





RHC offering onsite CNA training in August

Whether it's guiding a patient in a walk down the hall or simply sharing a smile, the CNAs are a valuable part of the team of caregivers at the Rich-

ardton Health Center (RHC). Now, RHC is offering certification to become a CNA onsite in Richardton. Participants complete 80 hours of on-the-job paid training to become a CNA, with classes starting Aug. 15.


To apply for a CNA position and on-the-job training, or for more information, contact Sara Senn or Keary Berger at 974-

RHC currently has openings for full-time or part-time CNAs and encourages high school students or college students interested in a medical career to start their path as a CNA

These positions are eligible for a \$2,000 sign-on bonus. Starting wage is \$19 per hour, which may increase based on experience.

To become a CNA, employees must complete a two-week course, then pass a written test and a skills test. The skills test might entail transferring a patient from a bed to a wheelchair, bathing a patient or brushing someone's teeth. CNAs do not administer medications or shots, but may assist a nurse with basic care.


RHC pays for the training time and test for an employee to become certified, and offers the training and testing onsite, so those being trained no longer have to travel elsewhere. CNAs must recertify with the state every two years, which is often accomplished by simply working a certain number of hours.



Reflections on the Words of Life

In our study of Daniel chapter 6, we saw last week the sinister plot that Daniel's peers came up with to get rid of him. We read in Daniel 6:6-7, "So these governors and satraps thronged before the king, and said thus to him: 'King Darius, live forever! All the governors of the kingdom, the administrators and satraps, the counselors and advisors, have consulted together to establish a royal statute and to make a firm decree. that whoever petitions any god or man for thirty days, except you, O king, shall be cast into the den of lions. Now, O king, establish the decree and sign the writing, so that it cannot be changed, according to the law of the Medes and Persians, which does not alter."

King Darius is about to show himself a fool at this point. Had he been thinking at all, he would have asked what Daniel thought about this plan. Shouldn't the man whom Darius was considering making second in command of the whole kingdom be consulted? But sadly he chooses to go with the majority. And we see here that things have not changed too much. It is a sad reality of our day to see our

aer see the obvious. Though he knew that many of these men were untrustworthy and that Daniel was the one man he could trust, under the influence of flattery, these truths totally escaped him.

Worst of all, Darius was blind to the fact that there is only one true and living God who alone deserves our praise and petitions. He has fallen for the same lie that Satan told Eve regarding the forbidden fruit: "For God knows that in the day you eat of it your eyes will be opened, and you will be like God, knowing good and evil" (Genesis 3:5). Eve believed the father of lies and died spiritually. Darius now believes the same lie-that he too can be like God.

Dear people, let us beware of Satan's devices. How we need God's grace to keep us from falling for his deceitful tactics. The grace which enabled Daniel to stand up under the most severe attacks is available to us through our Lord Jesus Christ. Friend, are you relying on Him alone for salvation? If you see your sinfulness and need for a Savior and turn to Him in faith, He will not only nation going along with what 51% of the people think, whether or not it is right. Even now one state is close to voting on a law that would allow a baby up to 28-days-old to be killed. How many of us could have imagined

that Americans would ever entertain the possibility of legalizing infanticide? Even if 100% of the legislators vote for such an evil law, that will never make it right

While we are saddened by such sinfulness in our land, we should not be surprised. We read in Psalm 2:1-3: "Why do the nations rage, and the people plot a vain thing? The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the LORD and against His Anointed, saying, 'Let us break Their bonds in pieces and cast away Their cords from us." The ungodly always have been and always will be attempting to throw off the rule of Christ and of those who follow His Word.

Note further that these wicked men employed flattery in their appeal to the king. They were pretty good judges of character. They figured that Daniel would not compromise, but they also figured that they could sweep Darius off his feet with an appeal to his pride. Oh, how dangerous is the combination of flattery and a proud heart. This combination always produces blindness. Darius could no lonsave you from eternal wrath, but will also uphold you and carry you safely through the temptations and tribulations that are inevitable in this fallen world.



Partners In Health Club Recommends \$84,500 for Needed Equipment

The Partners In Health Club at West River Health Services Foundation is recommending \$84,500 for needed equipment for West River Health Services and Western Horizons Living Centers at the next WRHS Foundation Board of Directors meeting on Monday, August

22nd. Partners In Health Club originally began in 2002 as a means to create funding for needed medical equipment (beyond the yearly Capital Budget) for residents and patients at West River Health Services and Western Horizons Living Centers. Everything from defibrillators to heated baby blankets to portable ultrasound equipment and more have been provided. 


