“That’s not the way I remember it,” thought Jeff. “Wonder why

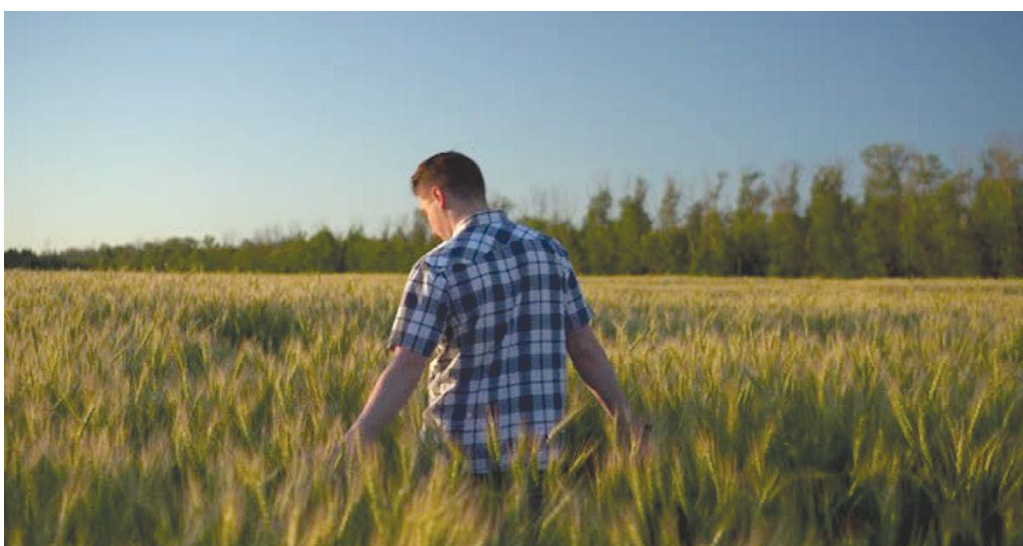
I came in the first place” - - anyway - - Jeff’s mind was running wild. All kinds of thoughts were traveling through his already full mind.

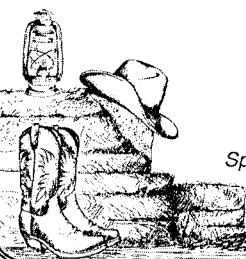

Reflections on the Words of Life

Last week we left Naomi as a childless Israelite widow in the pagan country of Moab. Life could hardly be worse for her, but things are going to change. We resume today in Ruth 1:6: "Then she arose with her daughters-in-law that she might return from the country of Moab, for she had heard in the country of Moab that the LORD had visited His people by giving them bread." As Job put it, "The Lord gives, and the Lord takes away." It was the Lord who had sent a famine to Israel, and it was He who had removed that famine and graciously given food to His people again. Bethlehem, the "house of bread," had been restocked. So Naomi decides to return to Israel. Her only family at this point were two daughters-in-law, Orpah and Ruth, the widows of her deceased sons. Apparently, these two daughters-in-law felt close enough to

Naomi to head for Israel with her. And so we are told in Ruth 1:7, "Therefore she went out from the place where she was, and her two daughters-in-law with her; and they went on the way to return to the land of Judah."

From Naomi's perspective, it was not a good idea for her daughters-in-law to move to Israel. Not only would it mean having two more mouths to feed, but there was a more serious consideration. Orpah and Ruth were Moabites, who were generally despised by the Israelites. They would likely face ostracism and persecution. Furthermore, their presence would be a constant reminder to Naomi that she had abandoned the promised land and let her sons marry non-Israelites—and the results this had brought. There is no question that returning to Israel would mean swallowing what little pride she had left. For those reasons, Naomi tries to talk Orpah and Ruth out of going to Israel with her. Ruth 1:8-9: "Go, return each to her

mother's house. The LORD deal kindly with you, as you have dealt with the dead and with me. The LORD grant that you may find rest, each in the house of her husband.' Then she kissed them, and they lifted up their voices and wept." Notice that with Naomi's instructions, there are also two prayers for the Lord's blessing on her daughters-in-law. Orpah and Ruth had been faithful, kind, and loving wives and had treated Naomi with kindness and love. Now she is asking the LORD to treat them in the same way. The other blessing Naomi requests is for the Lord to grant them rest in remarriage. For only by remarriage would they have husbands to support them and be able to enjoy the love and security of a family.

