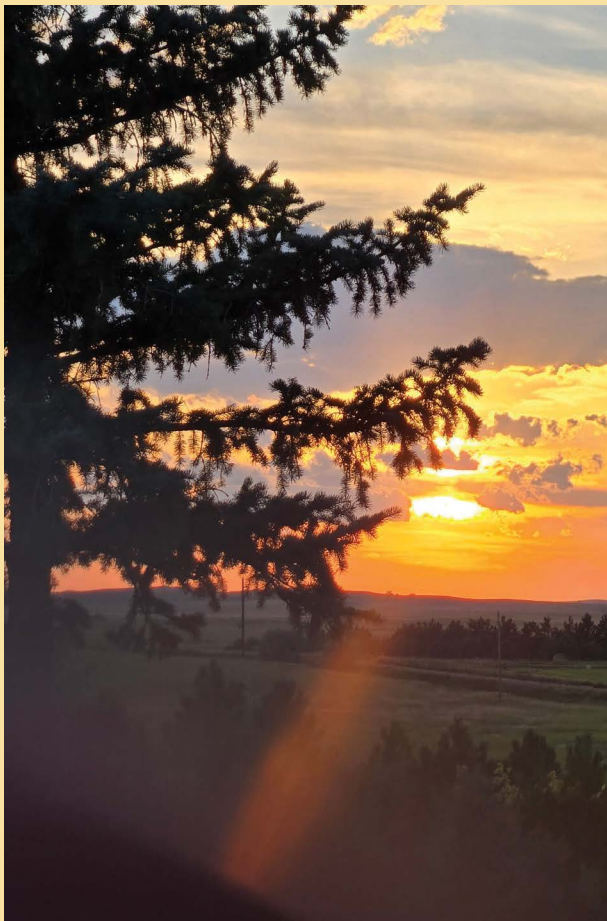

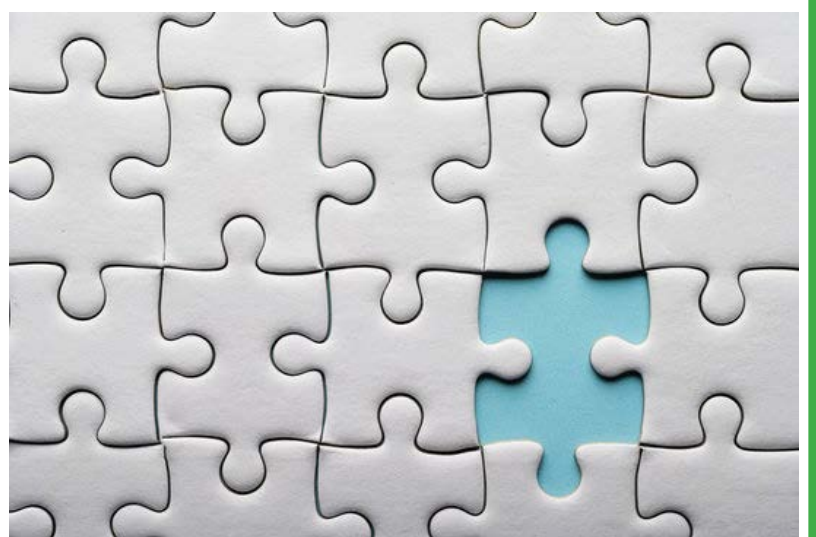
Opening the box - - Grandma sent a puzzle - - but -- - Mom there is no picture - now what - how do we put together a puzzle when we don’t know what it is.

