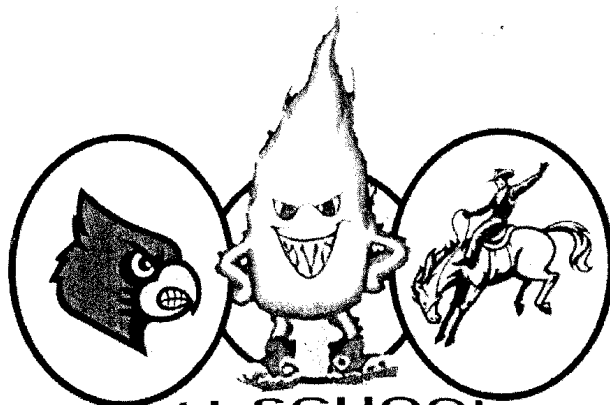

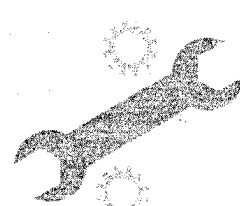

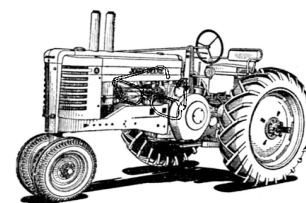

### "Yes, there are Artists Among us!"

Well over a hundred visitors came to the "Artists Among Us" event at the Dakota Buttes Museum in southeast Hettinger, ND, during the Adams County Fair days, July 27 - August 3, 2025.

Reactions to the variety of artistic expressions by local artists Barb Korang, Robin Reynolds, Paul Hendrickson and Brett Patchin through acrylics,

watercolors, clay and camera were highly positive. Visitors' comments ranged from "Beautiful," to "Awesome," to "Didn't have any idea people around here did stuff like this."

People who came to the exhibit were impressed with Reynolds' ability to create everything from large vases, to mugs and pitchers, to tiny, three-dimensional flowers on tiny vases with tiny handles, all from western North Dakota clay. Hendrickson's and Patchin's exhibits drew attendees in as they dis-

covered the uncommon vision of common areas, animals or vehicles, whether a unique view of a favorite horse or vehicle, a pine tree against an electric blue sky, or a detailed still life. Korang's extensive paint mediums were visible in a plethora of wide-ranging, artistic choices from wild flowers on a barbed wire fence post, to fish, to a landscape of a VW bus in a snowfall.

Self-taught, school-educated, and/or being willing to try

something different to "see if it works" seemed to be the pervading factors for these artists who were happy to spend time discussing their work with the friendly crowd.

"They're beautiful," said one visitor. "These works make me appreciate even more the area I live in," said another.

Artists really are among us, as these four locals helped prove once again.

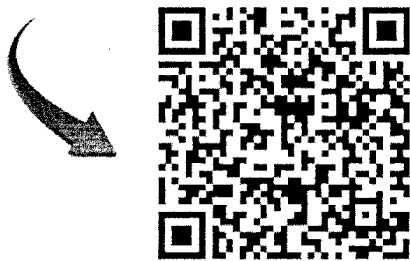

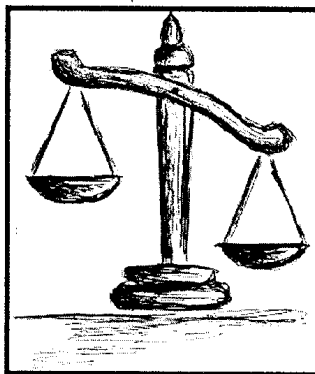

So, what exactly is "gerrymandering"? Now, when I went to school, I was taught in civics class that the term was a gambit pioneered by Massachusetts Governor Elbridge Gerry in 1812 to draw US Senate electoral district boundaries so that his party (liberals) had an advantage over its rivals (conservative 'federalist nationalists') by diluting the voting power of the latter. It would be a form of "progressivism" (manipulation) today. That Governor's 213-year-old ploy actually consolidated the Federalist Party vote (the oldest political party) into a few districts and, thus, gave disproportionate representation to his Democratic-Republicans (a new, liberal party). The outline of one of Gerry's districts was thought to resemble a salamander, hence, satirical cartoonist Elkanah Tisdale's famous animal the "Gerry-mander." So, the historical purpose of "gerrymandering" has always been to grant one party power over another by creating districts that hold dense concentrations of voters who are favorable to their policies.

Gerrymandering has always been designed to affect the outcome of elections by re-drawing election districts, after the federal census, to help the political party in power win more legislative seats which, of course, leads to less competition, more in-fighting, gridlock, and the type of polarized, lack of communication that we have seen since at least since the 1990's. President Barack Obama, himself, even condemned the practice in his final State of the Union address in 2016, called on both the Republican and Democratic parties to end the practice. It simply serves no useful purpose except, as Mel Brooks (playing Governor Lepetomane) quipped in the movie Blazing Saddles, "We have to protect our phoney baloney jobs here, gentlemen! We must do something about this immediately! Immediately! Immediately! Harrumph! Harrumph! Harrumph!"