Next time, Lord willing, we shall see more about what happens in the lives of these three women. But in closing, I'd like

to point out that there is a superior rest than that which can be found in marriage and family—as great as those blessings can be, especially for believers in Christ. But Jesus offers a rest that surpasses any other when He says in Matthew 11:28: "Come to Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." He is offering the rest of forgiveness to those who labor under the heavy burden of sin. Each one of us comes into the world under this burden, for we are all born in a state of sin and enmity against God (Ephesians 2:1-3). But Jesus has provided a solution to this problem. While on the cross, He bore the punishment for all the sins of all His people. We must personally place our trust in Him alone to benefit from what He has done and receive the gifts of forgiveness and eternal life. Friend, have you done that? Have you entered into this greatest rest?

We will no longer be taking on new jobs/service calls, etc aside from the windshields and laminate as we have lots to accomplish before we close.

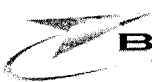

Well, school is back in session and the kids are excited... at least for the next couple of weeks until actual classroom work and grades become a reality. As we move into a new school year, the inevitable "problems" like alleged "bullying" or classroom drama will also begin to unfold within a small number. And, I don't want to belittle or undermine here but, I heard Dr. Phil McGraw say something on his show a few weeks ago that sums it up best, "You're not going to parent through the police." His comments were in response to a divorced couple who had failed at raising a troubled older child which had resulted in calls to the police for them to act as de facto parents. So, I thought it might be helpful to lay out a few "law enforcement" ground rules for the reader. First, a particular child's (or parent's) protestations to the contrary, self-defense is, since last summer, fully recognized by the US Supreme Court, in NY State Rifle & Pistol Assoc. v. Bruen, as an inalienable "individual" right and, an important protection under our federal and state Constitutions. Gone are the days of automatic punishment of anyone for simply defending oneself (or another) regardless as to where that occurs.

Second, the rules on self-defense (or defense of others) are not that complicated—one cannot be the "initial aggressor" and/or use unreasonable force in repelling an imminent attack. The entire incident has to be examined to determine these two issues before punishment is inflicted. Third, a rebellious

child's personal opinion to the contrary, corporal punishment is also NOT, per se, a crime under the Century Code, Chap. 15.1-19, when that force is reasonable, necessary and either quells a disturbance, defends oneself from harm or, preserves order; or, under Section 12.1-05-05[1], when a parent/guardian (or other person responsible for the care and supervision of a minor) uses reasonable force upon the minor for the purpose of safeguarding or promoting the minor's welfare, including prevention and punishment of the minor's misconduct, and the maintenance of proper discipline. Sorry...that's the law and, that's what we enforce in our legal system—the law not popular, personal opinion to the contrary.

Fourth, since the "pandemic", fragile egos and "triggered" individuals have begun to confuse their personal opinions (not truth) with objective fact, particularly, in the wake of "Zero Tolerance" policies which have actually made those venues less safe since their adoption in the 1990's. So, suffice it to say that, in particular, in regards to "custody disputes", if there is no court order to the contrary, law enforcement officers have NO jurisdiction/authority to mediate custody disputes between feuding parents ANYWHERE. It

would be illegal for them to do so and, expose the officer to, at least, civil liability. Neither parent (without first having a court order) can request, or order, any peace officer to choose the appropriate parent for custody at any given time; or, to mediate the matter as a dispute between the parties in lieu of a district court judge. Instead, a paternity/divorce action must first be started so that there is a court order compelling the peace officer to act when two estranged parents disagree over "whose day it is". In the absence of that court order, logic dictates that the estranged parent last enjoying custody is presumed to be the fit person to have custody (leave school with the child) until a court orders otherwise. I hope this has been helpful. Have a great week!

