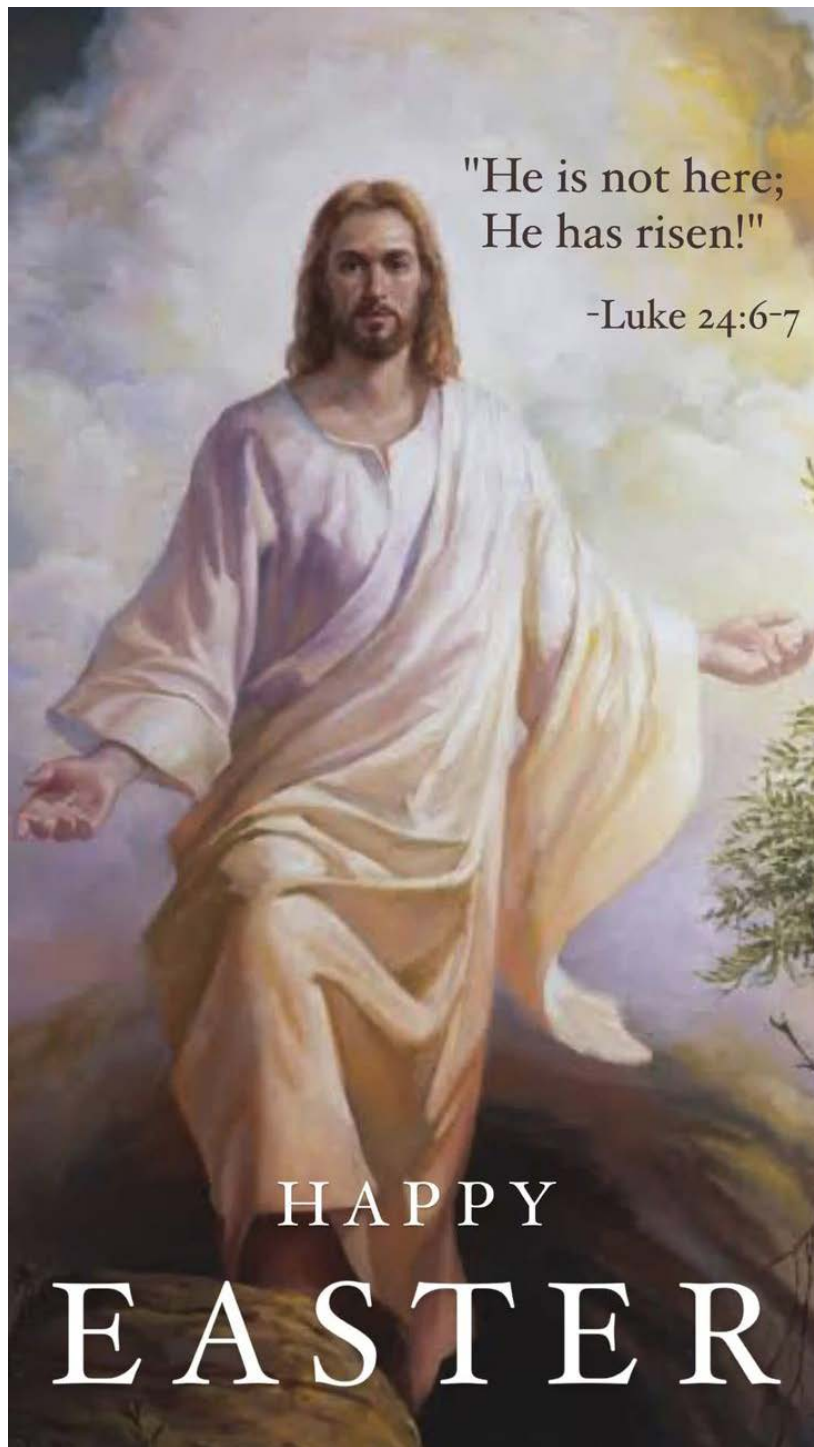

Christ is Risen! He is truly Risen! A happy and blessed Easter to all (even if it may be a few days early). This is truly a joyful time to be alive and celebrate the Goodness of God and His work in the world. As we near this easter celebration, I find myself reflecting on the treasure of Easter and the realness that we remember 2000 years ago.

