Reflections on the Words of Life By Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace

Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have been considering the plot which Daniel's enemies devised to get him out of their way. We saw that by playing on King Darius's pride, they convinced him to sign a decree which for thirty days prohibited all in the empire from praying to anyone except Darius.

An essential part of their scheme depended upon Daniel's continuing what had been his practice all along. They were counting on him to keep praying to his God, and we find in Daniel 6:10 that he did not disappoint: "Now when Daniel knew that the writing was signed, he went home. And in his upper room, with his windows open toward Jerusalem, he knelt down on his knees three times that day, and prayed and gave thanks before his God, as was his custom since early days.'

Some might say that this was misplaced zeal on Daniel's part. He could have just kept

Friends, being able to go before the King of the universe and present our petitions at His throne of grace is an unspeakable privilege. But it is vital to remember that there is



This is not a popular message in our day of inclusivism, nor has it ever been a popular message. But it is vital, and I pray that each of you has come savingly to God through Jesus Christ.


A sewer rat has become a sanitary engineer. I wonder what he would talk about over his luncheon sandwich.


"Our Great Plains-Mourning Doves"

"Good Morning - Mourning Doves", a polite 'n' friendly greeting that I subconsciously say nearly every morning to "Our Great Plains- Mourning Doves" when I hear their ahooh! whoo-whoo cooing. Believe me, I don't confuse the mourning dove's call with an owl's hooting.

'Mourning Doves' are classified as migratory birds and are regulated by the Migratory Bird Treaty Act (MBTA) of 1918 (Canada and Mexico included) which prohibits the take (including killing, capturing, selling, trading, and transport) of protected migratory bird species without prior authorization by the Department of Interior U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. However, the 'Mourning Dove' is the most hunted migratory game bird in North America. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service has studied and regulated 'Mourning Doves' for nearly 50 years now,



It's said that adult 'Mourning Doves' (10 to 13 inches long with spotted wings; muted colors from brown to grayish-brown, to gray; weighing between 4 to 6 pounds) are monogamous for at least the breeding season and possibly for multiple breeding seasons. It also has been documented that they often will return to the same breeding location and even use the same nest in successive years. Male 'Mourning Doves' acquire nest material for the female to construct the nest (usually rather flimsy) after they've paired up for breeding. 'Mourning Doves' often nest along the edges of roadsides, woodlands, rangelands, and croplands. They nest on the ground, and in trees usually after the trees have leafed out completely.

'Mourning Doves' breed prolifically, producing (2) white eggs per brood and raising up to five or six broods per year, more than any other native bird. Egg incubating is done by both parents, for about 14 days. Both the 'Mourning Dove' parents produce "crop milk," an antioxi-





dant-rich liquid secreted in their throats. The milk is also high in fat and protein. The two bird youngsters are fed this milky substance while they are still in the nest. Eventually as adultstheir diet transitions to seeds (99% of their diet) from plants such as field grasses, corn, sorghum, wheat (and other cultivated grains), annual sunflowers, and ragweed. Occasionally they will eat small Faucet Snails (up to about 1/2 inch in length) and also the Mud Snail (up to 1/8 inch in length). Very rarely will adult 'Mourning Doves' eat any insects. A Mourning Dove's brood starts with (2) eggs, then hatchlings, and they grow into two young chicks which leave the nest around 15 days later, usually waiting nearby to be fed for the next 1 to 2 weeks. Their leaving the nest is because another brood is planned to follow almost immediately.

'Choice'

The cooing of "Our Great Plains- Mourning Doves" is one of America's most familiar bird sounds (cooOOoo-woo-o), and they're one of the most common birds around the countryside too. When launching upward and landing, their wings produce a distinct whistling sound; they are noisy flyers. They are also fast flyers - cruising at 55 mph after climbing and leveling off in their migrating flight.

'Mourning Doves' (along with their White Dove Cousins) symbolize - hold a special place in folklore and mythology; it's been said that they encourage emotional healing, forgiveness, and even aid in building friendships (past or New)- all of which: can move "Us" forward into Spiritual Peace, Love, and Faith. Noah released a dove from his ark, and when the bird returned with an olive branch, he knew the land was near.

To the Native Americans, the 'Mourning Dove' represents spirit and communication with the spirit. They believe that when the 'Mourning Dove' appears, there will be opportunities and messages for growth.