Anthrax in Hettinger County

Wet conditions and high heat have increased the risk of exposure to anthrax spores recently.

With the continued rise of Anthrax cases in Grant County and a few more in Hettinger County, livestock owners are urged to take action to protect their animals from the disease. Preventative actions you can take: consider fly control measures, as biting flies have potential to spread it. Also, contact your veterinarian to discuss control measures and vaccinating the rest of your herd. Vaccine is relatively cheap, approximately \$1/dose, immunity from the vaccine lasts approximately 6 months, so revaccination is required.

Anthrax is a disease in cattle, humans and other species caused by a bacteria known as *Bacillus anthracis*. This bacteria has a special survival mechanism called spore formation. This characteristic allows the bacteria to produce very hardy spores with a high survival rate. The spores can survive for years under the right conditions. When these spores come into contact with susceptible animals, they can "hatch" and infect cattle, resulting in disease and death.

Often the only initial signs of anthrax infection are finding dead cattle. Cattle can die without signs of illness for a number of reasons, including lightning strikes, clostridial infections and toxicities, but anthrax should always be considered, according to Stokka.

"If the diagnosis of anthrax



is suspected, your veterinarian may choose not to perform a necropsy," says Stokka. "Instead, your veterinarian will collect blood and submit for a test to confirm the diagnosis. If confirmed, then vaccination needs to be implemented as quickly as possible."

Because anthrax is a reportable disease, details on the use of the vaccine should be coordinated through the office of the state veterinarian. It is relatively safe and provides effective protection on most species of livestock.

The commercial vaccine available is a live attenuated (non-disease-causing) spore vaccine. The dose is 1 cc administered subcutaneously in the neck region. All adult cattle and calves should be administered the vaccine, and treat-

ment with antibiotics should be withheld because it may interfere with the immune response. However, when faced with an outbreak situation, administering an antibiotic and a vaccine concurrently has been effective. Consult your local veterinarian for a recommendation.

"Consider removing all cattle from the pasture where anthrax deaths are suspected because spores present can infect the remaining animals," Stokka advises.

Also, anthrax carries a risk to humans, so take care to not disturb the carcass. The recommended method of disposal is to burn the carcass and soil on which the carcass was found after placing them in a trench dug in the immediate area of the death.

If you have had animal loss-

es, make sure to first contact your veterinarian and the North Dakota Department - Division of Animal Health to obtain and submit a blood sample. Producers with confirmed cases of Anthrax will be eligible for the Livestock Indemnity Program with FSA. Notice must be filed within 30 days and must have dated pictures before carcasses are buried or burned.