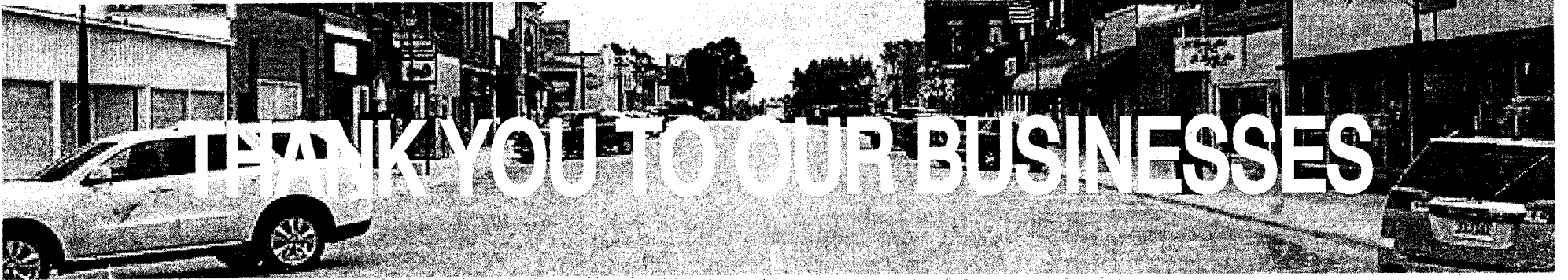

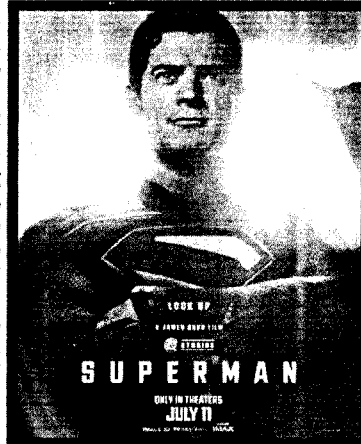

Cloud Seeding Operations Summa- ry For Aug. 11 - Aug. 17, 2025

BISMARCK, N.D. — Last week, parts of southwestern North Dakota were able to begin drying out and warm high temperatures in the 80s and 90s helped crops mature for harvest.

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, two hail suppression seeding flights and one reposition flight were flown last week. Rain enhancement operations remained sus-

pending.


After a wet beginning to this week, an upper-level ridge should build over the region, leading to drier conditions. High temperatures in the 80s and 90s should once again help harvest this week.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Department of Water Resources' web site at <http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb>. The NDCMP will be extended to September 8 due to wet conditions delaying harvest.

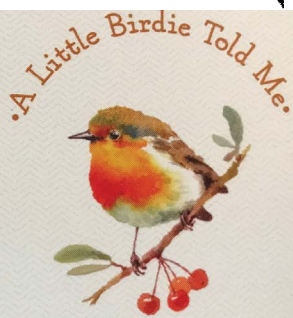

And, I really wish we could get some more boys in there because it's very unsettling.

Which is what I wanted to discuss this week. Winter is coming and, all our friends (with grand-kids) do is complain that there's nothing for them to do! Well, on Mondays and Wednesdays (commencing at 6 PM) and Saturdays (10 AM-Noon) down at the 'ol armory, there certainly is and, it's at no cost to the parents since the city of Mott sponsors the program. Well, if you want to promote through the belt ranks, there's a nominal expense; but, at the end of the day, I'm at a loss to explain why young boys today aren't out there playing football and throwing each other around in our class. And, they learn manners, common courtesy and that if they get in trouble at home, they do push-ups down here. It's what I lived for when I was a kid. I actually started judo when I was 6 and, my dad, "never let me decide". He just told me that I was going so that he could have some peace and quiet. So, if your kids are bored, we've got plenty of room. Bring 'em on down and, have a great week.