Cloud Seeding **Operations** Summary for August 1-7, 2022 Bismarck, N.D.



Shadehill West Cabins Now Ready With AED

Bv Ted Üecker A little over a year ago, a lady close to our hearts died in her sleep at the West Cabins area of Shadehill, South Dakota. CPR and mouth to mouth resuscitation were adconcerned neighbors and then, all the way west to the White Butte Road and a few miles north. The Lemmon Ambulance crew continued CPR from there. Plus, they tried four AED shocks. But to no

To hopefully not have this event happen again, about half of the residents (so far) at West Cabins, Shadehill, SD, decided to do something about it. Twenty-eight individuals and families gifted from \$50 to \$100 each, so that an AED (automated external defibrillator), a steel box container and AED sign could be purchased and placed at the West Cabins Shadehill area. It is located on a post just east of the "Honeychuk's" Lake House (huge black building with gold roof, at the end of West Cabin Road), on the West Cabins/Corps Line.

So far, \$2,580 has been raised - well beyond what this AED unit costs. The balance of funds will be utilized for more AED pads, battery replacement and eventually there might be another item that is needed to help save a life? We are open to suggestions. Ted and Sheri Uecker will be cleaning and checking the AED regularly during the spring and summer months, plus storing inside their lake house during the cold winter.

On Saturday, June 25th, Matt Barnes and Nikole Tennant from the Lemmon Ambulance Service, volunteered their expertise to come down to West Cabins for an AED/ CPR brush-up course. With CPR dummies and sample AED machines in hand. Barnes and Tennant gave a terrific 11/2 hour presentation on basic AED and CPR fundamentals. Every person at-

tending practiced their CPR technique and learned about the new AED equipment. Barnes and Tennant also fielded and answered many questions from the 13 participants regarding CPR/AED usage, technique, timing, etc.. Thank you to the "Honeychuks" for allowing us to use their lake home for this AED/ CPH brush-up.

Special thanks to Sheri Uecker for spearheading this important AED Project at West Cabins. Plus, thank you to Shane and Jody Timm for gifting the large rock located at the base of the AED equipment. And thanks to Carl Ebert for engraving this memorial rock with the saying, "Welcome to My Happy place. Love, Betty." 

A Little Birdie **Told Me**

A Little Birdie Told Me: "Every Town has a Story Worth Telling."

The Little Birdie was up early Monday morning and headed east on Highway 21, destination New Leipzig, Carson and Flasher. I arrived in New Leipzig promptly at 9:00 am to meet with Floyd Roehl at the museum. The steel building was originally built by the city to attract potential business to the town: The city also owned the old school and it was also for sale. After about 7 years of trying the school building was sold to MRISAR Institute of Science, Art & Robotics, LLC. Once the school was sold now came the task of cleaning it out, the historic items were moved to the steel building and the museum was born.

The museum uses old grocery store coolers as display cases: the cases are lit and provide protection for the items. Floyd was able to salvage the cases from the dump ground in Dickinson just before they were to be crushed. The cases are now home to an impressive amount of replicas to include: sod houses, farm implements and much more.

The telephone switchboard and phone booth have quite an interesting history. Harry Barnes Provolt and his wife Aline started the New Leipzig Phone Co. in 1915. The phone company was located in their home. The couple would receive messages and hand-deliver them to the residents of New Leipzig for \$.25! The phone booth was added because patrons wanted privacy when making calls.

In about 1935 Harry was struck by lightening and suffered a stroke as a result, their son Victor and his wife took over operations and ran the phone company until 1951 when Bell Telephone came into the area. The independent phone companies were not able to compete with Bell Telephone and soon went out of business.

The loom's history is also related to the Provolt family, following his stroke Harry Provolt spent his days doing embroidery and learned to weave on the loom. The loom lay dormant for many years after his death: until in 1990 when his granddaughter's husband fell from a ladder and sustained a head injury. Hospitalized for 7 months: during his recovery he learned to weave rugs. The old loom was brought back to life, Eugene used to old loom until 2000 when he purchased a newer larger loom that he used until his death.

Which brings me to the mystery item: Floyd had no idea of its purpose. If anyone out there can identify the mystery item Floyd would be very excited to know its use. The gadget was made by the W.M. Welch Scientific Company of Chicago Illinois. I couldn't find the Thing-A-Ma-Bob on the Internet but my guess is some high school science teacher will solve the mystery.