First, the scripture passage of Matthew 6:21: "For where your treasure is, there also will your heart be." One of the treasures that we have is time. If we look at the Calendar given to us by the church, lets reflect on the time given to Easter. First, a time of 40 days is given to the preparation for Easter called Lent. Within those 40 days, there are 3 days which are used to remember the significant events prior to the Resurrection; Last supper on Holy Thursday, Crucifixion on Good Friday, and laying in the Tomb on Holy Saturday). We then celebrate Easter Sunday and it continues for 8 days during the Octave of Easter Week. Then it continues for another 42 days concluding with the Celebrations of Ascension and Pentecost. What started this year on February 18, ends on May 24, that is 95 days in total! Doing a little math, that is 26% of our yearly calendar between the preparation and cel-

ebration of Easter. A significant amount of time given to one of the greatest events to ever happen and an important part of faith in Jesus Christ.

Second, these events and seasons are a part of the way of life. Lent becomes a time of sacrifice and prayer, doing the usual thing without thinking about it. We attend services on those 3 days because that is what we do. We celebrate Easter Sunday and life goes back to ordinary. How often do we think about the realness of these events and the experiences of Jesus and his followers 2000 years ago. We don't even know what it would be like to watch a crucifixion anymore, especially of someone we are close too. Some have watched people die, but the usual response is along the lines of "they are in a better place." That can only be said because of the grace of God given through Jesus in His Death and Resurrection. It is these very real events that are the roots of our faith in who God is as a Good and Loving God and that we can hope for Eternal Salvation with Him. Thanks be to God for this immense gift that we can celebrate each year and not take for granted.

As I said, a happy and blessed Easter season to all! Let's continue to celebrate the great gift we were and are given through His Resurrection. Such a great gift that we get to celebrate for the next 50 days! Know of my continued prayers.

ENCHANTED HIGHWAY
World's Largest Metal Sculptures



"Deer Crossing" Sculpture was erected in 2002 and took three years to build. It took 8,400 hours at a cost of \$126,000 for labor. The materials cost equaled \$167,000 and the total cost of the project was \$293,000.

The Deer Crossing Sculptures were constructed in Regent and to fit the sculpture through the streets of Regent the buck's front legs and part of the antlers needed to be removed and re-welded on site. The buck is 70 feet tall and 60 feet long and the doe is 50 feet tall and 50 feet long.



The Artist Gary Greff used a design called shadowing. This is removing pieces of metal from the sculpture to accent the muscles and different parts of the deer's body and it also gives the sculpture the effect of being a shadow. Seven oil well tanks were cut apart and then welded back together to form the deer. One of the challenges

of constructing the deer sculptures was when Gary finished welding braces on one side of the sculptures, he had to bring in cranes to lift the sculptures up and flip them to allow welding on the opposite side. A second challenge was transporting the deer sculptures to the site because it covered the width of the highway. The county sheriff escorted the moving of the sculptures 30 miles to the site. The third challenge was when it came time to sand blast and paint the buck and the bucket did not quite reach the top of the 70 foot buck. Gary put a ladder in the bucket and put up against the buck sculpture to reach the top of the buck. You have to be daring to be an artist. Cranes were also used to set the sculptures up and hold them in place while the concrete was poured to secure the sculptures.

Remember when college athletics was about a kid getting a "free" college education by playing a sport he/she loved, particularly, because they came from a poor background and, it was a way out of that poverty thru teamwork? The reality remains that for youth dreaming of playing professional sports, 0.16% (1 in 610) make it to MLB, 0.0096% (1 in 10,399) to the NBA, 0.0077% to the WNBA, and, 1.5% to the NFL (1 in 3,960). So, the reality is that only a miniscule number of humans will actually play professional sports for a living. The carrot for playing college sports was always touted as the free education and chance to better oneself without being forced to join the military or assume monstrous debt. Enter the NCAA and, the "Name, Image & Likeness" fiasco. Or, more appropriately, the local booster-run collectives which now run college athletics and, destroying even a rudimentary concept of "teamwork".

The NCAA always touted that they were the bastion of protecting college sports while raking in untold millions of annual dollars in sponsor endorsements, television revenue and, the other trappings of being an autonomous monopoly with federal trademark and anti-trust exemptions. Players complained that the college and NCAA were making all the money while the majority of Division 1 athletes worked 60 hrs. per week between their school work and on their sport and gained nothing monetarily. Enter *O'Bannon v. NCAA*, 802 F.3d 1049 (9th Cir. 2015) and *NCAA v. Alston*, 594 U.S. 69, 141 S. Ct. 2141, 210 L. Ed. 2d 314 (2021). Essentially, the US Supreme Court ruled on the dozens of student lawsuits, then pending, challenging the fairness of the NCAA's rules and exemptions. In a unanimous decision, the Supremes decided that the NCAA's anti-trust exemptions were waived because the discrepancy of compensation between student athletes versus the coaches and administrators of the NCAA is not a cover for the exploitation of the student athletes for the former's profit. Enter NIL.