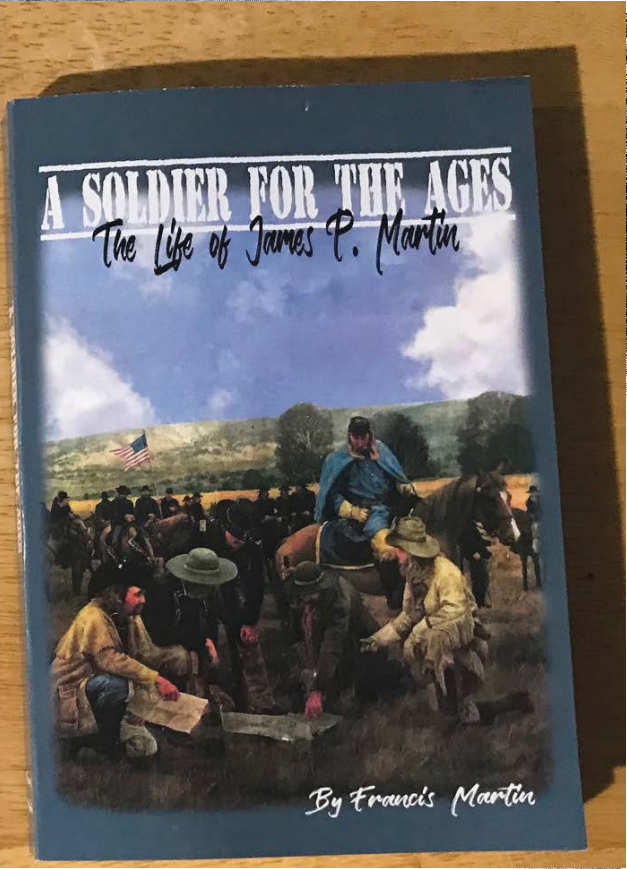



Update on the Mott Health Care Center



The Mott Health Care Board of Directors continues to meet weekly to prepare for the targeted November 1, 2023 opening of the basic care facility. We have been very fortunate that CHI St. Alexius Health has donated 19 bed licenses and West River Health Services has donated an additional 3 bed licenses. This is a nice cost savings for the organization. Board members and volunteers are busy preparing rooms for residents. Paint is being applied to walls and ceilings to freshen up the rooms. The chapel has been relocated to another room in the building. A fully furnished and decorated model resident room is available for viewing by donors and prospective residents. One of the next big items for completion is installation of a new phone system. A capital campaign is about to be launched. The goal is to raise \$600,000 by December 1st. Generous private donations have already been received, and more information on how individuals and businesses may contribute will be available soon.

Meanwhile, plans continue for the relocation of Mott's West River Health Clinic into the north wing of the nursing home building. This project, on a separate timeline, is being funded by a \$1.2 million North Dakota Block Grant through the ND Department of Commerce. Roosevelt Custer Regional Council has been retained as the project administrator. Renovation work is expected to begin this fall.

Rod enlisted into the US Air Force on February 13, 1968 and was honorably discharged on February 11, 1972.

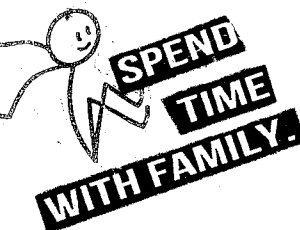
Rod was united in marriage to Millie Weishaar on March 19, 1972. They farmed and ranched together on the Weishaar Ranch south of Elgin

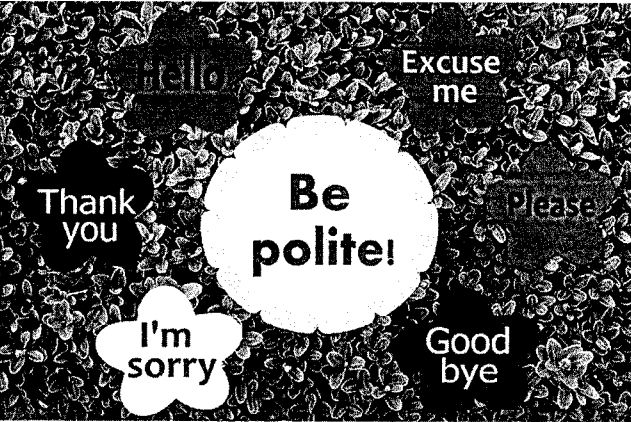

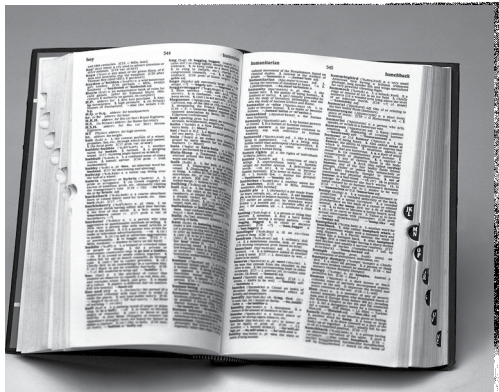

I asked her if this hearing aid would help me even though the noise was in my head, not my ear. She said it depended on what caused the tinnitus. She listed three things that are the usual causes and said that their hearing aid might not help, but I had forty-five days to try it out. If it didn't work, I could return it and get a refund.

