are good memories.

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

In our study of 1 Peter 2, we have been looking together at verses 2 and 3: "As newborn babes, desire the pure milk of the word, that you may grow thereby, if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is gracious." Last time we saw that the word 'if' in verse 3 is more accurately translated "since." In other words, the person who is born again has experienced God's special grace. The Bible makes clear that God decided to give this special grace to a chosen people before the foundation of the world. We read in Ephesians 1:4-5, "Just as He chose us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love, having predestined us to adoption as sons by Jesus Christ to Himself, according to the good pleasure of His will."

In 1 Peter 2:3, Peter is referring to Psalm 34:8: "Oh, taste and see that the LORD is good; Blessed is the man who trusts in Him!" The Word for "Lord" which David used in this Psalm is the word Yahweh, the sacred name for the only true God. By applying this word to Jesus, Peter is declaring that Jesus is God. He is saying that when you know the Lord Jesus Christ as personal Savior, you know the One who is God.

If Jesus were not God, then Christianity would be meaningless. But because He is God, to know Him is to taste the goodness and grace of God. In the Old Testament God had promised through the proph-

tocus on 👺 the good

et Isaiah that the One to come and save His people would be "Immanuel," which means "God with us." When the Lord Jesus humbled Himself to come into this world as a baby and live as a true man, it was an act of unprecedented humility. For this was the eternal God becoming man. Why did Jesus thus humble Himself? It was in order that He might become the second representative for mankind. The first representative, Adam, failed miserably. By sinning against God, he plunged the whole human race into sin.

But Jesus Christ came as the second Adam, and He did not fail. He is the only One who has ever lived in perfect obedience to all God's holy law. And He did so with full, loving desire to please the Father. But even more than all this. He laid down His life as a sacrifice for sin. God's grace would never have been able to flow to any of us had not the Lord Jesus dealt with that which was keeping us from God. Our sin was an insurmountable barrier which no person could overcome. It was only by giving Himself as a sacrifice for sin, that the Lord

Jesus could remove the barrier. No other sacrifice would do because the debt of sin was far too great. Only the precious blood of Christ could redeem us from our infinite debt of sin against the holy God.

Peter wants us to see that what Jesus did, He did deliberately because of His love for His people. His loving obedience to the Father was not the whole motivation behind His death. Jesus was driven also by an extraordinary love for those He died for. John 15:13 tells us, "Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down one's life for his friends." And Peter is referring to that incomparable love when he says in verse 3 of chapter 2, "since you have tasted that the Lord is gracious."

For believers in Christ, may Christ's incomparable love motivate us to follow Him with our whole hearts. But if you are not a believer in Christ, please consider that you are missing out on the greatest love of all. Won't you ask Him to enable you to place your trust in Him alone to make you right with God? Then you too will taste that the Lord is

He received the Navy Achievement Medal for his service in Vietnam. He was transferred to Patuxent River, Maryland, where he worked with the Oceanographic Development Squadron. Allen sang in the Navy's Blue Jacket Choir, performing for several church services each Sunday. Eventually the messages he heard penetrat-

ed his heart, and he accepted Jesus Christ as his Savior and Lord.

After four years in the Navy, Allen returned to the farm. He spent many years farming and ranching, working diligently to keep the equipment running and helping many neighbors do the same. He was never afraid to try new and innovative farming practices.

Allen was a social soul and loved meeting and welcoming new people. He joined a square dancing club where he met a single teacher named Jan Delger. After a few months of being square dance partners, they became partners for life. They were married for 46 years and raised four daughters. Allen attended many of the girls' activities and faithfully kept their vehicles running and in good shape.

Allen cared deeply about his community and served as a volunteer or board member for numerous organizations. He was a member of the Assembly of God Church. He served as a Fallon County Commissioner, a supervisor for the Little Beaver Conservation District, and a board member for his church. He was a Boy Scout leader and took his scouts on many adventures, including trips to Pactola Lake and Yellowtail Dam. He dedicated many hours to designing and building a small scout camp on his own land.

My oncologist judged the above results to be positive enough to maintain me on the same treatment regimen as the past several weeks. I get Irinotecan and 5-FU chemo every two weeks; and Keytruda immunotherapy every six weeks.

I continue to endure fatigue and much weakness due to my advanced stomach cancer, treatments, and nausea. coupled with weight loss over these past 9 months. I now weigh about 125 pounds or a bit less, down from 181 pounds healthy weight. I have hardly enough leg strength to stand up from seated in a chair.

Scans are generally to be done at three-month intervals, so my next scan, in mid-July, will mark a milestone of 12 consecutive months on chemotherapy.

Through the winter, I had been seeing my Bismarck oncologist only every six weeks. With winter weather mostly behind us (?), I will see my oncologist in Bismarck every four weeks, and my team in Dickinson every four weeks (chemo every 2 weeks, alternating between Bismarck and Dickinson).

I appreciate your continued prayers on my behalf-especially for my "daily bread" of patience and courage to face