Although, sometimes, state judges or legislatures monkey around sooner, every 10 years, the Director of the U.S. Census Bureau reports to Congress the results of its Decennial census. This includes population-based reapportionment (among states) of the 435 seats in the House of Representatives based on population. Each state then is supposed to redraw its district boundaries to create roughly equal numbers of constituents for its allotted number of congressional seats. In other words, it is a state law issue says the US Supreme Court. This "re-districting" has always been highly contentious throughout American history. In fact, in other countries, it is accomplished by independent, non-partisan commissions who perform the task. It's time that his "packing" (condensing like-minded voters into smaller districts) or "cracking" (spreading out those voters to dilute their influence) stops! However, we have to agree that Texans running to liberal "sanctuary cities" to avoid during their job is certainly not the answer either in my humble opinion. Have a great week!

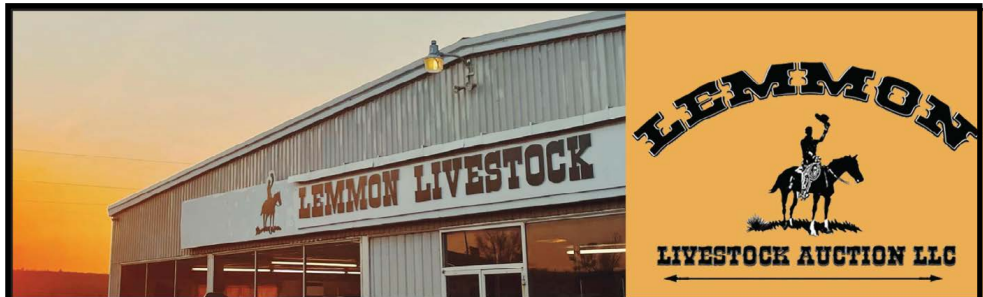
## Cloud Seeding Operations Sum- mary For Aug. 4 - Aug. 10, 2025

BISMARCK, N.D. - Last week, nearly daily occurrences of showers and thunderstorms continued over southwestern North Dakota. Normal high temperatures in the 80s were recorded during the work week and then a cooldown into the 60s and 70s occurred over the weekend due to an upper-level low pressure system.

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, two hail suppression seeding flights and two reposition flights were flown last week. Rain enhancement operations remained suspended.

This week, an upper-level ridge attempts to build over the region, but several weather disturbances undercut the ridge enough to keep chances for showers and thunderstorms going every couple days. High temperatures in the 80s and even low 90s should help mature crops for harvest.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Department of Water Resources' web site at <http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb>. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.



