Cloud Seeding Operations Summary for August 5 - 11, 2024

BISMARCK, N.D. - Below normal high temperatures in the 70s and scattered showers and thunderstorms brought some relief to southwestern North Dakota last week

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, aircraft flew seven flights last week. Two flights were flown for seeding purposes, one flight for reconnaissance, and four flights for aircraft repositioning. Smoke from western U.S wildfires made aircraft flights difficult due to reduced visibilities. Rain enhancement operations were requested by county authorities last week.

High temperatures this week return to near normal readings in the mid 80s as upperlevel ridging occurs. Beginning Tuesday, there will be periodic chances for showers and thunderstorms; however, wet conditions shouldn't have a significant impact on the progress of harvesting crops.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.





Can Going Back To School Cause **Back Pain?**

Students will always have things to carry back and forth between home and school. A backpack is a great way to do that, but if they're too heavy, backpacks can lead to back

Carrying a heavy backpack changes children's posture, walking speed, step length, and more. Unsurprisingly, we also know that as students walk greater distances and become more fatigued, these changes

That can set students up for neck pain, back pain, or other musculoskeletal issues

These changes start to occur when the backpack weighs around 10% of the student's body weight. Experts agree that students should not carry more than 15% of their body weight in a backpack.

Carrying heavy loads apnears common. Most surveys and research show that more than half of students exceed the 15% recommendation.

Parents can't control what their student needs for school. but there are a few ways to help reduce the load and make sure carrying it is as easy as pos-

- 1. Plan ahead Each night, go through the backpack's contents and remove unnecessary items the next day. Likewise, ensure your student doesn't bring things home they won't need that night.
- 2. Use your locker Planning ahead can help remove extra weight between home and school. Using the locker can lighten the load during the school day. Students can avoid carrying extra loads around during the school day by making a

few stops at their lockers.

- 3. Pack right Heavier items should be placed close to the student's back and lighter items further away. This gives students a mechanical advantage when carrying loads.
- 4. Wear it right Using both shoulder straps, and front or hip straps if you have them helps distribute the load evenly. Backpacks should also be worn so the bottom of the pack is even with the bottom of the low back. Packs worn too high or low exaggerate postural changes and can restrict movement.
- 5. Pick your pack If you're shopping for a new backpack, look for one with two straps rather than a single strap. A chest strap and hip belt can help distribute the load. The pack should also be sized appropriately - no longer than the student's torso.

Wouldn't it be a better world if we all put honesty first? That should be the agenda of all candidates.







Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Last week we concluded our study of the introduction to 1 Peter. We have seen some of the amazing blessings that belong to those who are trusting their souls to the saving grace of God through our Lord Jesus Christ. Peter says that believers have been elected by God in His grace and are being sanctified-or made more like Jesus—by the Holy Spirit. They go through this life with a living hope and are looking forward to enjoying their eternal inheritance in heaven. It is no wonder then, that Peter begins verse six saying, "In this you greatly rejoice." "This" refers here to all the blessings previously listed. What Peter is telling us is that the Christian life is one of great joy. This joy is primarily an inward quality. No doubt the believer's inward joy will often lead to outward joy and expressions of praise and gratitude to God. But this joy is something which should always be with the believer, regardless of his or her circumstances. Peter is about to introduce us to the what might be called the main subject of this. epistle. In the very next words of the verse, he is going to begin to address the subject of suffering in the believer's life. But before he does that, he wants us to realize that the believer ALWAYS has reason to be joyful.

One of the things that can so easily happen to Christians is to let the circumstances of our lives become so engrossing that we forget the great things that are true of us in the Lord Je-

sus. Peter has deliberately begun his epistle with a reminder of these glorious truths so that we will not forget them when the circumstances of life suddenly take a turn and become hard. Believers in Christ, let us not forget where our joy is to come from. Paul describes this in Romans 15:13: "Now may the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit." Our joy and peace as believers come from focusing our thoughts upon and believing the great promises from God our Father. These things become the anchor for the soul because nothing can take them away. There is nothing which is so likely to steal away our joy as sufferings and trials. Peter, as a good shepherd of souls, realizes this. And no sooner has he told us of the great rejoicing we as believers have in the marvelous truths of our salvation, that he turns to the subject of suffering in the believer's life. Lord willing, we shall delve into that next time.

In closing, let me remind us that unbelievers cannot possess true joy, peace, and comfort in the midst of trials and suffering. As Romans 15:13, quoted above, explains, these blessings come through the Holy Spirit, who lives inside every believer. Friends, if you have never placed your trust in the Lord Jesus Christ alone to make you right with God, please do so. A relationship with God through Christ provides joy, peace, and comfort in this life, in spite of trials and suffering, and it guarantees a wonderful eternity with Christ in heaven, where there will be no more suffering or sor-

Again, on social media, there was a published article that drew my attention as in the 'what were they thinking' category. The article delt with

someone who had gone out to have a nice dinner, which totaled \$85. They left a tip of \$10 which was what they considered was fair for the service. The conflict came in when the waiter staff picked up the tip and while they were still present, began to berate them for leaving

a tip that 'was less than' what they should have left. The lady leaving the tip, also got upset and in retaliation of being told that she was 'out of touch' and 'cheap' proceeded to pick up the tip and eventually after the intervention of the management, left the premises. The person waiting on her then ended up with a repremand from the employer regarding their attitude and worst of all, got nothing in a tip.

If you have never been in a job where you depended upon tips to make your living, you may not realize that there is a provision in some states, ND being one of them, called a restaurant wage in which an employer can pay less than minimum wage and then uses the tips that the employees get to supplement their pay to equal minimum wage. Personally, I am not a fan of this. I believe that people in the job of serving deserve at least minimum wage as a guarantee. Tips are given to reward a server for good service, so the better job you do, the more likely you are to get a better tip. Many places do share their tips with the entire staff on the shift including the cooks. I understand the concept, but sometimes it happens that one server may give great service and get great tips and other servers just benefit without putting in their fair share of work. I also have know situations in which owners have shared in the tips if they are serving and I have my reservations about that since it is their business, so not altogether fair. I also am not a firm believer of having your bill inflated to add the tips automatically as again does not really give any incentive to the server that does not do a great job. I do believe in paying a server what they are worth and if that is above or below the average, well that is a personal choice. A surly and sloppy server may not deserve a tip, since they did not put any effort into the service at all, so if the patron does feel like tipping anyway, they need to be happy they got something, so the prop-

er response is thank you. I also feel like a tip should not be figured in with the regular wages as the government requires, since they want the taxes from them, so they require the employer to report tips and

match that with taxes as well. I also feel like politicians should

be forced to work at least a month for tips only and let them see what its like to have to live on tips. Maybe then they will look at the situation a bit differently, but knowing them, not only have they never worked at a service job, most have never worked at a real job anyway. They have no concept of what it takes to put food on the table and a roof over your head. Perhaps the no tax on tips concept is well worth considering if it ever comes to fruition.

I guess what I am trying to say here is that doing a great job can earn you a better wage and doing a poor one can lose you money and maybe lose you a job altogether. We can't always count on a monetary bonus, but we can school ourselves to do the best job that we can with what we have. It may be that someone will see our efforts and either reward us with a raise, or maybe we can earn ourselves a better job altogether. Our fate is in our hands, so why not decide on making our best effort rather than just minimal effort and watching the clock until the time is up. Like everything else, we hold the keys to our own future, so make it the best future that you possibly can. God Bless





Joe has been an Active Firefighter since 1977 and member of the Gladstone Consolidated Fire Department. The 2024 Hall of Fame Banquet will be held October 12th.