On October 17, 2023, only a short time after that ruling, Congress got an earful at its NIL Senate Judiciary Hearing and, it's dragging on. The reality is that sponsors (sports gear) and local boosters have stepped in and, NIL is nothing more than granting the "elite" college athletes (that miniscule percentage who make it to the pros) a multi-million-dollar windfall while their regular, common teammates gain nothing. And, Congress has been contacted because, at the current time, there is no national standard because of the patchwork of more than 30 state laws that currently exist. At the heart of the problem is the "portal" which many claim is just pay-for-play with the athlete using the threat of moving to another school as incentive for the current school to put up or shut up. In some cases, the athlete is milking the current system for up to 6 years by claiming vague respiratory injuries to justify another year of eligibility or NIL payments. And, the boosters are alleged to be more than happy to accommodate. When Coach Saban left Alabama in disgust, people started to pay attention. Can Congress fix it? "I'm from the government and, I'm here to help you?" Have a great week!

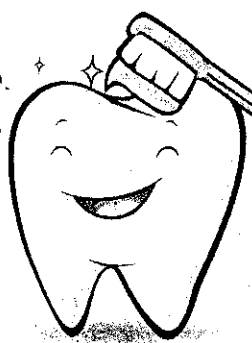

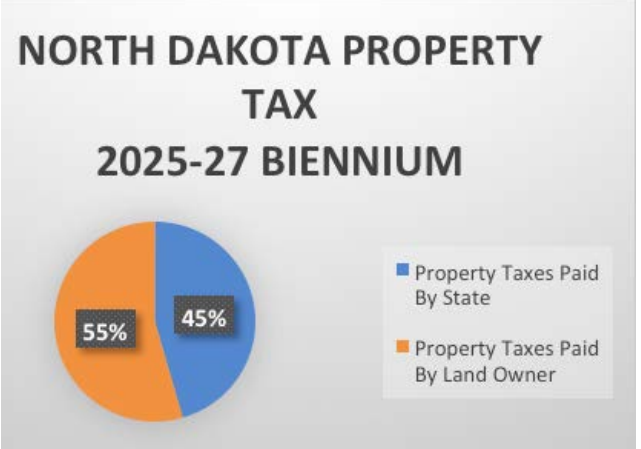

North Dakota Facts And Figures



by Rich Wardner

Taxes, taxes, taxes! No one wants to pay taxes; however, we all want the services and safe roads that are the result of tax revenue. The total property tax bill for all of North Dakota is \$4,800 million (\$4.8 billion) every two years a biennium. Starting in the 2009 legislative session the State of North Dakota started taking over some of the services paid by the local property owners. The amount of relief the state is responsible for today compared to 2007-08 biennium has grown to 45% of all property taxes paid, which equals \$2,160 million (\$2.16 billion) per biennium. This does not include Special Assessments that are levied for infrastructure improvement. The revenue from the Bakken Oil taxes allowed the legislature to assist local political subdivisions with providing services to the people.

The big three property tax areas that the State has taken responsibility for are, 1) K-12 funding of a 115 mill reduction, which today equals \$1,370 million per biennium and this was passed in the 2013 legislative

session, 2) 20 mills reduction for county social services which today equals \$243 million passed in the 2017 legislative session and 3) \$1,600 reduction each year on Primary Residence Property providing tax relief at a cost to the state \$440 million.

Other areas that the State of North Dakota has add and enhanced are Homestead Tax Credit (\$61 million), Disabled Veterans Tax Credit (\$30 million), Clerk of Court Services (\$32 million) and Child Welfare & Disabled Support, Elderly and (\$33 million). In 2007-08 biennium the State of North Dakota funded none of these services and there was no state relief, we the property tax payer funded the services 100%. The point is that we would have fewer services and would be paying higher property tax if the State Legislature had not responded to the needs in our state. Remember all of this funding is listed in the spending column in the state budget and when people say, "The legislature spends like drunken sailors" remind them who is getting a chunk of that spending, we the people.

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We come to a new section in 1 Peter today. The previous verses have dealt with how the believer is to live in various relationships so as to have an impact for Christ. Now Peter switches to the topic of suffering in the believer's life. We should note that there is a definite connection between these two sections. For Christians will be told not to expect the unbelieving world to applaud godly living. Though God often uses the testimony of Christians to attract others to Christ, many in the world strongly oppose godly living. Jesus explained this in John 15:18-19: "If the world hates you, you know that it hated Me before it hated you. If you were of the world, the world would love its own. Yet because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you."