She explained that there are three things that are root causes of tinnitus: lead based paint. When I was a child, during the II WW, lead based paint was the only kind of paint you could buy. Houses, school houses, barns, even cars were painted with lead based paint.

That's one. The second one was noise, loud, consistent, decibels over 90. The experts finally figured out that men who worked in road construction went deaf before those who didn't. Companies were required to replace bad mufflers and insulate the cabs against sound.

The third one, and this really blew me away, is antibiotics. The very thing that has saved so many lives, has rendered us deaf because of tinnitus.

Because I was afflicted with all three of these things, I had my doubts that this would help me, but this person was so honest with me...and at that price...I ordered them and low and behold, my hearing has greatly improved. There was an interesting comment in the instruction book; it said I needed to wear the hearing aid even when I didn't need it because I had to learn to hear again. And they were right. And I didn't have to press one through 90 to get the answer I was looking for.

Cloud Seeding Operations Summary for August 14-20

BISMARCK, N.D. — A dominant upper-level ridge in the central U.S. brought mainly warm and dry conditions to southwestern North Dakota last week. Over the weekend, weather disturbances rotated around the edge of the ridge, providing a cool down and rain showers.

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, no operational flights were flown for cloud seeding last week. Rain enhancement operations were suspended last week for the entire district due to the harvest.

This week southwestern

North Dakota should see a wide range of weather conditions. Temperatures warm to the low 90s to start the week under the influence of an upper-level ridge. By mid-week a low-pressure trough in the Pacific Northwest is forecast to move through the ridge and provide a cool down and chances for precipitation. By next weekend, another ridge warms temperatures up and should keep things on the dry side.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at <http://www.dwr.nd.gov/arb>. District 1 has elected to extend cloud seeding operations through September 8 due to a late harvest.

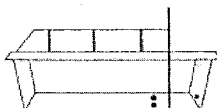

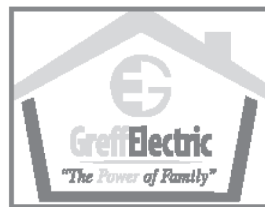

Time is our most valuable asset, yet we tend to waste it, kill it, and spend it rather than invest it.

Improvements Underway at Bowman's Rotary Park

Updates have started at Bowman's Rotary Park due to a combined effort of Brosz Engineering, Inc., School of Promise, and Bowman Parks and Recreation, as well as public and private donors.

"We are grateful for the support from our community and the donors that have made this project possible," said Jon Brosz, Brosz Engineering. "These enhancements are an investment in the quality of life for our residents."

New features will include a state-of-the-art splash pad and brand-new playground equipment specifically designed for children aged 1 to 5, which will complement the already existing equipment for ages 7 – 12. The new playground features three play areas and an oversized canopy that will provide great shade. The splash pad will be a 35'x55' concrete area with 28 water features.

This investment will elevate the recreational experience for residents and visitors in Bowman and the surrounding areas. Outdoor recreation opportunities are considered important to 100% of households in Southwest North Dakota. In the same

survey, 75% of households report demand for outdoor recreation facilities and activities exceeds supply. In addition, 58% of households are interested in specialty areas like splash pads.

In 2020, Brosz Engineering won \$10,000 from the Bowman County Community Challenge for a Splash Path at Rotary Park. In 2021, they were approached by Bowman Parks and Recreation to combine projects with School of Promise who was planning a dry playground for ages 1-5. With a combined effort, both projects were able to expand beyond their initial scope. In 2022, all of the features for both the dry park and splash pad were delivered. Although the project experienced delays due to supply chain issues, workforce shortages, and increasing material prices, the wait will provide a great outdoor recreational area for all ages. In addition to the efforts and financial support received earlier, a North Dakota Park System Grant was received for \$78,500 in early August 2023 for the final fundraising. Completion of the project is expected by the end of 2023 and ready for play in 2024.