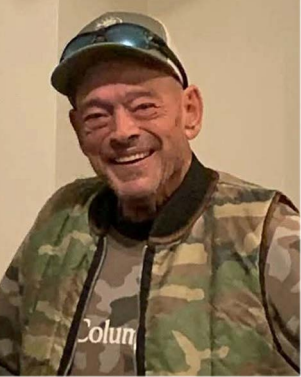

Reflections on the Words of Life

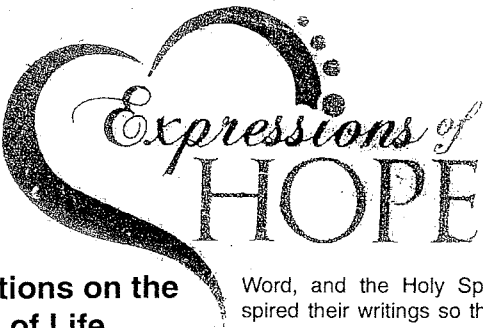
Last time we looked at the teaching of God's Word in 1 Peter regarding the Christian's duty to government. We saw that the believer is to submit to government unless commanded to disobey God's will expressed in His Word. Peter continues to emphasize the importance of how the Christian lives in EVERY AREA of life. And we see the reason for that in 1 Peter 2:15: "For this is the will of God, that by doing good you may put to silence the ignorance of foolish men." It is important to ask what the word THIS refers to. What is the will of God? Peter is referring here to the things he is teaching in this section of his letter, which deals with how the Christian should live in society, in relationship to government, in the family, and in the work place. How can Peter be so bold as to describe this teaching as "the will of God"? The answer is of utmost importance for all who are part of the church of the Lord Jesus Christ. For there is a crisis going on in the church regarding what is authoritative for the believer. When Peter says, "This is the will of God," he is referring to the things that he is writing in Scripture as an apostle of Jesus Christ. He knows that he is writing truth because he has received it from the Holy Spirit, who has protected the process of revealing and recording these words. That is why Peter later says, "Knowing this first, that no prophecy of Scripture is of any private interpretation, for prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit" (2 Peter 1:20-21). The Word of God as found in the Bible is authoritative for God's people. It is infallible revelation. When Peter says, "This is the will of God," we can base our lives on it.

It is essential that Christians be serious students of God's Word. Luke tells us the practice of the early church in Acts 2:42: "And they continued steadfastly in the apostles' doctrine and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in prayers." Those believers gave themselves to learning God's truth. Christ Himself had given His apostles the assignment of spreading His

Word, and the Holy Spirit inspired their writings so that the church would have an infallible guide.

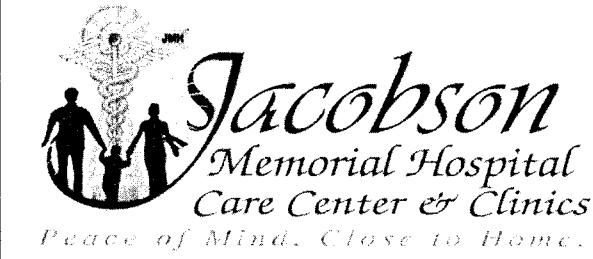
Some falsely claim that there are other sources of authoritative teaching for Christians, such as the traditions and doctrines of church officials. This problem was dealt with during the Reformation, when it was clear that some church teachings flatly contradicted not only other teachings, but contradicted the Bible itself. For this reason, SOLA SCRIPTURA (Scripture Alone) became one of the mottoes of the Reformation. God's people must continue to assert that the Bible alone is the believer's infallible guide. As Peter later stated in 2 Peter 1:3, God's Word is sufficient for "all things pertaining to life and godliness." This is not to deny that God still leads His people by His Holy Spirit. He certainly does. But we are not infallible interpreters of the Holy Spirit's guidance. We can misunderstand and draw wrong conclusions. As believers in Christ, we must submit all our thoughts and ideas to the teaching of His Word.

Only through God's Word do we learn the desperate condition into which all people are born into this world. We are born at odds with our Creator, and if we continue and die in that condition, our future will be eternal hell. Only through God's Word do we learn how we can be delivered from such an unspeakably horrible future. That is by placing our trust in the Lord Jesus Christ alone to restore us to a right relationship with God. On the cross, Jesus took upon Himself the sins of all who would ever believe in Him, and He paid the penalty for each of their sins, to God's satisfac-



tion. By placing our trust in Him alone, we receive forgiveness and restoration and can look forward to spending eternity in the unending joy of heaven. Friends, have you trusted Christ as your Savior? If not, please do not put it off.

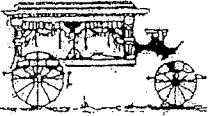

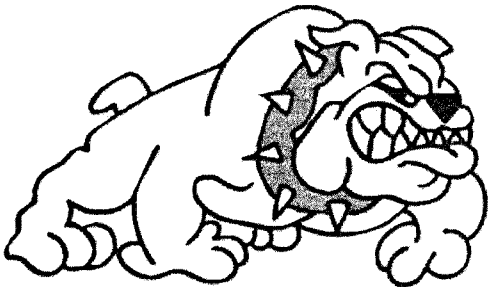

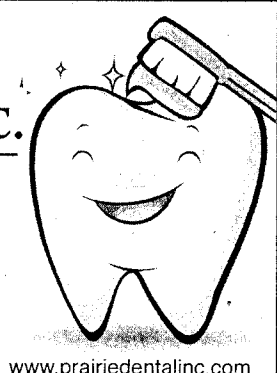