Many Christians are at this very moment experiencing hatred and suffering because of their love for Christ. The atrocities committed against believers are almost unspeakable. And though Christians in America have not yet had to face such things, the day when they will do so may not be far off. Biblical Christianity, which was much more influential in previous generations, is now considered archaic and a hindrance to social progress. Biblical Christianity does not fit well with the message of tolerance of all beliefs and lifestyles, which is now so widely proclaimed.

People in rebellion against God find godly lives of believers in Christ very objectionable. The witness of Christians tends to put a damper on the pursuit of wickedness in which our society is rapidly running. And so Peter, as a wise and loving shepherd of God's people, gives instruction here about how to handle suffering when it comes. The section begins with a question in 1 Peter 3:13: "And who is he who will harm you if you become followers of what is good?" Peter's point here is much the same as that which he made in 1 Peter 2:20: "For what credit is it if, when you are beaten for your faults, you take it patiently? But when you do good and suffer, if you take it patiently, this is commendable before God." His point is simple. The believer should not suffer DESERVEDLY for doing wrong. You can see that Peter still has the believer's testimony in mind. If Christians do not seek to live godly lives that are different from those of the unbelieving world, then the world

will assume that Christianity is meaningless.

When Peter asks who will harm you if you become followers of what is good, he is indicating that the world will love believers, as well as hate them. It is hard to hate people who love and care about you and pray for you and seek your good. And that is just how believers should be, even toward those who oppose them. Jesus carried this point to its highest when He said in Matthew 5:44, "But I say to you, love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray

for those who spitefully use you and persecute you."

This, Christians, should drive us to the Lord. For nothing is so natural to our sinful flesh as desiring to get even. We must abide in Christ and seek grace to enable us to be like Him. Only He can take away the urge for revenge and replace it with love. Christians, it is an immense blessing to have a LIVING Savior, who loves us and hears our prayers. We give thanks for Christ's death on the cross, which accomplished the payment for sin for all who would place their trust in Him. But oh, how wonderful to have a RISEN Savior to whom we can go for each need in our lives. We celebrate His resurrection, which proved that His payment for sin was sufficient. Friends, have you trusted Him as YOUR Savior?

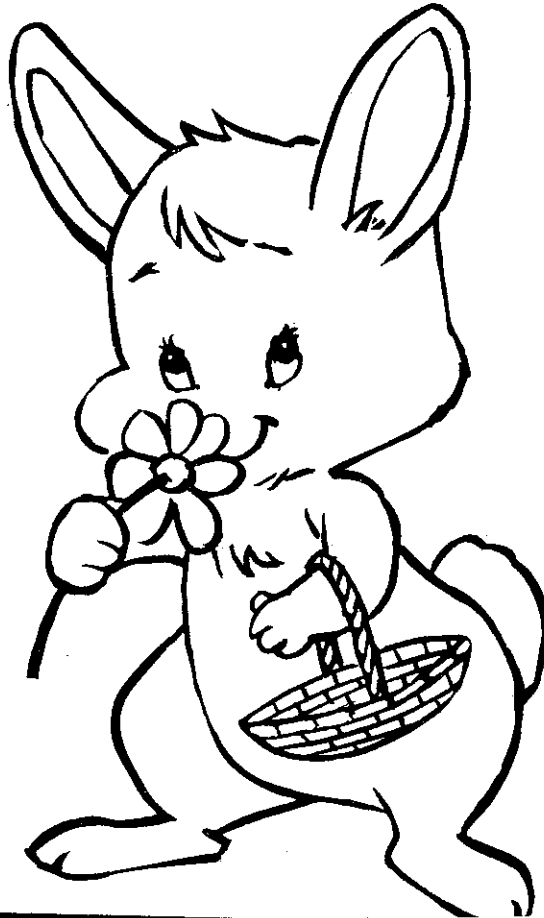

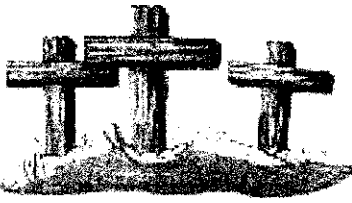
RECIPE OF THE DAY

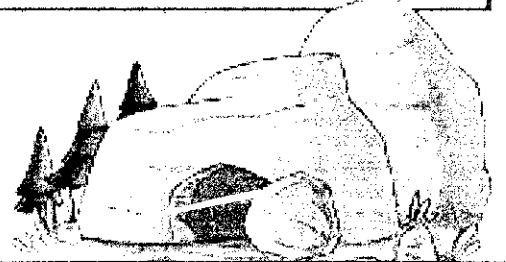