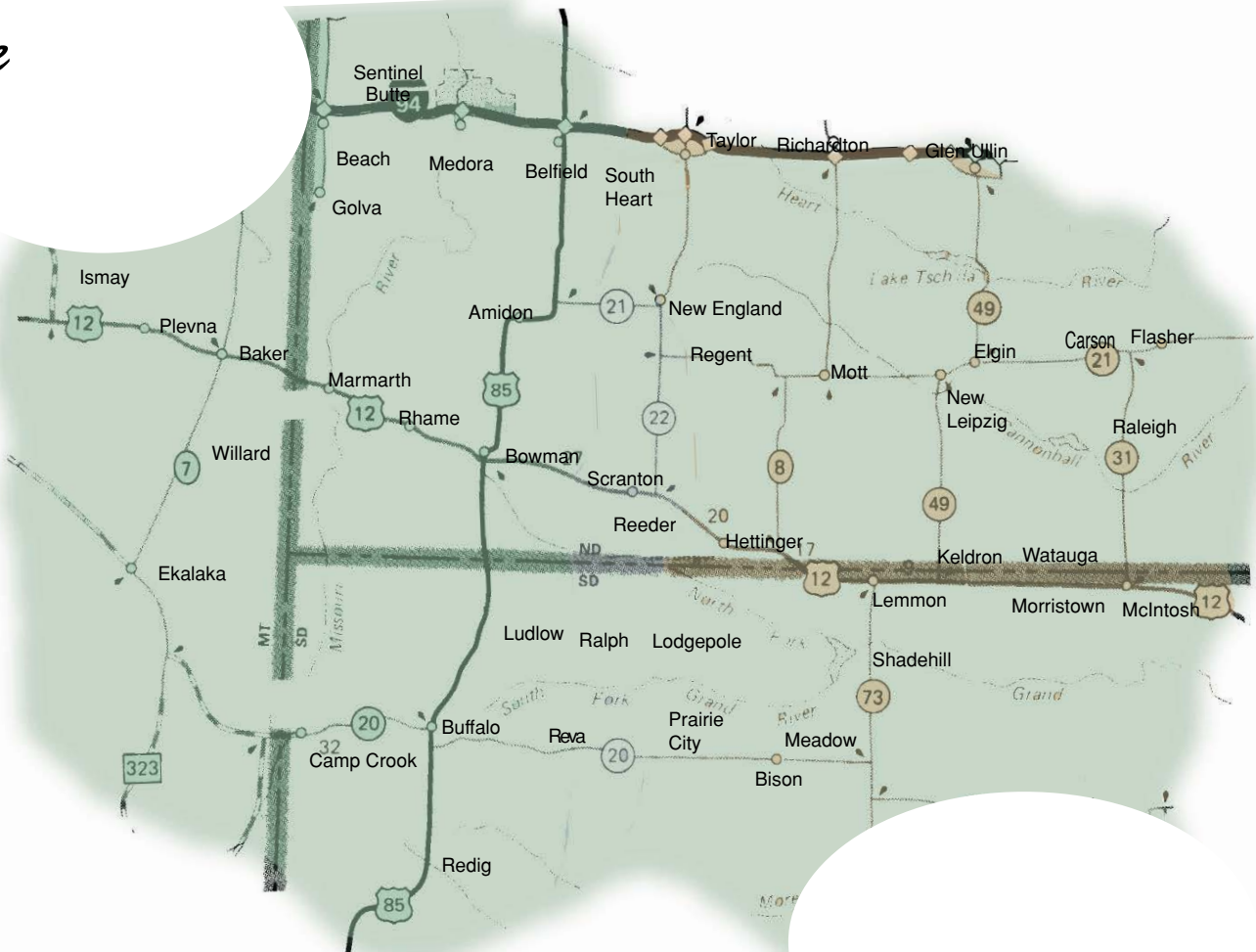

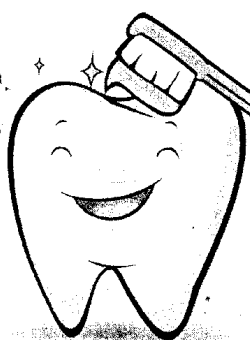

### Reflections on the Words of Life

Last time, we saw the importance of the believer's testimony in 1 Peter 2:12. The believer is influencing others and should live in a way that brings glory to God. Today we come to a new section in 1 Peter 2. In the several verses which follow, Peter gives specific areas of life in which the believer is to seek to glorify God and maintain a strong Christian testimony. This shows us that EVERY part of a believer's life is important.

Verses 13 and 14 bring us to consider the believer's relationship to government: "Therefore submit yourselves to every ordinance of man for the Lord's sake, whether to the king as

supreme, or to governors, as to those who are sent by him for the punishment of evildoers and for the praise of those who do good." In approaching this subject, we need to see that God is the One who has established government. In Romans 13:1, we read, "Let every soul be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God." The Bible makes it clear that God has established government and given authority to those who govern. Interestingly, the Bible does not specify what form government must take. Peter goes on in verse 13 to speak of a king, but he does not mean that the government must be a monarchy. Note that he says "WHETHER to the king as supreme." In verse 14 he says "or to governors." In other words, the issue is not what form a government takes. The issue is that God has established government, and so the believer is obligated to submit.

That brings us to consider the God-designed purpose of government, which can be summarized in two words: punishment and praise. God has given government to mankind to keep order in society by punishing those who do evil and praising those who do good. And what is the believer's responsibility to the government? Peter states it very simply: "submit yourselves." Believers are to be good citizens. When the governing authority tells us to drive the speed limit and wear a seat belt, then we should do so. When we are told to pay taxes, we should do so, even if we do not like the purposes for which our tax dollars are being used.

But are believers ALWAYS to obey? What if we are commanded to do that which directly opposes God's Word? Thank God He has answered that for us in Acts 5. The apostles were being taken into custody a second time for preaching the gospel, after being forbidden to preach anymore in Jesus' name. When the governing authorities asked them why they had continued preaching, they replied in Acts 5:29, "We ought to obey God rather than men."

What we see from this is



that no authority has the right to command anyone under it to disobey God, who is the highest authority. God must always be obeyed. Many Christians have suffered and even been martyred because they obeyed God rather than men. And the day may come when American Christians will find themselves facing persecution for obeying God's Word. There was a time when Biblical viewpoints carried much more weight in our nation than they now do. But that does not change the church's mission at all. The duty of American believers in Christ is to prayerfully seek to spread the message of the gospel. For the gospel—not politics—has the power to change people from the inside out. What our fellow Americans need most is to hear the message that Jesus Christ has come to save sinners. His shed blood can make the vilest sinner clean. And no life, no matter how ruined it may seem, is beyond the reach of God's saving grace through Him. May God's people be given grace to obey Him whatever the cost.

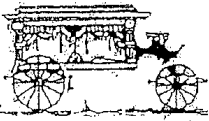

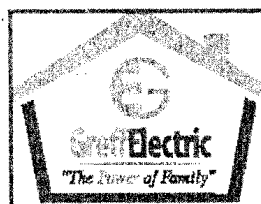