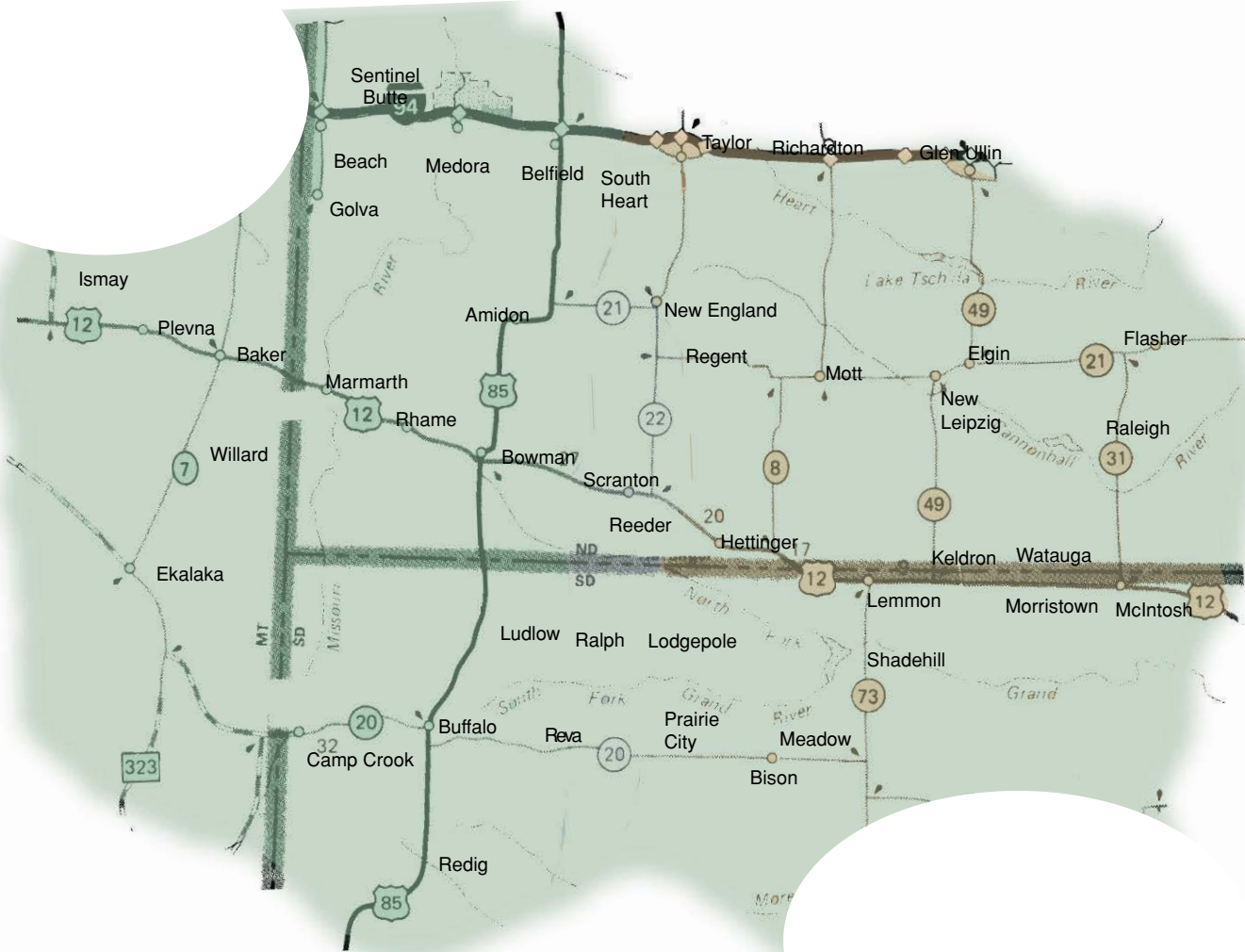

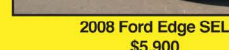
